Safety warnings

Keep your phone away from small children and pets

Keep your phone and all accessories out of the reach of small children or animals. Small parts may cause choking or serious injury if swallowed.

Protect your hearing



Excessive exposure to sound at high volumes can cause hearing damage. Always turn the volume down before plugging the earphones into an audio source and use only the minimum volume setting necessary to hear your conversation or music.

Install mobile phones and equipment with caution

Ensure that any mobile phones or related equipment installed in your vehicle are securely mounted. Avoid placing your phone and accessories near or in an air bag deployment area. Improperly installed wireless equipment can cause serious injury when air bags inflate rapidly.

Do not use your device during a thunderstorm

Your device may malfunction and your risk of electric shock is increased.

Handle and dispose of batteries and chargers with care

- Use only Samsung-approved batteries and chargers specifically designed for your phone. Incompatible batteries and chargers can cause serious injuries or damage to your phone.
- Never dispose of batteries or phones in a fire. Follow all local regulations when disposing of used batteries or phones.
- Never place batteries or phones on or in heating devices, such as microwave ovens, stoves, or radiators. Batteries may explode when overheated.

Avoid interference with pacemakers

Turn off the phone in potentially explosive environments

Do not use your phone at refuelling points (service stations) or near fuels or chemicals. Turn off your phone whenever directed by warning signs or instructions. Your phone could cause explosions or fire in and around fuel or chemical storage and transfer areas or blasting areas. Do not store or carry flammable liquids, gases, or explosive materials in the same compartment as the phone, its parts, or accessories.

Reduce the risk of repetitive motion injuries

While using your phone, hold the phone with a relaxed grip, press the keys lightly, use special features that reduce the number of keys you have to press (such as templates and predictive text), and take frequent breaks.

Safety precautions

Drive safely at all times

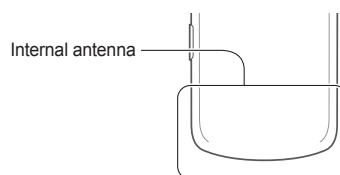

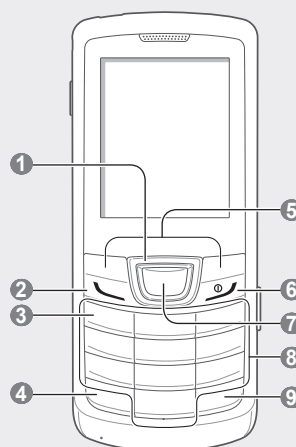

4-way navigation key

In Idle mode, access user-defined menus; In Menu mode, scroll through menu options
Depending on your service provider, pre-defined menus may differ

Dial key

Make or answer a call; In Idle mode, retrieve recently dialed, missed, or received numbers; Send an SOS message
See "Activate and send an SOS message"

3

Voice mail service key

In Idle mode, access voice mails (press and hold)

4

Keypad lock key

In Idle mode, lock or unlock the keypad (press and hold)

5

Softkeys

Perform actions indicated at the bottom of the display

6

Power/End key

Turn the phone on or off (press and hold); End a call; In Menu mode, cancel input and return to Idle mode

7

Confirm key

In Idle mode, access Menu mode; In Menu mode, select the highlighted menu option or confirm an input
Depending on your service provider or region, the key may perform differently

Silent profile key

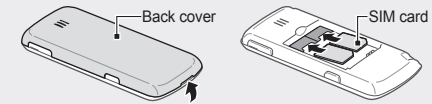
In Idle mode, activate or deactivate the silent profile (press and hold)

Your phone displays the following status indicators on the top of the screen:

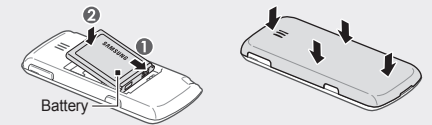

Install the SIM card and battery

- Remove the back cover and insert the SIM card.



- Insert the battery and replace the back cover.



Charge the battery

- Plug the supplied travel adapter.
- When charging is finished, unplug the travel adapter.



Do not remove the battery from the phone before unplugging the travel adapter first. Otherwise, the phone may be damaged.

