

### safety and usage information

Comply with the following precautions to avoid dangerous or illegal situations and ensure peak performance of your mobile phone.



### Keep your phone away from small children and pets

Keep your phone and all accessories out of the reach of small children or animals. Small parts may cause choking or serious injury if swallowed.

### Protect your hearing



Listening to a headset at high volumes can damage your hearing. Use only the minimum volume setting necessary to hear your conversation or music.

### Install mobile phones and equipment with caution

Ensure that any mobile phones or related equipment installed in your vehicle are securely mounted. Avoid placing your phone and accessories near or in an air bag deployment area. Improperly installed wireless equipment can cause serious injury when air bags inflate rapidly.

### Handle and dispose of batteries and chargers with care

- Use only Samsung-approved batteries and chargers specifically designed for your phone. Incompatible batteries and chargers can cause serious injuries or damage to your phone.



### Turn off the phone in potentially explosive environments

Do not use your phone at refuelling points (service stations) or near fuels or chemicals. Turn off your phone whenever directed by warning signs or instructions. Your phone could cause explosions or fire in and around fuel or chemical storage and transfer areas or blasting areas. 

### assembling and preparing your mobile phone

Get started by assembling and setting up your mobile phone for its first use.

### Install the SIM card and battery

When you subscribe to a cellular service, you will receive a Subscriber Identity Module, or SIM card, with subscription details, such as your personal identification number (PIN) and optional services.

To install the SIM card and battery,

1. Remove the battery cover.





If the phone is on, press and hold  $[\ref{eq:started}]$  to turn it off.

2. Insert the SIM card.



Ø

Place the SIM card in the phone with the goldcoloured contacts facing down. 3. Insert the battery.



4. Replace the battery cover.



### Charge the battery

Before using the phone for the first time, you must charge the battery.

1. Open the cover to the multifunction jack and plug the small end of the travel adapter.





Improperly connecting the travel adapter can cause serious damage to the phone. Any damages by misuse are not covered by the warranty.

- 2. Plug the large end of the travel adapter into a power outlet.
- When the battery is fully charged (the IIIII icon is no longer moving), unplug the travel adapter from the power outlet.
- 4. Unplug the travel adapter from the phone.
- 5. Close the cover to the multifunction jack.

#### About the low battery indicator

When your battery is low, the phone will emit a warning tone and a low battery message. The battery icon will also be empty and blinking. If the battery level becomes too low, the phone will automatically power off. Recharge your battery to continue using your phone.

### Insert a memory card (optional)

To store additional multimedia files, you must insert a memory card. Your phone accepts microSD™ memory cards up to 8 GB (depending on memory card manufacturer and type).

- 1. Remove the battery cover.
- Insert a memory card with the label side facing up.



### Change the photo on the battery cover

- 1. Remove the battery cover.
- 2. Replace the image with your photo on the battery cover.



### using basic functions

Learn how to perform basic operations and use the main features of your mobile phone.

### Turn your phone on and off

To turn your phone on,

- 1. Slide open the phone.
- 2. Press and hold [
- 3. Enter your PIN and press < OK> (if necessary).
- 4. When the setup wizard opens, customise your phone as desired by following the screen.

To turn your phone off, repeat steps 1 and 2 above.

### Switch to the Offline profile

By switching to the **Offline** profile, you can use your phone's non-network services in areas where wireless devices are prohibited, such as aeroplane and hospitals.

#### To switch to the Offline profile, press $\langle Menu \rangle \rightarrow$ Settings $\rightarrow$ Phone profiles $\rightarrow$ Offline.



Follow all posted warnings and directions from official personnel when in areas where wireless devices are prohibited.

### Access menus

To access your phone's menus,

- 1. Press a softkey for the menu you want.
- 2. Use the navigation key to scroll to a menu or option.
- 3. Press [OK], <Select>, or <OK> to confirm the highlighted option.
- 4. Press <**Back**> to move up one level; Press [
  ] to return to Idle mode.

### Customise your phone

Get more from your phone by customising it to match your preferences.

### Adjust the volume of the key tones

- 3. Press  $\langle Options \rangle \rightarrow Edit \rightarrow Voice call ringtone.$

- 4. Select a ringtone category  $\rightarrow$  a ringtone.
- 5. Press <Options $> \rightarrow$  Save profile.

To switch to another profile, select it from the list.

#### Create a phone profile

- In Idle mode, press <Menu> → Settings → Phone profiles.
- 2. Press <Options $> \rightarrow$  Create.
- 3. Enter a name for the profile and press <Save>.
- 4. Customise the sound settings as desired.
- When you are finished, press <Options> → Save profile.

### Select a wallpaper (Idle mode)

- In Idle mode, press <Menu> → Settings → Display and light settings → Home screen.
- 2. Scroll left or right to Images.

- 3. Select Main display.
- 4. Select an image category  $\rightarrow$  an image.
- 5. Press <Save>.

#### Select a theme for the display

- In Idle mode, press <Menu> → Settings → Display and light settings → My theme.
- 2. Scroll left or right to a theme and press <OK>.

### Set menu shortcuts

- In Idle mode, press <Menu> → Settings → Phone settings → Shortcuts.
- 2. Select a key to use as a shortcut.
- 3. Select a menu to assign to the shortcut key.

