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### safety and usage information

Comply with the following precautions to avoid dangerous or illegal situations and ensure peak performance of your device.



### Keep your device away from small children and pets

Keep your device and all accessories out of the reach of small children or animals. Small parts may cause choking or serious injury if swallowed.

#### Protect your hearing



Listening to a headset at high volumes can damage your hearing. Use only the minimum volume setting necessary to hear your conversation or music.

### Install mobile devices and equipment with caution

Ensure that any mobile devices or related equipment installed in your vehicle are securely mounted. Avoid placing your device and accessories near or in an air bag deployment area. Improperly installed wireless equipment can cause serious injury when air bags inflate rapidly.

### Handle and dispose of batteries and chargers with care

### Assemble and prepare your device

Get started by assembling and setting up your mobile device for its first use.

### Install the SIM or USIM card and battery

When you subscribe to a cellular service, you will receive a Subscriber Identity Module (SIM) card, with subscription details, such as your personal identification number (PIN) and optional services.

To use UMTS or HSDPA services, you can purchase a Universal Subscriber Identity Module (USIM) card. To install the SIM or USIM card and battery,

4. Replace the battery cover.



#### Charge the battery

Before using the device for the first time, you must charge the battery.

- 1. Open the cover to the multifunction jack on the side of the device.
- 2. Plug the small end of the travel adapter into the multifunction jack.





Improperly connecting the travel adapter can cause serious damage to the device. Any damages by misuse are not covered by the warranty.

- 3. Plug the large end of the travel adapter into a power outlet.
- 4. When the battery is fully charged (the time icon is no longer moving), unplug the travel adapter from the power outlet.
- 5. Unplug the travel adapter from the device.
- 6. Close the cover to the multifunction jack.



#### About the low battery indicator

When your battery is low, the device will emit a warning tone and a low battery message. The battery icon will also be empty and blinking. If the battery level becomes too low, the device will automatically power off. Recharge your battery to continue using your device.

#### Insert a memory card (optional)

To store additional multimedia files, you must insert a memory card. Your device accepts microSD™ or microSDHC™ memory cards up to 16 GB (depending on memory card manufacturer and type).



Formatting the memory card on a PC may cause incompatibility with your phone. Format the memory card only on the phone.

- Open the battery cover and remove the battery.
- Insert a memory card with the label side facing up.



3. Push the memory card in the memory card slot until it locks in place.

4. Replace the battery and battery cover. To remove the memory card, remove the battery cover and battery and pull the memory card out of the memory card slot.

#### Turn on your device on and off

Your device will automatically connect to the cellular network.

To turn your device off, press and hold  $[\Theta]$ .

#### Lock or unlock the keys

While viewing photos, you can perform the following functions:

- To scroll through your photos, scroll left or right.
- To zoom, press the Confirm key and then press the left softkey or right softkey. To exit the zoom screen, press [ ].
- To edit a photo, press <Menu> → Edit Image.

- To set a photo as a background or caller ID image, press <Menu> → Set as → an option.
- To view your photos as a slideshow, press
   <Menu> → Play Slide Show.

#### Play a video

- On the Home screen, press <Start> → <More> → Contents Manager → My Videos.
- 2. Scroll to a video thumbnail and press the Confirm key to open it.

#### Open documents

- On the Home screen, press <Start> →

### Send a file

- On the Home screen, press <Start> →
   <More> → Contents Manager.
- 2. Locate and open the folder where the file is stored.
- 3. Select a file.
- Press <Menu> → Send → a sending option.
  - To send as a multimedia message, select via Multimedia Msg. See "Send a multimedia message." ▶ p. 30
  - To send as an email message, select via e-mail. See "Send an email message."
    - ▶ p. 31
  - To send via the Bluetooth wireless feature, select via Bluetooth. See "Send data via the Bluetooth wireless feature." ▶ p. 56

# FM Radio

You can listen to your favourite stations with the FM radio.

#### Listen to the FM radio

- 1. Plug a headset into the multifunction jack.

The radio scans and saves available stations automatically.

4. Press < Done>.

You can access the radio station list by pressing <Menu $> \rightarrow$  Channel list from the radio screen.

#### Set up your favourite list

- 1. From the radio screen, press the Confirm key to start the FM radio.
- 2. Scroll left or right to tune a radio station you want.
- Press <Set as favourite> to save the radio station to the Favourite list.