Instructional icons

	Note: notes, usage tips, or additional information
	Followed by: the order of options or menus you must select to perform a step, for example: In Menu mode, select Messages → Create message (represents Messages , followed by Create message)
	Square brackets: phone keys; for example: [↵] (represents the Power/End key)
	Angled brackets: softkeys that control different functions at each screen; for example: <OK> (represents the OK softkey)

Turn your phone on or off

To turn your phone on,

- Press and hold [↵].
- Enter your PIN and press <OK> (if necessary).
- Press <OK> to register new SIM cards.
- Assign a name and signal icon to the SIM cards by following the on-screen instruction.

To turn your phone off, repeat step 1 above.

If you remove the battery, the time and date will be reset.

Access menus

To access your phone's menus,

- In Idle mode, press <Menu> to access Menu mode.

You may need to press the Confirm key to access Menu mode depending on your region or service provider. When you are using the smart home screen, you cannot use the Confirm key to access Menu mode.

- Use the Navigation key to scroll to a menu or option.
- Press <Select>, <OK>, or the Confirm key to confirm the highlighted option.
- Press <Back> to move up one level; Press [↵] to return to Idle mode.

• When you access a menu requiring the PIN2, you must enter the PIN2 supplied with the SIM card. For details, contact your service provider.
• Samsung is not responsible for any loss of passwords or private information or other damages caused by illegal software.

Make a call

- In Idle mode, enter an area code and a phone number.
- Press [↵] to dial the number.
- To end the call, press [↵].

Answer a call

- When a call comes in, press [↵].
- To end the call, press [↵].

Adjust the volume

To adjust the volume of the ringtone

- In Menu mode, select **Settings** → **Sound profiles**.
- Scroll to the profile you are using.

If you are using the silent or offline profile, you are not allowed to adjust the volume of the ringtone.

- Press <Edit> → **Volume** → **Call alert**.
- Scroll left or right to adjust the volume level and press <Save>.

To adjust the volume of voice during a call

While a call is in progress, press the Navigation key up or down to adjust the volume.

In noisy environments, you may have difficulty hearing the calls while using the speakerphone feature. For better audio performance, use the normal phone mode.

To customise the smart home screen

- In Menu mode, select **Settings** → **Display** → **Smart home**.
- Scroll left or right to **Smart idle**.
- Press <Edit>.
- Select the items to display on the smart home screen.
- Press <Options> → <Save>.
- Press the Confirm key.

You can change the idle screen to another style. In Menu mode, select **Settings** → **Display** → **Smart home** and scroll left or right to a style you want.

To access the smart home idle items

Press the Navigation key to scroll through the items on the smart home screen and press the Confirm key to select an item. The following items are available.

Available items may vary depending on your service provider.

- Shortcuts toolbar:** access your favourite applications. You can customise the shortcut toolbar as desired.
- My buddies:** access contacts that are saved in the favourite number list.
- PIMs ticker:** access upcoming calendar events and tasks.
- Dual clock:** view your home clock and a world clock.
- Monthly calendar:** view the monthly calendar.
- Single clock:** view the current time and date.

To customise the shortcut toolbar

- In Menu mode, select **Settings** → **Display** → **Smart home**.
- Press <Edit>.
- Scroll to **Shortcuts toolbar** and press <Options> → **Edit shortcuts**.
- Select a menu to change or an empty location.
- Press <Edit>.
- Select the menus you want.
Press the Navigation key right to select submenus (if necessary).
- Press <Save>.

Manage your SIM cards

Your phone supports the use of two SIM cards, which enables the use of two subscriptions.

Your phone includes only one Radio Frequency (RF) module that is shared by both SIM cards. During a call that utilizes one of your SIM subscriptions, you will be unable to receive calls intended for the other SIM subscription.

To set time for automatic subscription changes

- In Idle mode, press and hold [☎].
- Select **SIM auto switch**.
- Press <Change> to activate the auto switch feature.
- Set the starting and ending time to change subscription.

To change the names and icons of the SIM cards

- In Idle mode, press and hold [☎].
- Select **Register card**.
- Select a SIM card.
- Select **Card name** and change the name for the SIM card.
- Select **Icon** and change the icon for the SIM card.

