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
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# safety and usage information

Comply with the following precautions to avoid dangerous or illegal situations and ensure peak performance of your mobile phone.



# Keep your phone away from small children and pets

Keep your phone and all accessories out of the reach of small children or animals. Small parts may cause choking or serious injury if swallowed.

### Protect your hearing



Listening to a headset at high volumes can damage your hearing. Use only the minimum volume setting necessary to hear your conversation or music.

# Install mobile phones and equipment with caution

Ensure that any mobile phones or related equipment installed in your vehicle are securely mounted. Avoid placing your phone and accessories near or in an air bag deployment area. Improperly installed wireless equipment can cause serious injury when air bags inflate rapidly.

# Handle and dispose of batteries and chargers with care

- Use only Samsung-approved batteries and chargers specifically designed for your phone. Incompatible batteries and chargers can cause serious injuries or damage to your phone.
- Never dispose of batteries or phones in a fire.
   Follow all local regulations when disposing used batteries or phones.

- Never place batteries or phones on or in heating devices, such as microwave ovens, stoves, or radiators. Batteries may explode when overheated.
- Never crush or puncture the battery. Avoid exposing the battery to high external pressure, which can lead to an internal short circuit and overheating.

### Avoid interference with pacemakers


Maintain a minimum of 15 cm (6 inches) between mobile phones and pacemakers to avoid potential interference, as recommended by manufacturers and the independent research group, Wireless Technology Research. If you have any reason to suspect that your phone is interfering with a pacemaker or other medical device, turn off the phone immediately and contact the manufacturer of the pacemaker or medical device for guidance.

# Turn off the phone in potentially explosive environments

Do not use your phone at refuelling points (service stations) or near fuels or chemicals. Turn off your phone whenever directed by warning signs or instructions. Your phone could cause explosions or fire in and around fuel or chemical storage and transfer areas or blasting areas. Do not store or carry flammable liquids, gases, or explosive materials in the same compartment as the phone, its parts, or accessories.

# Reduce the risk of repetitive motion injuries

When sending text messages or playing games on your phone, hold the phone with a relaxed grip, press the keys lightly, use special features that reduce the number of keys you have to press (such as templates and predictive text), and take frequent breaks.



#### Drive safely at all times

Avoid using your phone while driving and obey all regulations that restrict the use of mobile phones while driving. Use hands-free accessories to increase your safety when possible.

# Follow all safety warnings and regulations

Comply with any regulations that restrict the use of a mobile phone in a certain area.

# Use only Samsung-approved accessories

Using incompatible accessories may damage your phone or cause injury.

# Turn off the phone near medical equipment

Your phone can interfere with medical equipment in hospitals or health care facilities. Follow all regulations, posted warnings, and directions from medical personnel.

# Turn off the phone or disable the wireless functions when in an aircraft

Your phone can cause interference with aircraft equipment. Follow all airline regulations and turn off your phone or switch to a mode that disables the wireless functions when directed by airline personnel.

# Protect batteries and chargers from damage

- Avoid exposing batteries to very cold or very hot temperatures (below 0° C/32° F or above 45° C/ 113° F). Extreme temperatures can reduce the charging capacity and life of your batteries.
- Prevent batteries from contacting metal objects, as this can create a connection between the + and - terminals of your batteries and lead to temporary or permanent battery damage.
- Never use a damaged charger or battery.

# Handle your phone carefully and sensibly


 Do not allow your phone to get wet—liquids can cause serious damage. Do not handle your phone with wet hands. Water damage to your phone can void your manufacturer's warranty.

- Avoid using or storing your phone in dusty, dirty areas to prevent damage to moving parts.
- Your phone is a complex electronic device protect it from impacts and rough handling to avoid serious damage.
- Do not paint your phone, as paint can clog moving parts and prevent proper operation.
- Avoid using the phone's camera flash or light close to the eyes of children or animals.
- Your phone and memory cards may be damaged by exposure to magnetic fields. Do not use carrying cases or accessories with magnetic closures or allow your phone to come in contact with magnetic fields for extended periods of time.

# Avoid interference with other electronic devices

Your phone emits radio frequency (RF) signals that may interfere with unshielded or improperly shielded electronic equipment, such as pacemakers, hearing aids, medical devices, and other electronic devices in homes or vehicles. Consult the manufacturers of your electronic devices to solve any interference problems you experience.

