# Safety and Use

Thank you for purchasing this product. We recommend that you read this chapter carefully before using your phone. The manufacturer disclaims any liability for damage, which may result as a consequence of improper use or use contrary to the instructions contained herein.

### •TRAFFIC SAFETY:

Given studies, which show that using a mobile phone while driving a vehicle constitutes a real risk, even when the hands-free kit is used (car kit, headset...), drivers are requested to refrain from using their mobile when the vehicle is not parked.

When switched on, your phone emits electromagnetic waves that can

interfere with the vehicle's electronic systems such as ABS anti-lock brakes or airbags. To ensure that there is no problem:

- do not place your phone on top of the dashboard or within an airbag deployment area,
- check with your car dealer or the car manufacturer to make sure that the dashboard is adequately shielded from mobile phone RF energy.

### • CONDITIONS OF USE:

Switch the phone off before boarding an aircraft to avoid prosecution. Switch the phone off when you are in health care facilities, except in designated areas. As with many other types of equipment now in regular use, mobile telephones can interfere with other electrical or electronic devices, or equipment using radio frequency.

Switch the phone off when you are near gas or flammable liquids. transmitting at their maximum power level over the entire range of frequency bands.

Although the SAR was established at the highest certified level, the actual SAR level for the mobile phone during use is generally much lower than the maximum values. In fact, since mobile phones are designed to operate at many different power levels, they only use the minimum level of power required to provide a connection to the network. In theory, the closer you are to a base station antenna, the lower the power level required by the mobile phone.

The highest tested SAR value for this mobile phone for use at the ear and compliance against the standard is 1.11 W/kg. While there may be differences between the SAR levels on various phones and at various positions, they all meet the relevant International guidelines and EU requirements for RF (radio-waves) exposure.

The World Health Organization (WHO) considers that present scientific information does not indicate the need for any special precautions for use of mobile phones. If individuals are concerned, they might choose to limit their own or their children's RF exposure by limiting the length of calls, or using "hands-free" devices to keep mobile phones away from the head and body (fact sheet  $n^{\circ}$





# 2. Getting Started


# **2.1 Set-up**

Inserting the UIM card (If any, since some operators are using NON-UIM version)



Fit the UIM card with the chip facing downloads. Slide the UIM card into its compartment. Push the UIM card with your finger to release it.

Removing and installing the back cover



Inserting and removing the battery



Align the tab on top of the battery with the slot in the battery compartment of your phone. Press down the battery until the latch is securely in place.



Long press the key to power off the phone. Pls wait for 10 seconds before you take out the battery to avoid any damage to the phone memory.

# 2.2 Charging the battery

The switching charger includes a plug type according the local norm





Please firstly insert the cable (included in the package) into the charger and after insert the cable, the charger can be plugged to the phone with a jack. (Please only use Alcatel chargers)



The phone supports PC charging: connect the phone and computer USB port with the mini USB cable (included in the package), the battery can be charged with the power provided by the computer





#### Note:

- (1) Before connecting to the charger, make sure the battery is inserted correctly;
- (2) Do not force the plug into the socket
- (3) To achieve the best performace of the battery we suggest you charge the battery for 12 to 14 hours for the first 3 times.
- (4) The battery will be auto discharged if not being used for long time. Please charge the battery before use.
- (5) Don't use the battery or charger with any damage.
- (6) The battery performace will be very poor after being charged and discharged for hundreds of times. Pls change the battery once the working time is obviously shorter.

# 2.3 Headset



One headset is included in the package. Before using the headset

please disconnect the charger first since they share the same jack.

Once the headset is inserted  $\bigcap$  will appear on the idle screen. The headset can be used to listen to the music, adjust volume for FM Radio answer and end the phone call by long pressing the button in the headset. During the conversation please speak to the mic in the headset so that the receiver can hear you clearly.

# 2.4 Micro SD card

Micro SD card is an external memory card. You can store the multimedia files here.





Note:

- (1) The card is easily broken. Don't bend or scratch it. Protect it from water, dust or static.
- (2) There are lots of cards with different brands in the market. To avoid compatbility problem we suggest you use Mico SD card with good brand.
- (3) The phone supports the Micro SD card up to 1GB.

# 3. Basic Function

# 3.1 Power On/Off

Long press the key to power on and off. If phone password or PIN code is activated you have to input the right password before you can use the phone. Please go to [Menu / Setting/ Security] to set [PIN] code and [Phone password].

If the keypad is locked, long press key to unlock and ther long press key to power off.

# 3.2 Making Calls

## 3.2.1 By enter phone No. directly

In idle screen, enter the phone number (please enter city code first if it is a long distance fix line) and press key to make calls.

# 3.2.2 By fast index

In idle screen, enter "Number + #" to lead to a record in the [Contact]

(The Number is the record index in the [Contact]) and then press key to make calls.

## 3.2.3 By call records

In idle screen, press key to access Call Records.

Use and to pick up the number and then press key to make call.

## 3.2.4 By speeddial

In idle screen, long press key 1 to 9 to call speeddial numbers. If no speeddial is set yet, the phone will remind you "No speeddial, set now?", press left softkey to access [Contact] to choose number for speeddial. Please refer to [Contact/Speeddial] for the settings.

- Note:
- (1) If the contact has several numbers, the default number is the first one.
- ( 2 ) Please contact your operator to activate the funciton for conference call before use it.

# 3.3 Answering Calls

For incoming calls, if the name and number have been saved, the name and number will be displayed, otherwise only number will be displayed. Press to answer the incoming call. You can also set other keys to answer the incoming calls, please refer to [Menu/ Setting/ Phone /Answer Mode].

Note:

The incoming line identification function has to be activated by your operator to display the incoming call number.