- 4. Press <**OK**> to confirm.
- 5. To add more radio stations, repeat steps 2-4 above.

#### Streaming Player

You can play streaming files on the web.

You can select a URL address on the recent history list.

You can use Voice Notes to record and play back voice memos and sound clips.

The voice clip is automatically saved.

#### Play a voice clip

Playback begins automatically.

Learn to use Contacts, Calendar, Office Mobile, Adobe Reader LE, Team manager, and Tasks.

# Contacts

Learn to use contact cards to store personal information, such as names, phone numbers, and addresses.

### Copy contact cards

You can copy your contact cards from your device to your SIM card and vice versa. When you copy an Outlook contact to your SIM card, you can only store the contact's name and phone number.

- On the Home screen, press <Start> → Contacts.
- To copy a contact card, scroll to a contacts and press <Menu> → Copy Contact → To SIM or To Contacts.

To retain all contact information, synchronise your Outlook contacts with a PC (see "Synchronise your data" ightarrow p. 59).

# Assign a speed dial number to a contact card

- On the Home screen, press <Start> → Contacts.
- 2. Scroll to a contact card and press the Confirm key.
- 3. Scroll to a phone number and press <Menu> → Add to Speed Dial.
- Scroll left or right to set a speed dial number in the keypad assignment field (if necessary).
- 5. When you are finished, press < Done>.

# Assign an image or a ringtone to a contact card

- On the Home screen, press <Start> → Contacts.
- 2. Scroll to a contact card.
- 3. Press <Menu $> \rightarrow$  Edit.

- 4. To assign a ringtone, scroll to **Custom ring** tone and scroll left or right to a ringtone.
- To assign an image, select Picture → an image.

#### Change the calendar view

#### Stop an event alarm

When the alarm sounds for a calendar event you set previously, press <**Dismiss**>.

# Office Mobile

With Office Mobile, you can open and edit Word, Excel, and PowerPoint files on your device. Your device supports files created with Office 97 and newer versions.

#### Open and edit an Excel workbook

To open and view an Excel workbook,

- On the Home screen, press <Start> →
   Applications → <More> → Office Mobile
   → Excel Mobile.
- 2. Locate an Excel file and select the file name to open it.
- To zoom in or out on part of the document, press any softkey → <View> → Zoom → a zoom option.
- 4. To close the workbook, press any softkey  $\rightarrow$  <**Menu**>  $\rightarrow$  **Close File**.

To edit an Excel workbook,

- On the Home screen, press <Start> →
   Applications → <More> → Office Mobile
   → Excel Mobile.
- 2. Locate an Excel file and select the file name to open it.
- 3. Press any softkey  $\rightarrow \langle Menu \rangle \rightarrow Edit$ .

- 4. Scroll to a cell and press the Confirm key to select it.
- 5. Enter values or text and press < Done>.
- 6. Repeat steps 4-5 as necessary.
- 7. To save the workbook, press <Menu>  $\rightarrow$  File  $\rightarrow$  Save As...
- 8. Enter a file name, select a memory location, and press <**Save**>.

#### Open and edit a Word document

To open and view a Word document,

- On the Home screen, press <Start> →
   Applications → <More> → Office Mobile
   → Word Mobile.
- 2. Locate a Word file and select the file name to open it.
- 3. To zoom in or out on part of the document, press <**View**>  $\rightarrow$  a zoom option.
- 4. To close the document, press <Menu $> \rightarrow$  Close File.

To edit a Word document,

- On the Home screen, press <Start> →
   Applications → <More> → Office Mobile
   → Word Mobile.
- 2. Locate a Word file and select the file name to open it.
- 3. Press <Menu> → Edit.
- 4. Edit your document.
- 5. To change the format, press <Menu $> \rightarrow$  Format  $\rightarrow$  a type.
- 6. To save the document, press <Menu>  $\rightarrow$  File  $\rightarrow$  Save As...
- 7. Enter a file name, select a memory location, and press <**Save**>.

# Open and view a PowerPoint slideshow

- On the Home screen, press <Start> →
   Applications → <More> → Office Mobile
   → PowerPoint Mobile.
- 2. Locate a PowerPoint file and select the file name to open it.
- 3. Press the Navigation key to move between slides.
- 4. To end the slideshow, press any softkey  $\rightarrow$  <**End**>.