# CAUTION



### Use your phone in the normal position

Avoid contact with your phone's internal antenna.

# Allow only qualified personnel to service your phone

Allowing unqualified personnel to service your phone may result in damage to your phone and will void your warranty.

# Ensure maximum battery and charger life

- Avoid charging batteries for more than a week, as overcharging may shorten battery life.
- Over time, unused batteries will discharge and must be recharged before use.

- Disconnect chargers from power sources when not in use.
- Use batteries only for their intended purpose.

# Handle SIM or USIM cards and memory cards with care

- Do not remove a card while the phone is transferring or accessing information, as this could result in loss of data and/or damage to the card or phone.
- Protect cards from strong shocks, static electricity, and electrical noise from other devices.
- Frequent writing and erasing will shorten the life span of memory cards.
- Do not touch gold-coloured contacts or terminals with your fingers or metal objects. If dirty, wipe the card with a soft cloth.

#### Ensure access to emergency services

Emergency calls from your phone may not be possible in some areas or circumstances. Before travelling in remote or undeveloped areas, plan an alternate method of contacting emergency services personnel.

# Specific Absorption Rate (SAR) certification information

Your phone conforms to European Union (EU) standards that limit human exposure to radio frequency (RF) energy emitted by radio and telecommunications equipment. These standards prevent the sale of mobile phones that exceed a maximum exposure level (known as the Specific Absorption Rate, or SAR) of 2.0 watts per kilogram of body tissue.

During testing, the maximum SAR recorded for this model was 1.08 watts per kilogram. In normal use, the actual SAR is likely to be much lower, as the phone has been designed to emit only the RF energy necessary to transmit a signal to the nearest base station. By automatically emitting lower levels when possible, your phone reduces your overall exposure to RF energy.

The Declaration of Conformity at the back of this manual demonstrates your phones compliance with the European Radio & Terminal Telecommunications Equipment (R&TTE) directive. For more information about the SAR and related EU standards, visit the Samsung mobile phone website.

# Phone layout

The front of your phone includes the following keys and features:



The rear of your phone includes the following keys and features:



You can lock the keys to prevent any unwanted phone operations. In Idle mode, press and hold [\*]. To unlock the keys, press and hold [\*]  $\rightarrow < OK >$ . When the auto keypad lock is on, the keys will be locked automatically after the display turns off.

# assembling and preparing your mobile phone

Get started by assembling and setting up your mobile phone for its first use.

# Install the SIM card and battery

When you subscribe to a cellular service, you will receive a Subscriber Identity Module, or SIM card, with subscription details, such as your personal identification number (PIN) and optional services.

To use UMTS or HSDPA services, you can purchase a Universal Subscriber Identity Module (USIM) card.

To install the SIM or USIM card and battery,

1. Remove the battery cover.





If the phone is on, press and hold [••••] to turn it off.

2. Insert the SIM or USIM card.






Place the SIM or USIM card in the phone with the gold-coloured contacts facing down.

3. Insert the battery.



4. Replace the battery cover.



# Charge the battery

Before using the phone for the first time, you must charge the battery.

1. Open the cover to the multifunction jack and plug the small end of the travel adapter.





Improperly connecting the travel adapter can cause serious damage to the phone. Any damages by misuse are not covered by the warranty.

- 2. Plug the large end of the travel adapter into a power outlet.
- 3. When the battery is fully charged (the imili icon is no longer moving), unplug the travel adapter from the power outlet.
- 4. Unplug the travel adapter from the phone.
- 5. Close the cover to the multifunction jack.
- About the low battery indicator

When your battery is low, the phone will emit a warning tone and a low battery message. The battery icon will also be empty and blinking. If the battery level becomes too low, the phone will automatically power off. Recharge your battery to continue using your phone.

### Insert a memory card (optional)

To store additional multimedia files, you must insert a memory card. Your phone accepts microSD™ memory cards up to 8 GB (depending on memory card manufacturer and type).

- 1. Remove the battery cover.
- 2. Insert a memory card with the label side facing up.

- 3. Push the memory card in the memory card slot until it locks in place.
- 4. Replace the battery cover.

To remove the memory card, push it gently until it disengages from the phone, and then pull the memory card out of the memory card slot.



# using basic functions

Learn how to perform basic operations and use the main features of your mobile phone.

