safety and usage information

Comply with the following precautions to avoid dangerous or illegal situations and ensure peak performance of your mobile phone.



Safety warnings

Keep your phone away from small children and pets

Keep your phone and all accessories out of the reach of small children or animals. Small parts may cause choking or serious injury if swallowed.

Protect your hearing



Listening to a headset at high volumes can damage your hearing. Use only the minimum volume setting necessary to hear your conversation or music.

Install mobile phones and equipment with caution

Ensure that any mobile phones or related equipment installed in your vehicle are securely mounted. Avoid placing your phone and accessories near or in an air bag deployment area. Improperly installed wireless equipment can cause serious injury when air bags inflate rapidly.

Handle and dispose of batteries and chargers with care

- Use only Samsung-approved batteries and chargers specifically designed for your phone.
 Incompatible batteries and chargers can cause serious injuries or damage to your phone.
- Never dispose of batteries or phones in a fire.
 Follow all local regulations when disposing used batteries or phones.

- Never place batteries or phones on or in heating devices, such as microwave ovens, stoves, or radiators. Batteries may explode when overheated.

Use your phone in the normal position

Avoid contact with your phone's internal antenna.



assembling and preparing your mobile phone

Get started by assembling and setting up your mobile phone for its first use.


Install the SIM or USIM card and battery

When you subscribe to a cellular service, you will receive a Subscriber Identity Module, or SIM card, with subscription details, such as your personal identification number (PIN) and optional services.

To use UMTS or HSDPA services, you can purchase a Universal Subscriber Identity Module (USIM) card.

To install the SIM or USIM card and battery,

1. Remove the battery cover.





If the phone is on, press and hold $[\begin{cases} \begin{cases} \begin$

2. Insert the SIM or USIM card.





- Place the SIM or USIM card in the phone with the gold-coloured contacts facing down.
- Without inserting a SIM or USIM card, you can use your phone's non-network services and some menus.

3. Insert the battery.



4. Replace the battery cover.



Charge the battery

Before using the phone for the first time, you must charge the battery.

- 1. Open the cover to the multifunction jack on the top of the phone.
- 2. Plug the small end of the travel adapter into the multifunction jack.





Improperly connecting the travel adapter can cause serious damage to the phone. Any damages by misuse are not covered by the warranty.

- 3. Plug the large end of the travel adapter into a power outlet.
- 4. When the battery is fully charged (the imin icon is no longer moving), unplug the travel adapter from the power outlet.
- 5. Unplug the travel adapter from the phone.
- 6. Close the cover to the multifunction jack.



About the low battery indicator

When your battery is low, the phone will emit a warning tone and a low battery message. The battery icon will also be empty and blinking. If the battery level becomes too low, the phone will automatically power off. Recharge your battery to continue using your phone.

Insert a memory card (optional)

To store additional multimedia files, you must insert a memory card. Your phone accepts microSD™ or microSDHC™ memory cards up to 16 GB (depending on memory card manufacturer and type).



Formatting the memory card on a PC may cause incompatibility with your phone. Format the memory card only on the phone.


- 1. Remove the battery cover.
- 2. Unlock the memory card holder.



3. Lift the memory card holder and insert a memory card as shown.



4. Close the memory card holder.



5. Lock the memory card holder.



6. Replace the battery cover.

To remove the memory card, remove the battery cover, unlock and lift the memory card holder, and remove the memory card.

Attach a hand strap (optional)

- 1. Remove the battery cover.
- 2. Slide a hand strap through the slot and hook it over the small projection.





using basic functions

Learn how to perform basic operations and use the main features of your mobile phone

Turn your phone on and off

To turn your phone on,

- Press and hold [[™]].
- 2. Enter your PIN and select **Confirm** (if necessary). To turn your phone off, repeat step 1 above.

Switch to the offline profile

By switching to the offline profile, you can use your phone's non-network services in areas where wireless devices are prohibited, such as aeroplanes and hospitals.

To switch to the offline profile, in Menu mode, select Settings → Phone profiles → Offline.



Follow all posted warnings and directions from official personnel when in areas where wireless devices are prohibited.

Use the touch screen

Your phone's touch screen lets you easily select items or perform functions. Learn basic actions to use the touch screen.



For the optimal use of the touch screen, remove the screen protection film before using your phone.


• Touch an icon to open a menu or launch an application.



 Drag your finger up or down to scroll through vertical lists.



 Drag your finger left or right to scroll through horizontal lists.




Access menus

To access your phone's menus,

- 1. In Idle mode, select **Menu** or press the Menu key to access Menu mode.
- 2. Scroll left or right to a Menu mode screen.
- 3. Select a menu or option.
- 4. Select **t** to move up one level; Press [to return to Idle mode.