#### Create and edit a note

- On the Home screen, press <Start> →
   Applications → <More> → Office Mobile
   → OneNote Mobile.
- 2. Press <New> to create a new note.
- 3. Create your note.

- To change the format, press <Menu> → Format → a type. To clear all formatting, press <Menu> → Format → Clear All.
- To add pictures or voice memos, press <Menu> → Take Picture, Insert Picture, or Insert Recording.
- 6. To save the note, press < Done>.

# Adobe<sup>®</sup> Reader LE

With Adobe Reader LE, you can open and view PDF documents.

- On the Home screen, press <Start> → Applications → Adobe Reader LE.
- 2. Press <Open>.
- 3. Locate a PDF file and select the file name to open it.
- To zoom in or out on part of a document, press <Tools> → Zoom → a zoom option.

# Team manager

With Team Manager, you can make a team with members and send a message to them at the same time.

#### Make a new team

- On the Home screen, press <Start> →
   <More> → Team Manager.
- 2. Press <New>.
- 3. Enter team details.
- 4. When you are finished, press < Done>.

#### Add members to a team

- On the Home screen, press <Start> →
   <More> → Team Manager → a team.
- 2. Press <Add>.
- 3. Select contacts and press < Done>.

#### Send a message to members

- On the Home screen, press <Start> →
   <More> → Team Manager.
- 2. Scroll to a team.
- Press <Menu> → Send → a message type.
- Select a number for a contact (if necessary).
- 5. Enter the message text.
- 6. Press <**Send**> to send the message.

#### Send an appointment

- On the Home screen, press <Start> →
   <More> → Team Manager.
- 2. Scroll to a team.
- 3. Press <Menu> → Set appointment.
- 4. Enter appointment details.
- 5. When you are finished, press < Done>.
- 6. Scroll down and enter the message text.
- 7. Press <Send> to send the message.

# Tasks

With Tasks, you can create to-do lists and reminders.

#### Create a task

- On the Home screen, press <Start> → Organizer → Tasks.
- 2. Press <Menu> → New Task.
- 3. Enter details for the task.



- To set a reminder for the task, select the due date field and set a due date. Select the check box under **Reminder** and specify the date and time of the reminder.
- 4. When you are finished, press < Done>.

#### Mark a task as completed

When you have completed a task, return to the Tasks screen and scroll to the task name, and press <**Complete**>. Once you have marked a task completed, you will no longer receive any scheduled reminders for that task.

Learn to use Internet Explorer, Windows Live, Messenger, and RSS Reader.

# Internet Explorer

Use Internet Explorer to browse web pages and bookmark your favourite web pages.

#### Browse a web page

- On the Home screen, press <Start> → Internet Explorer.
- 2. Access a web page:
  - Press <Menu> → Favorites and select a bookmark.
  - Press <Menu> → Address Bar to enter a web address and press <Go>.
  - Press <Menu> → History to select a web address from the history list.
    - $\mathbb{Z}$
- To close Internet Explorer, press and hold [27], scroll to Internet Explorer and press <End Task>.
- To disconnect celluar data connection, on the Quick List screen, select Wireless Manager → <Menu> → Disconnect Cellular Data.

#### Add a bookmark

- On the Home screen, press <Start> → Internet Explorer.
- 2. Access a web page you want and press  $\langle$ Menu $\rangle \rightarrow$  Add to Favorites.
- Enter the bookmark name and address (if necessary).
- 4. Press <Add>.

#### Change browser settings

From the browser, press <Menu $> \rightarrow$  Tools  $\rightarrow$  Options:

- General: set sound and display settings for the browser
- Home Page: set a web address for the homepage

- Connections: configure connection settings
- Memory: view information about the memory currently in use for temporary files, cookies, and history

# Windows Live

With Windows Live, you can stay in touch with friends and access information on the wireless web quickly.

- 1. On the Home screen, press <Start>  $\rightarrow$  <More>  $\rightarrow$  <More>  $\rightarrow$  Windows Live.
- Scroll to Sign in to Windows Live and press the Confirm key.
- 3. Follow the on-screen instructions.

### Messenger

With Windows Live Messenger, you can remain available to other users and stay up-to-date with your email. When a new message arrives or you want to access internet services, the connection will be restored.