# Turn your phone on and off

To turn your phone on,

- 1. Press and hold [-].
- 2. Enter your PIN and press <**Confirm**> (if necessary).
- 3. When the setup wizard opens, customise your phone as desired by following the screen.

To turn your phone off, repeat step 1 above.

### Switch to the offline profile

By switching to the offline profile, you can use your phone's non-network services in areas where wireless devices are prohibited, such as aeroplane and hospitals.

To switch to the offline profile, in Menu mode, select Settings  $\rightarrow$  Phone profiles  $\rightarrow$  Offline  $\rightarrow$  the Confirm key.



Follow all posted warnings and directions from official personnel when in areas where wireless devices are prohibited.

### Access menus

To access your phone's menus,

- 1. In Idle mode, press the Confirm key to access Menu mode.
- 2. Use the navigation key to scroll to a menu or option.
- 3. Press the Confirm key, <**Select**>, or <**OK**> to confirm the highlighted option.
- 4. Press <**Back**> to move up one level; Press [••••] to return to Idle mode.

# Customise your phone

Get more from your phone by customising it to match your preferences.

### Adjust the volume of the key tones

In Idle mode, press the Volume key up or down to adjust the key tone volume.

### Switch to or from the silent profile

In Idle mode, press and hold [#] to silence or unsilence your phone.

### Change your ringtone

- In Menu mode, select Settings → Phone profiles.
- 2. Scroll to the profile you are using.
- 3. Press  $\langle Options \rangle \rightarrow Edit \rightarrow Voice call ringtone.$

- 4. Select a ringtone category  $\rightarrow$  a ringtone.
- 5. Select Video call ringtone.
- 6. Select a ringtone category  $\rightarrow$  a ringtone.
- 7. Press <Options $> \rightarrow$  Save.

To switch to another profile, select it from the list and press the Confirm key.

### Select a wallpaper (Idle mode)

- In Menu mode, select Settings → Display and light → Home screen.
- 2. Scroll left or right to Image.
- 3. Select Wallpaper.
- 4. Select an image category  $\rightarrow$  an image.
- 5. Press <Set>.
- 6. Press  $\langle Options \rangle \rightarrow Save$ .

### Select a theme for the display

To create a theme,

- In Menu mode, select Settings → Display and light → My theme.
- 2. Press <Options $> \rightarrow$  Create  $\rightarrow$  Easy or Expert.
- 3. Customise the theme as desired by following the screen.
- 4. When you are finished, enter a name for the theme and press <**Save**>.
- 5. Press < Yes> to apply the theme.

To apply a theme,

- In Menu mode, select Settings → Display and light → My theme.
- 2. Scroll to a theme.
- 3. Press  $\langle Options \rangle \rightarrow Save$  to apply the theme.

#### Set menu shortcuts

- In Menu mode, select Settings → Phone settings → Shortcuts.
- 2. Select a key to use as a shortcut.
- 3. Select a menu to assign to the shortcut key.
- 4. Press <Save>.

### Use the simplified menus

To set up simplified menu items,

- 1. In Idle mode, press < Custom>.
- 2. Press  $\langle Options \rangle \rightarrow Customise menu.$
- Select your favourite menus.
   Press <**Options**> → **Open** to select submenus (if necessary).
- 4. Press <Save>.

To access an item from the simplified menus,

- 1. In Idle mode, press <Custom>.
- 2. Scroll to the menu item you want and press the Confirm key.

### Lock your phone

- 1. In Menu mode, select Settings  $\rightarrow$  Security  $\rightarrow$  Phone lock  $\rightarrow$  On.
- 2. Press <Save>.
- 3. Enter a new 4- to 8-digit password and press <Confirm>.
- 4. Enter the new password again and press <Confirm>.

# Use basic call functions

Learn to make or answer calls and use basic call functions.

### Make a call

- 1. In Idle mode, enter an area code and a phone number.
- Press [---] to dial the number.
   For a video call, press <Options> → Video call.
- 3. To end the call, press [----].

### Answer a call

- When a call comes in, press [-]. For a video call, press <Show me>.
- 2. To end the call, press [----].

### Adjust the volume

To adjust the volume during a call, press the Volume key up or down.

### Use the speakerphone feature

- 1. During a call, press the Confirm key  $\rightarrow$  <**Yes**> to activate the speaker.
- 2. To switch back to the earpiece, press the Confirm key again.