Organise applications in Menu mode



To change the order of icons in Menu mode.

- 1. In Idle mode, select Menu or press the Menu key to access Menu mode.
- Select a.

- Rotate the phone anti-clockwise to landscape view.
- 4. Select an application icon and move it to the location you want. You can move an application icon to another Menu mode screen.
- Select Save.



Select Reset to initialize the order of icons in Menu mode.

Use the motion sensor

Your phone features a built-in motion sensor that switches the display from portrait to landscape mode.

The following applications support landscape mode: Camera, Video player, and Music player.

Switch applications

Your phone allows you to multi-task by running multiple applications at the same time.

Switch from one active application to another

- 1. Press and hold the Menu key to open a list of applications.
- Scroll to an application and select it.To change the view mode, select Grid view.

Close applications

To close the current application, press $[\ensuremath{\overline{\bullet}}$].

To close an application that is running in the background,

- Press and hold the Menu key to open a list of applications.
- 2. Scroll to an application and select X.

Access an application using the Gate key

To access entertainment applications,

- 1. Press the Gate key.
- Select an application by rotating the cube to the appropriate side or selecting an icon at the bottom line of the screen.

You can launch the video player, FM radio, or music player. You can also launch the web browser, select a game, or access the list of photos and videos.

Access an application by snapping the phone

Learn to use a motion-activated shortcut for your favourite applications.

- 1. In Idle mode, press and hold the Gate key.
- 2. Select **Guide** and follow the motion tutorial. You can learn the following actions.
 - Shake the phone quickly more than 3 times to end an application.



 Tap the top of the phone twice within 1 second to pause or resume playback, or capture a photo.



 Snap the phone left or right and then quickly back to the initial position to launch an application.



 Quickly tilt the phone left or right and then quickly back to the initial position to launch an application.





- To deactivate the motion tutorial the next time you press and hold the Gate key, select
 Deactivate
- To access the motion tutorial, in Menu mode, select Games and more → Motion tutorial.
- When the entertainment applications screen appears, snap the phone in the direction of the appropriate shortcut (left or right).

4. Shake the phone more than 3 times to close the current application.

Tips for using the motion-related actions:

- Perform the actions within 1 second.
- Wait at least 1 second before performing the actions.
- · Learn the actions by following the motion tutorial.



- The motion-related actions are for both right and left hand users.
- When you are using multiple applications at the same time, you cannot use the motionrelated actions

To change an entertainment application assigned to a motion direction.

- In Menu mode, select Settings → Motion settings → Motion gate.
- 2. Select an application to be changed.

- 3. Select a menu to assign to the direction and select **Save**.
- 4. Select Save.

Use widgets

Learn to use widgets on the widget toolbar.



- Some of your widgets connect to web services. Selecting a web-based widget may incur additional charges.
- Available widgets may vary depending on your region or service provider.

Open the widget toolbar

In Idle mode, select the arrow at the bottom left of the screen to open the widget toolbar. You can rearrange widgets on the widget toolbar or move them to the idle screen.

Move the widgets to the idle screen

- 1. Open the widget toolbar.
- Drag a widget from the widget toolbar to the idle screen. You can position the widget anywhere on the screen.



To move the widgets from the idle screen to the widget toolbar back, shake the phone with the widget toolbar open. This feature may be unavailable depending on the software of the phone.

Change the widgets

- In Menu mode, select Settings → Display and light → Widget.
- Select the widgets you want to include to the widget toolbar and select Save.

Use widget packages

Group your favourite widgets together as a widget package.

To create a widget package,

- 1. In Idle mode, scroll left or right to one of the idle screens.
- 2. Drag a widget from the widget toolbar to the idle screen.

To open the package, scroll left or right to the corresponding screen.

Access help information

Learn to access helpful information about your phone.

- 1. Open the widget toolbar.
- Drag ? to the idle screen and select it.

- 3. Rotate the phone anti-clockwise to landscape view.
- 4. Select a help topic to learn about an application or feature.
- Drag your finger to the right or left to get more information. To return to the previous level, select

Customise your phone

Get more from your phone by customising it to match your preferences.

Adjust the volume of the key tones

In Idle mode, press the Volume key up or down and adjust the key tone volume.

Adjust the vibration intensity on the touch screen

You can adjust the intensity of the vibration when you touch the phone screen.

- 1. In Idle mode, press the Volume key up or down.
- Select Vibration and adjust the intensity of the vibration.

Switch to or from the silent profile