#### Set up Messenger and sign in

- On the Home screen, press <Start> → <More> → Messenger.
- 2. Scroll left or right to select your login status.
- 3. Press <Sign in>.

#### Chat with Messenger

- 1. From the messenger screen, locate and select a contact's name, and then press <**Send IM**>.
- Enter a message in the text field at the bottom of the screen, and press <Send>.

- 3. While chatting, you can perform the following actions:
  - Insert emoticons: press <Menu> → Add emoticon
  - Invite a contact to chat: press <Menu>
     → Options → Add participant
  - Transfer a file: press <Menu> → Send → a file type → a file
  - Record and send a voice clip: press <Voice clip>, record your voice clip, and then press <Send>
  - Switch between the contact list and chat: scroll left or right
- To end the chat, press <Menu> → End conversation.

# **RSS** Reader

Learn to use RSS reader to get the latest news and information from your favourite websites.

#### Create feeds

- On the Home screen, press <Start> → Applications → RSS Reader.
- 2. Press <Menu $> \rightarrow$  Edit  $\rightarrow$  New feed.
- Enter the address of a RSS feed, select a folder to which you want to add the RSS feed, and press <OK>.

### Import feeds

You can add feeds by importing OPML files.

- On the Home screen, press <Start> → Applications → RSS Reader.
- Press <Menu> → OPML → Import → Select OPML file or Enter OPML URL.
- Locate an OPML file or enter the address of an OPML URL and press <OK>.

### Read RSS feeds

- 1. On the Home screen, press  $\langle Start \rangle \rightarrow$ Applications  $\rightarrow$  RSS Reader.
- 2. Scroll to a feed and press < Update> to get the latest contents.
- 3. When the update is finished, press <br/> **Done**>.
- Press the Confirm key to select the updated feed.
- 5. Select a post to read.

#### Find new feeds

- On the Home screen, <Start> → Applications → RSS Reader.
- 2. Press < Menu $> \rightarrow$  Feed search.
- Enter a keyword and press <Search>. Your device searches for related feeds on the internet and displays the results.
- Scroll to the feed and press <Add> to add it to the RSS feed list.



# connectivity

Learn to connect to a wireless LAN, transfer data to and from your device via the Bluetooth wireless feature or the PC data cable, and synchronise your device with a PC via ActiveSync. You can also set up data or network connections for connecting to the internet or your private network.

# Wi-Fi

You can activate and connect to a wireless LAN (WLAN). When you are in range of a WLAN network, your device can detect and connect to an active WLAN to make calls or send data over the internet, or browse the web.

### Activate and connect to a WLAN

- In range of WLAN network, access an application or menu that needs a wireless connection.
- On the Home screen, press <Start> →
   <More> → Settings → Connections →
   More... → Wi-Fi.
- Press <Menu> → Turn On Wi-Fi. The device will display available WLAN connections.
- Select a network profile from the list. The device will attempt to connect to the WLAN.

- 5. Select a network type and press <Next>.
- 6. Enter a pre-shared key for WLAN and press <Next> or <Finish>.
- Set the IEEE 802.1x access option and the extensible authentication protocol (EAP) type and press <Finish> (if necessary).

#### Create a new WLAN

- On the Home screen, press <Start> →
   <More> → Settings → Connections →
   More... → Wi-Fi.
- 2. Select New...
- Enter a network name, configure connection settings, and press <Next>.
- Enter network authentication settings and press <Next>.
- Set the IEEE 802.1x access option and the extensible authentication protocol (EAP) type (if necessary).
- 6. When you are finished, press <Finish>.

# Bluetooth

You can connect with other Bluetooth-enabled wireless devices over a distance of 10 metres (30 feet). Walls or other obstacles between devices may block or impair the wireless connection.

# Turn on the Bluetooth wireless feature

- On the Home screen, press <Start> →
   <More> → Settings → Connections →
   Bluetooth → Bluetooth.
- 2. Press <Menu $> \rightarrow$  Turn On Bluetooth.
- To allow other devices to find and connect to your device, press <Menu> → Turn On Visibility.

# Search for and pair with a Bluetooth-enabled device

- On the Home screen, press <Start> →
   <More> → Settings → Connections →
   Bluetooth → Bluetooth.
- 2. Select Add new device...

Your device will search for and display the list of Bluetooth-enabled devices.