In noisy environment, you may have difficulty hearing the calls while using the speakerphone feature. For better performance, use the normal phone mode.

#### Use the headset

By plugging the supplied headset into the multifunction jack, you can make and answer calls:

- To redial the last call, press and hold the headset button.
- To answer a call, press and hold the headset button.
- To end a call, press and hold the headset button.

### Send and view messages

Learn to send or view text (SMS), multimedia (MMS), or email messages.

### Send a text or multimedia message

 In Menu mode, select Messages → Create message → Message.

- Enter your message text. ▶ p. 26 For sending as a text message, skip to step 6. For attaching multimedia, continue with step 3.
- Press <Options> → Add multimedia and add an item.
- 4. Press <Options $> \rightarrow$  Advanced  $\rightarrow$  Add subject.
- 5. Enter a subject.
- 6. Scroll up and enter a destination number.
- 7. Press  $\langle \text{Options} \rangle \rightarrow \text{Send}$  to send the message.

#### Send an email

- In Menu mode, select Messages → Create message → Email.
- 2. Enter your email text.
- Press <Options> → Attach multimedia or Attach organiser and attach a file (if necessary).

- 4. Scroll up and enter a subject.
- 5. Scroll up and enter an email address.
- 6. Press  $\langle \text{Options} \rangle \rightarrow \text{Send}$  to send the message.

### Enter text

When entering text, you can change the text input mode:

- Press and hold [\*] to switch between T9 and ABC modes.
- Press [\*] to change case or switch to Number mode.
- Press and hold [#] to switch to Symbol mode.

Enter text in one of the following modes:

Mode	Function
ABC	Press the appropriate alphanumeric key until the character you want appears on the display.
Т9	<ol> <li>Press the appropriate alphanumeric keys to enter an entire word.</li> <li>When the word displays correctly, press [#] to insert a space. If the correct word does not display, select an alternate word from the list that appears.</li> </ol>
Number	Press the appropriate alphanumeric key to enter a number.
Symbol	Press the appropriate alphanumeric key to select a symbol.

#### View text or multimedia messages

- 1. In Menu mode, select **Messages**  $\rightarrow$  **Inbox**.
- 2. Select a text or multimedia message.

### View an email

- In Menu mode, select Messages → Email inbox.
- 2. Press  $\langle Options \rangle \rightarrow Download$ .
- 3. Select an email or a header.
- If you selected a header, press <Options> → Retrieve to view the body of the email.

# Add and find contacts

Learn the basics of using the phonebook feature.

### Add a new contact

- 1. In Idle mode, enter a phone number and press <**Options**>.
- 2. Select Add to Phonebook  $\rightarrow$  a memory location (phone or SIM)  $\rightarrow$  New.
- 3. Select a number type (if necessary).
- 4. Enter contact information.
- Press the Confirm key or press <Options> → Save to add the contact to memory.

### Find a contact

- 1. In Menu mode, select Phonebook.
- 2. Enter the first few letters of the name you want to find.
- 3. Select the contact's name from the search list.
- Once you have found a contact, you can:
  - call the contact by pressing [---]
    - edit the contact information by pressing  $\langle Options \rangle \rightarrow Edit$

# Listen to music

Learn how to listen to music via the music player or FM radio.

### Listen to the FM radio

- 1. Plug the supplied headset into the phone's multifunction jack.
- In Menu mode, select Applications → FM radio.
- Press <**Yes**> to start automatic tuning. The radio scans and saves available stations automatically.
- The first time you access the FM radio, you will be prompted to start automatic tuning.
- 4. Scroll up or down to a radio station.
- If you want to get information about the song you hear, press <**Options**> → Music recognition.
   ▶ p. 45
- 6. To turn off the FM radio, press the Confirm key.

#### Listen to music files

Start by transferring files to your phone or memory card:

- Download from the wireless web. ► p. 30
- Download from a PC with the optional Samsung PC Studio. ▶ p. 43
- Receive via Bluetooth. ► p. 47
- Copy to your memory card. ► p. 43

After transferring music files to your phone or memory card,

- 1. In Menu mode, select  $Music \rightarrow Music player$ .
- 2. Select a music category  $\rightarrow$  a music file.