# 3.4 Setting during Conversation

During conversation, press left softkey [Menu] for the following

functions: [Silent/Unmute], [Contact] and [Message].

Silent/Unmute: the receivers can't hear caller's voice.

**Contact:** to access contact function **Message:** to access message function.

# 3.5 USB modem

After installing the driver you can use the phone as a modem to connect internet. Please refer to the USB Modem User Guide in the CD Rom for the detailed operation

# 4. Contact

The [Contact] allows you to store phone numbers and names either in the UIM memory and/or the phone memory. You may store up to 300 entries in the phone memory. You can access your [Contact] in idle screen by pressing right softkey,

or press "9" in main menu

# 4.1 Contact menu

View: Access the list of contacts (alphabetic order).

Search: to search for a contact (alphabetic order)

**Add:** to enter number and name of a new contact. (If you add a contact to [Phone], you can edit name, 3 numbers, Email , Address,

URL, Remark, Incoming call ringtone and Group)

**Group:** group together names by category: [Family], [Business], [Friends], [VIP], [Schoolmates], [Phone Records] and [UIM Records].

**Speed Dial:** to set speed dial numbers for number key 1 to 9

Copy All: to copy all the records in phone to UIM card or all the record in UIM card to phone

Delete All: to delete all the records in phone or in UIM card

 $\boldsymbol{My}$   $\boldsymbol{Number:}$  to enter your own phone numbers for future reference.

**Memory Status:** to check the number of contacts and the memory space left.

# 4.2 Consulting your contact ("View")

From the idle screen, select [Contact] then [View] to access the list of your contacts. The names are sorted in alphabetical order.

## 4.2.1 Available options in the contacts list

Once you have selected a name, press the left softkey to access the following options:

**View:** to display the name, phone number and location (UIM card or Phone)

Call: to call the number you have selected

**Send Message:** to create a message to send to the selected contact.

**Edit:** to edit the data of the selected contact.

**Delete:** to delete the selected contact.

Copy to Phone/ UIM: Copy the file to the phone or UIM contact.

## 4.2.2 Making the call

Press the key when the name is selected to make a call or select [Call] in the options menu.

## **4.2.3** Group

You can group together names by category ([Family], [Business], [Friends], [VIP], [Schoolmates], [Phone Records] and [UIM Records]) and select a special ringtone. For each group, you can select the following options:

View: to check the contacts in the group

Modify Group name: to change the name of the group.

**Group Ring:** to set a special ringtone for that group.

## 4.2.4 Searching for a name by its first letter

You can search for the person's name by pressing the key associated

with the first letter of his/her name. For instance, if you press twice on "1" key in Eng Mode, names starting with "B" will be displayed.

# 5. Message

From your phone, you can read, write, send and receive SMS message and share them with other phones.

To access the message from the idle screen, press the top of the



key or press the left softkey and select [Message].

# 5.1 New Message

In the [Message] menu, select [New Message] and enter your message.

Press the left softkey to access the following list:

Send: send the current message. When no number is edited for destination, you can either enter the number directly or go to [Contact] by pressing left softkey to pick up one number. Once a number is entered, press left softkey to [Send Only], [Send & Save], [Save Only] and [Contact]. [Send Only] to send the current SMS, [Send & Save] to send the current SMS and save it to [Outbox], [Save Only] to save the

current SMS to [Drafts] and [Contact] to choose destinations (up to 9 receivers).

Save: to save the current SMS to [Drafts]

**Text Template:** to choose one text template to insert into current SMS.

 $\label{eq:Smiley: Smiley: to choose one smiley to insert into current SMS.}$ 

Domain: to choose one net symbol to insert into current SMS

**Contact:** to choose one contact name from [Contact] to insert into current SMS.

# 5.2 Inbox

In the [Inbox], read and unread messages are shown with different icons. Press the left softkey to access the following list:

**View:** to check the detailed information about current SMS and then, by pressing left softkey, the following functions are available:[Reply], [Delete], [Forward], [Extract number], and [Call].

**Reply:** to reply SMS to the sender **Delete:** to delete the current SMS

Delete all: to delete all the SMS in [Inbox]

Forward: to edit and send the current SMS to someone else

Call: to call the sender

# 5.3 Outbox

The [Outbox] includes sent and unsent messages. Press the left softkey to access the following list:

 $\boldsymbol{View:} \hspace{0.1in}$  to check the detailed information about current SMS and then,

by pressing left softkey, to delete or forward it

Forward: to edit and send the current SMS to someone else

**Delete:** to delete the current SMS

 $\textbf{Delete all:} \ \ \text{to delete all the SMS in [Outbox]}$ 

## **5.4 Drafts**

The [Drafts] includes all the unfinished messages. Press the left softkey to access the following list:

Edit: to edit the current SMS

Send: to send the current SMS

Delete: to delete the current SMS

Delete all: to delete all the SMS in [Drafts]

# **5.5 Text Template**

Lists of predefined messages are available. Select one, edit it if required, and then send it.

# **5.6 Smiley**

Lists of predefined smiley are available. Select one, edit it if required, and then send it.

# **5.7 Setting**

You can change the message setting here:

**Save Option:** to choose save position [Phone] or [Card]. If you choose [Phone] the received SMS will only be saved to UIM card after the phone memory is full.

**Delivery Report:** to [Activate] or [Deactivate] this function. Once activated you'll receive the confirmation [Sent or Unsent] from the network after you send the SMS.

Validity period: you can choose 12 hours, 1 day, 3 days or Max

Priority: to choose [Normal], [Interactive], [Urgent] or [Emergency]

# **5.8 Memory Status**

To check the memory status in phone and UIM card.

# 6. Call Record

From the idle screen, press the key and your phone displays a call list.



# 16. Troubleshooting