- 3. Scroll to a device and press <Next>.
- 4. Enter the Bluetooth PIN and press <Next>.



To pair with another Bluetooth enabled device, both devices must use the same PIN. Headsets or hands-free car kit may use a fixed PIN, such as **0000**.

5. Press < Done>.

# Send data via the Bluetooth wireless feature

- 1. Locate an item or file to send.
- Press <Menu> → Send → via Bluetooth or press <Menu> → Send Contact → Beam.
- 3. Select a device from the list.

# Receive data via the Bluetooth wireless feature

To set your device to receive data from other devices,

- On the Home screen, press <Start> →
   <More> → Settings → Connections →
   Beam.
- 2. Select the check box next to **Receive** incoming beams.
- 3. Press < Done>.

After receiving data from other device, press <**Yes**> to save the data on your device.

#### Set up a Bluetooth COM port

When you connect to a Bluetooth device supporting the Serial profile, you can establish a Bluetooth COM port.

- On the Home screen, press <Start> →
   <More> → Settings → Connections →
   Bluetooth → Bluetooth.
- Press <Menu> → COM Ports → <Menu> → New Outgoing Port.
- 3. Select the name of a device.
- 4. Select a COM port.
- Select the check box next to Secure Connection to create a secure connection between the devices.
- 6. Press < Done>.

# USB

You can connect with other devices as a network de or external memory device by using USB interface.

# Set a default action for your USB connection

To set your device to perform a default action when you connect the device to a PC with the PC data cable,

- On the Home screen, press <Start> →
   <More> → Settings → Connections →
   USB.
- 2. Set the default USB mode (ActiveSync or Mass Storage).
- 3. Press < Done>.

To use ActiveSync, see "ActiveSync."

#### Copy files to a memory card

1. Insert a memory card into the device.

- 2. Change the USB connection to Mass Storage.
- 3. Connect your device to a PC with the PC data cable.
- 4. Open a folder to view files.
- 5. Copy files to the memory card and vice versa.
- 6. When you are finished, disconnect the device from the PC.

# ActiveSync

With ActiveSync, you can synchronise your device with a PC and back up and restore your data.

#### Install ActiveSync on your PC

Before you can synchronise your data, you must install ActiveSync, either from the supplied CD-ROM or the Microsoft website (http:// www.microsoft.com). To install ActiveSync from the supplied CD-ROM,

- 1. Insert the CD-ROM into your PC.
- 2. Follow the on-screen instructions to complete the setup.
- When installation is complete, follow the on-screen instructions in the Synchronisation Setup Wizard to connect your device to the PC and create a data sharing partnership.

#### Synchronise your data

- On the Home screen, press <Start> →
   <More> → Settings → Connections →
   USB.
- 2. Change the USB connection to ActiveSync.
- Connect one end of the PC data cable to the multifunction jack on your device and the other end to the USB port on your PC.

When you connect your device to a PC, ActiveSync should begin synchronising your data automatically. You can begin the synchronisation manually by clicking **Sync**. To stop a synchronisation in progress, click **Stop**.

You can also manually find and copy files from your device to a PC and vice versa—from the Microsoft ActiveSync window, click **Explore**.

For more details on synchronising your data, refer to the ActiveSync Help.

#### Configure an Exchange server

- On the Home screen, press <Start> → ActiveSync.
- Press <Menu> → Add Server Source. If you have set up the synchronisation with an Exchange server, this will say Configure Source.
- 3. Enter your email address and press <**Next**>.

- 4. Enter a user name, password, and domain address.
- 5. Press <Next>.
- 6. Enter a server address.
- To establish a secure connection, select the check box next to This server requires an encrypted (SSL) connection.
- 8. Press <Next>.
- 9. Select the types of data to synchronise.
- 10. When you are finished, press <Finish>.

# Change the synchronisation schedule

If you routinely synchronise your data via an Exchange server, you can configure settings for both peak and off-peak schedules.

To change the synchronisation schedules,

- On the Active Sync screen, press <Menu>
   → Schedule.
- 2. Set the following options:

- Peak times: set the frequency of synchronisations during peak hours
- Off-peak times: set the frequency of synchronisations during non-peak hours
- Use above settings when roaming: set to use the synchronisation schedules even when roaming
- Send/receive when I click Send: set to synchronise each time you send or receive email
- 3. When you are finished, press < Done>.

### Internet Sharing