3. Control playback using the following keys:

Key	Function
Confirm	Pause or resume playback
Volume	Adjust the volume
Navigation	<ul> <li>Left: Skip backward; Scan backward in a file (press and hold)</li> <li>Right: Skip forward; Scan forward in a file (press and hold)</li> <li>Up: Open the playlist</li> <li>Down: Rate the current track</li> </ul>

### Browse the web

Learn to access and bookmark your favourite web pages.

#### Browse web pages

- In Menu mode, select Browser → Home to launch your service provider's homepage.
- 2. Navigate web pages using the following keys:

Key	Function
Navigation	Scroll up or down on a web page
Confirm	Select an item
<back></back>	Return to the previous page
<options></options>	Access a list of browser options

### Bookmark your favourite web pages

- 1. In Menu mode, select **Browser**  $\rightarrow$  **Bookmarks**.
- 2. Press <Options>  $\rightarrow$  Add bookmark.
- 3. Enter a page title and a web address (URL).
- 4. Press <Save>.

### Launch the Google search engine

Learn to access the homepage of Google search.

- In Menu mode, select Google → Search to launch your service provider's homepage.
- 2. Navigate web pages using the following keys:

Key	Function
Navigation	Scroll up or down on a web page
Confirm	Select an item
<back></back>	Return to the previous page
<options></options>	Access a list of browser options

# using camera functions

Learn how to use basic and advanced camera functions.

# Use basic camera functions

Learn the basics to capture and view photos and videos.

### Capture photos

- 1. In Idle mode, press and hold the Camera key to turn on the camera.
- 2. Rotate the phone anti-clockwise to landscape view.
- 3. Aim the lens at the subject and make any adjustments.
- Press the Confirm key or the Camera key to take a photo. The photo is saved automatically.
- Press (D) or the Camera key to take another photo (step 3).

### View photos

In Menu mode, select My files  $\rightarrow$  Images  $\rightarrow$  My photos  $\rightarrow$  a photo file.

#### Capture videos

- 1. In Idle mode, press and hold the Camera key to turn on the camera.
- 2. Rotate the phone anti-clockwise to landscape view.
- 3. Press [1] twice to switch to Recording mode.
- 4. Aim the lens at the subject and make any adjustments.
- 5. Press the Confirm key or the Camera key to start recording.

- 6. Press < > or the Camera key to stop recording. The video is saved automatically.
- Press < >> or the Camera key to record another video (step 4).

#### View videos

In Menu mode, select  $My\ files \rightarrow Videos \rightarrow My\ video\ clips \rightarrow$  a video file.

### Use advanced camera functions

Learn how to capture photos in various modes and customise camera settings.

#### Capture a series of photos

- 1. In Idle mode, press and hold the Camera key to turn on the camera.
- 2. Rotate the phone anti-clockwise to landscape view.
- 3. Press  $\langle \equiv \rangle \rightarrow$  Shooting mode  $\rightarrow$  Continuous.
- 4. Press < >>.
- 5. Make any necessary adjustments.
- Press and hold the Confirm key or the Camera key to take a series of photos (2-9 photos).

### Capture panoramic photos

- 1. In Idle mode, press and hold the Camera key to turn on the camera.
- 2. Rotate the phone anti-clockwise to landscape view.
- 3. Press  $\langle \equiv \rangle \rightarrow$  Shooting mode  $\rightarrow$  Panorama.
- 4. Select the number of photos.
- 5. Make any necessary adjustments.
- 6. Press the Confirm key or the Camera key to take the first photo.
- 7. Slowly move the phone to the right. The phone captures the next photo automatically.
- 8. Repeat step 6 to complete the panoramic photo.

#### Capture photos in Smile shot mode

- 1. In Idle mode, press and hold the Camera key to turn on the camera.
- 2. Rotate the phone anti-clockwise to landscape view.

- 4. Press <>>.
- 5. Press the Confirm key or the Camera key.
- Aim the camera lens at your subject. Your phone recognises people in an image and detects their smiles. When the subject smiles, the phone automatically takes a photo.

### Capture divided photos

#### View and dial missed calls

Your phone will display calls you have missed on the display. To dial the number of a missed call,

- 1. Press <View>.
- 2. Scroll to the missed call you want to dial.
- 3. Press [-] to dial.

# Call a recently dialled number

- In Idle mode, press [-] to display a list of recent numbers.
- 2. Scroll to the number you want and press [---] to dial.

#### Hold a call or retrieve a held call

Press <**Hold**> to place a call on hold or press <**Retrieve**> to retrieve a held call.