Enter text

To change the text input mode

- Press and hold [#] to switch between T9 and ABC modes.
- Press [#] to change case or switch to Number mode.
- Press [*] to switch to Symbol mode.
- Press and hold [*] to select an input method, change the input language, or access your word list.

T9 mode

- Press appropriate alphanumeric keys to enter an entire word.
- When the word displays correctly, press [0] to insert a space. If the correct word does not display, press the Navigation key up or down to select an alternate word.

ABC mode

Press an appropriate alphanumeric key until the character you want appears on the display.

Change your ringtone

- In Menu mode, select **Settings** → **Sound profiles**.
- Scroll to the profile you are using.

If you are using the silent or offline profile, you are not allowed to change the ringtone.

- Press <Edit> → **Voice call ringtone**.
- Select a memory location (if necessary).
- Select a ringtone.

To switch to another profile, select it from the list.

Call a recently dialed number

- In Idle mode, press [↵] to display a list of recent numbers.
- Scroll to the number you want and press [↵] to dial.

Use the smart home screen

The smart home screen allows you to access your favourite applications and contacts and view upcoming events or tasks. You can customise the smart home screen to fit your preferences and needs.

When you are using the smart home screen, the Navigation key does not work as shortcuts.

Send and view messages

To send a text message

- In Menu mode, select **Messages** → **Create message**.
- Enter a recipient number and scroll down.
- Enter your message text. See "*Enter text*".
- Press the Confirm key to send the message.

To view text messages

- In Menu mode, select **Messages** → **Inbox**.
- Select a text message.

Make fake calls

You can stimulate an incoming call when you want to get out of meetings or unwanted conversations.

- Press and hold the Navigation key down in Idle mode.
- Press the Navigation key down four times when the keys are locked.

Activate and send an SOS message

In an emergency, you can send SOS messages to your family or friends for help.

To activate the SOS message

- In Menu mode, select **Messages** → **Settings** → **SOS messages** → **Sending options**.
- Press <Change> to select **On**.
- Scroll down and press the Confirm key to open the recipient list.
- Press <Search> to open your contact list.
- Select a contact.
- Select a number (if necessary).
- Press the Confirm key to save the recipients.
- Scroll down and set the number of times to repeat the SOS message.
- Press <Back> → <Yes>.

To send an SOS message

- With the keys locked, press [↵] to send an SOS message to preset numbers.
The phone switches to SOS mode and sends the preset SOS message.
- To exit SOS mode, press [↵].

Listen to the FM radio

- Plug the supplied headset into the phone.
- In Menu mode, select **FM radio**.
- Press the Confirm key to start the FM radio.
- Press <Yes> to start automatic tuning.
The radio scans and saves available stations automatically.

The first time you turn on the FM radio, you will be prompted to start automatic tuning.

Key	Function
Confirm	Turn the FM radio on or off
Navigation	• Left/Right: Select an available radio station • Up/Down: Adjust the volume.

Record and play voice memos

To record a voice memo

- In Menu mode, select **Voice recorder**.
- Press the Confirm key to start recording.
- Speak your memo into the microphone.
- When you are finished speaking, press <Stop>.

To play a voice memo

- From the voice recorder screen, press <Options> → **Go to My voice clips**.
- Select a file.

Set and use alarms

Learn to set and control alarms for important events.

To set a new alarm

- In Menu mode, select **Alarms**.
- Press <Create>.
- Set the details of the alarm.
- Press <Save> or the Confirm key.

To stop an alarm

When the alarm sounds,

- Press <Confirm> or the Confirm key to stop the alarm.
- Press <Snooze> to silence the alarm for the snooze period.

To deactivate an alarm

- In Menu mode, select **Alarms**.
- Scroll to the alarm you want to deactivate.
- Press <Options> → **Deactivate alarm**.

If you remove the battery, the time and date will be reset.

Activate the torch light

The torch light feature helps you see in dark places by making the flash as bright as possible. To activate the torch light, press and hold [☹]. To deactivate the torch light, press [☹].