### Lock your phone

- In Idle mode, press <Menu> → Settings → Security → Phone lock → On.
- 2. Enter a new 4- to 8-digit password and press <**OK**>.
- 3. Enter the new password again and press <OK>.

### Use basic call functions

Learn to make or answer calls and use basic call functions.

### Make a call

- 1. In Idle mode, enter an area code and a phone number.
- 2. Press [-] to dial the number.
- 3. To end the call, press [

### Answer a call

- 1. When a call comes in, press [-].
- 2. To end the call, press [.

### Adjust the volume

To adjust the volume during a call, press [+/-].

### Use the speakerphone feature

- 1. During a call, press  $[OK] \rightarrow \langle Yes \rangle$  to activate the speaker.
- 2. To switch back to the earpiece, press [OK] again.



In noisy environment, you may have difficulty hearing the calls while using the speakerphone feature. For better performance, use the normal phone mode.

#### Record a conversation



This feature may not be available depending on your region or service provider.

- During a call, press <Options> → Menu → Multimedia → Voice recorder.
- 2. Press [OK] to start recording.
- 3. Press the navigation key down to stop recording.

### Use the headset

By plugging the supplied headset into the multifunction jack, you can make and answer calls:

- To redial the last call, press the headset button twice.
- To answer a call, press and hold the headset button.
- To end a call, press and hold the headset button.

### Send and view messages

Learn to send or view text (SMS) or multimedia (MMS) messages.

### Send a text message

- In Idle mode, press <Menu> → Messages → Create message → Text message.
- 2. Enter your message text and press [OK]. ▶ p. 26
- 3. Enter a destination number.
- 4. Press [OK] to send the message.

### Send a multimedia message

- In Idle mode, press <Menu> → Messages → Create message → Multimedia message.
- 2. Select Subject.
- 3. Enter a subject and press [OK].

- 4. Scroll down to Image or video or Sound and press [OK].
- 5. Add the item you want.
- 6. Scroll down to Text and press [OK].
- 7. Enter your message text and press [OK].
- 8. Press <Options $> \rightarrow$  Send.
- 9. Enter a destination number or an email address.
- 10. Press [OK] to send the message.

#### Enter text

When entering text, you can change the text input mode:

 Press and hold [\*] to switch between T9 and ABC modes. Depending on your region, you may be able to access an input mode for your specific language.

- Press [\*] to change case or switch to Number mode.
- Press and hold [#] to switch to Symbol mode. Enter text in one of the following modes:

#### Add a new contact

- 1. In Idle mode, enter a phone number and press <**Options**>.
- 2. Select **Save contact**  $\rightarrow$  a memory location (phone or SIM)  $\rightarrow$  **New**.
- 3. Select a number type (if necessary).
- 4. Enter contact information.
- 5. Press <Save> to add the contact to memory.

### Find a contact

- In Idle mode, press <Menu> → Phonebook. You can also press <Phonebook> in Idle mode.
- 2. Enter the first few letters of the name you want to find.
- 3. Select the contact's name from the search list.
- Once you have found a contact, you can:
  - call the contact by pressing [-]

### Use basic camera functions

Learn the basics to capture and view photos and videos.

### Capture photos

- 1. In Idle mode, press and hold [1] to turn on the camera.
- 2. Rotate the phone anti-clockwise to landscape view.
- 3. Aim the lens at the subject and make any adjustments.
- 4. Press [1] or [OK] to take a photo. The photo is saved automatically.
- Press [1] or < >> to take another photo (step 3).

### View photos

In Idle mode, press <Menu $> \rightarrow$  My files  $\rightarrow$  Images  $\rightarrow$  My photos  $\rightarrow$  a photo file.

### Capture videos

- 1. In Idle mode, press and hold [13] to turn on the camera.
- 2. Rotate the phone anti-clockwise to landscape view.
- 3. Press [1] to switch to Recording mode.
- 4. Aim the lens at the subject and make any adjustments.
- 5. Press [13] or [OK] to start recording.
- Press [1], [OK], or < > to stop recording. The video is saved automatically.
- Press [☑] or <⇒> to record another video (step 4).

#### View videos

In Idle mode, press <Menu $> \rightarrow$  My files  $\rightarrow$  Videos  $\rightarrow$  My video clips  $\rightarrow$  a video file.

### Listen to music

Learn how to listen to music via the music player or FM radio.

### Listen to the FM radio

- 1. Plug the supplied headset.
- In Idle mode, press <Menu> → Multimedia → FM radio.
- 3. Press  $\left[ \text{OK} \right]$  to turn on the FM radio.
- Press < Yes> to start automatic tuning. The radio scans and saves available stations automatically.



The first time you access the FM radio, you will be prompted to start automatic tuning.

- 5. Scroll up or down to a radio station.
- 6. To turn off the FM radio, press [OK].

### Listen to music files

Start by transferring files to your phone or memory card:

- Download from the wireless web. ▶ p. 30
- Download from a PC with the optional Samsung PC Studio. ▶ p. 37
- Receive via Bluetooth. ► p. 41
- Copy to your memory card. ► p. 38

After transferring music files to your phone or memory card,

- 1. In Idle mode, press [@].
- 2. Select a music category  $\rightarrow$  a music file.

3. Control playback using the following keys:

Your phone will display calls you have missed on the display. To dial the number of a missed call,

- 3. Press [-] to dial.

# Call a recently dialled number

- In Idle mode, press [
   ] to display a list of recent numbers.