#### Dial a second call

If your network supports this function, you can dial another number during a call:

- 1. Press <Hold> to place the first call on hold.
- 2. Enter the second number to dial and press [---].
- 3. Press <Swap> to switch between the two calls.
- 4. To end the call on hold, press  $\langle Options \rangle \rightarrow End \rightarrow Held call.$
- 5. To end the current call, press [-...].

#### Answer a second call

If your network supports this function, you can answer a second incoming call:

- Press [-] to answer the second call. The first call is automatically placed on hold.
- 2. Press <Swap> to switch between the calls.

#### Make a multiparty call (conference call)

- 1. Call the first party you want to add to the multiparty call.
- While connected to the first party, call the second party. The first party is automatically placed on hold.
- 3. When connected to the second party, press  $\langle Options \rangle \rightarrow Conference call.$

- Repeat steps 2 and 3 to add more parties (if necessary).
- 5. To end the multiparty call, press [----].

#### Call an international number

- 1. In Idle mode, press and hold [0] to insert the + character.
- Enter the complete number you want to dial (country code, area code, and phone number), and then press [-] to dial.

#### Call a contact from the phonebook

You can call numbers directly from the phonebook using stored contacts.  $\blacktriangleright$  p. 27

- 1. In Menu mode, select Phonebook.
- Scroll to the number you want to dial and press
   [---] to dial.

# Use advanced phonebook functions

Learn to create namecards, set speed dial numbers, and create groups of contacts.

#### Create a namecard

- 1. In Menu mode, select Phonebook.
- 2. Press  $\langle Options \rangle \rightarrow My$  namecard.
- 3. Enter your personal details.
- Press the Confirm key or press <Options> → Save.



You can send your namecard by attaching it to a message or email or transferring it via the Bluetooth wireless feature.

### Set speed dial numbers

- 1. In Menu mode, select Phonebook.
- 2. Press <Options> → Settings→ Speed dial.

- 3. Scroll to a number you want to set (2-9) and press the Confirm key.
- 4. Select a contact  $\rightarrow$  a number (if necessary) to assign to the number.

The contact is saved to the speed dial number.



You can now call this contact from Idle mode by pressing and holding the assigned speed dial number.

Your template opens as a new multimedia message.

#### Copy music files to a memory card

- 1. Insert a memory card.
- In Menu mode, select Settings → PC connections → Mass storage.
- 3. Press <Save>.
- 4. Press [ ) to return to Idle mode.
- Using an optional PC data cable, connect the multifunction jack on your phone to a PC.
   When connected, a pop-up window will appear on the PC.

- 6. Open a folder to view files.
- 7. Copy files from the PC to the memory card.

# Synchronise your phone with Windows Media Player

- In Menu mode, select Settings → PC connections → Media player.
- 2. Press <Save>.
- 3. Press [-] to return to Idle mode.
- 4. Using an optional PC data cable, connect the multifunction jack on your phone to a PC with Windows Media Player installed.
  - When connected, a pop-up window will appear on the PC.
- 5. Open Windows Media Player to synchronise music files.

- 6. Edit or enter your phone's name in the pop-up window (if necessary).
- 7. Select and drag the music files you want to the sync list.
- 8. Click Start Sync.

### Create a playlist

- In Menu mode, select Music → Music player → Playlists.
- 2. Select Create playlist.
- 3. Enter a title for your new playlist and press <**Save**>.
- 4. Select the new playlist.
- 5. Select Add.
- 6. Select the files you want to include and press <**OK**>.

#### Customise your music player settings

#### Turn on the Bluetooth wireless feature

- In Menu mode, select Applications → Bluetooth.
- 2. Press <Options $> \rightarrow$  Settings.
- 3. Scroll down to Activation.
- 4. Scroll left or right to On.
- To allow other devices to locate your phone, select My phone's visibility → Visible → <OK>.
   If you select Custom, set duration that your phone is visible and press <OK>.
- 6. Press  $\langle Options \rangle \rightarrow Save$ .

#### Find and pair with other Bluetoothenabled devices

- 1. In Menu mode, select Applications  $\rightarrow$  Bluetooth  $\rightarrow$  Search for new device.
- 2. Scroll to a device and press < Select>.
- Enter a PIN for the Bluetooth wireless feature or the other device's Bluetooth PIN, if it has one, and press <**OK**>. Otherwise, press <**Yes**> to connect to the other device.

When the owner of the other device enters the same code or accepts the connection, pairing is complete.

# Send data using the Bluetooth wireless feature

- 1. Select the file or item from one of your phone's applications that you want to send.
- 2. Press <**Options**> → **Send via** or **Send** namecard via → Bluetooth.

# Receive data using the Bluetooth wireless feature

Press <**Yes**> to confirm that you are willing to receive data from the device.

#### Use Remote SIM mode

In Remote SIM mode, you can make or answer calls only with a connected Bluetooth hands-free car kit via the SIM or USIM card on your phone.

To activate Remote SIM mode,

- In Menu mode, select Applications → Bluetooth.
- 2. Press <Options>  $\rightarrow$  Settings.
- 3. Scroll down to Remote SIM mode.
- Scroll left or right to On and press <Save>. To use Remote SIM mode, start the Bluetooth connection from a Bluetooth hands-free car kit.

# Activate and send an SOS message

When you have an emergency, you can send an SOS message asking for help.

- In Menu mode, select Messages → SOS messages → Sending options.
- 2. Scroll left or right to On.
- 3. Scroll down and press the Confirm key to open the recipient list.
- 4. Press the Confirm key to open your contact list.
- 5. Select a contact and press < Add>.
- 6. Select a number (if necessary).
- 7. When you are finished selecting contacts, press <**Options** $> \rightarrow$  **OK** to save the recipients.

- 8. Scroll down and set the number of times to repeat the SOS message.
- 9. Press <Save> → <Yes>.

To send an SOS message, the keys must be locked. Press the Volume key four times.



Once you send an SOS message, all phone functions will be suspended until you press

#### Activate the mobile tracker

When someone inserts a new SIM or USIM card in your phone, the mobile tracker feature will automatically send the contact number to two recipients to help you locate and recover your phone. To activate the mobile tracker,

- In Menu mode, select Settings → Security → Mobile tracker.
- 2. Enter your password and press < Confirm>.
- 3. Scroll left or right to On.
- 4. Scroll down and press the Confirm key to open the recipient list.
- Press <Options> → Phonebook to open your contact list.
- 6. Select a contact.
- 7. Select a number (if necessary).
- 8. When you are finished selecting contacts, press <**Options** $> \rightarrow$  **OK** to save the recipients.
- 9. Scroll down and enter the sender's name.

# Make fake calls

You can simulate fake incoming calls when you want to get out of meetings or unwanted conversations. You can also make it appear as if you are talking on the phone by playing back a recorded voice.

To activate the fake call feature,

To make a fake call,

- press and hold the shortcut key in Idle mode
- press the shortcut key four times when the keys are locked

- 2. Press the Confirm key to start recording.
- 3. Speak your memo into the microphone.

- 2. Select a file.

3. Control the playback using the following keys:

- 2. Press <Options $> \rightarrow$  Update.
- 3. Select a feed category  $\rightarrow$  an updated feed.

#### Customise RSS reader settings

- In Menu mode, select Applications → RSS reader.
- 2. Press <Options> → Settings → Preferences or Network settings.

- 3. Change the settings to cutomise your RSS reader.
- 4. Press <Save>.

### Search for an item

Learn to quickly find any item stored in your phone.

- 2. Press the Confirm key to begin and record lap times.

- 3. When you are finished, press <**Stop**>.
- 4. Press < Reset> to clear recorded times.

### Create a new task

- 2. Press <Options $> \rightarrow$  Create.
- 3. Enter the details of the task.
- 4. Press <Options $> \rightarrow$  Save.

# Create a text memo

- 1. In Menu mode, select **Organiser**  $\rightarrow$  **Memo**.
- 2. Press < Options $> \rightarrow$  Create.
- 3. Enter your memo text.
- 4. Press the Confirm key.

# Manage your calendar

Learn to change the calendar view and create events.

#### Change the calendar view

- 1. In Menu mode, select **Organiser**  $\rightarrow$  **Calendar**.
- 2. Press  $\langle Options \rangle \rightarrow View by \rightarrow Day or Week$ .

#### Create an event

- 1. In Menu mode, select **Organiser**  $\rightarrow$  **Calendar**.
- 2. Press  $\langle Options \rangle \rightarrow Create \rightarrow$  an event type.
- 3. Enter the details of the event as required.
- 4. Press <Options $> \rightarrow$  Save.
