

- Silent mode** Press and hold # in Idle mode to disable all sounds on the phone. To exit, press and hold this key again.
- Voiceicemail server** Press and hold 1 in Idle mode to access your voicemail server.
- Keypad lock mode** Press and hold * in Idle mode to lock the keypad, and then press Yes to ignore accidental key pressing. To unlock, press the left soft key and then *.

Display

Your phone is in Idle mode when you are not on a call or using a menu. You must be in Idle mode to dial a phone number.



Your phone displays the following status indicators on the top of the screen:

Locking the phone


- In Idle mode, press the **Menu** soft key.
- Select **Phone settings** → **Security** → **Change password**.
- Enter the default password, **00000000**, and press the **OK** soft key.
- Enter a new 4- to 8-digit password and press the **OK** soft key.
- Enter the new password again and press the **OK** soft key.
- Select **Phone lock** → **Enable**.
- Enter the password and press the **OK** soft key.

Locking the SIM card


- In Idle mode, press the **Menu** soft key.
- Select **Phone settings** → **Security** → **PIN check** → **Enable**.
- Enter a supplied 4- to 8-digit PIN code and press the **OK** soft key.
- Select **Change PIN**.
- Enter the current PIN code and press the **OK** soft key.
- Enter a new 4- to 8-digit PIN code and press the **OK** soft key.
- Enter the new code again and press the **OK** soft key.

Installing the SIM card and battery

- Remove the battery cover and insert the SIM card.




- Install the battery and reattach the cover.




Charging the battery

- Plug the supplied travel adapter.




- When charging is finished, unplug the adapter.




Note: Do not remove the battery from the phone without unplugging the adapter first. Otherwise, the phone may be damaged.

Phone layout and key functions



Using the menus

In Idle mode, press the **Menu** soft key to enter the main menu.



Labels at the bottom corners of the display show the current soft key functions. Press the left soft key (...), or right soft key (...) to perform the function indicated.

- To return to the previous menu level, press the **Left soft key** or **C**. To exit the menu without changing the menu settings, press this key.
- Use the 4-way navigation keys (↑ ↓ ← →) as shortcuts to access your favourite menus. **Down** is fixed as a shortcut to **FM Radio**.
- In Idle mode, press the **Menu** soft key.
 - Select **Phone settings** → **Short cut**.
 - Select a key.
 - Select a menu to be assigned to the key.

To select or modify a menu or feature:

- In Idle mode, press the **Menu** soft key.
- Press the Navigation keys to reach a desired menu and then press the **Select** soft key or **i**.
- If the menu contains any submenus, locate the one you want by pressing the Navigation keys. Press the **Select** soft key or **i** to enter the submenu.
- If the selected menu contains additional submenus, repeat this step.
- Press the Navigation keys to find the setting of your choice.
- Press the **Select** soft key or **i** to confirm your chosen setting.

Shortcut numbers

You can quickly access the menu you want by using shortcut numbers. The shortcut number displays in front of the menu name in Menu mode.

Entering text

Changing the text input mode

In a text input field, press the right soft key until the input mode indicator you want appears:

- **T9** : T9 mode
- **A** : ABC mode
- **1** : Number mode
- None: Symbol mode

T9 mode

1. Press **2** to **9** to start entering a word. Press each key once for one letter.

Example: To enter *Hello* in T9 mode, press **4**, **3**, **5**, **5**, and **6**.

T9 predicts the word that you are typing, and it may change with each key that you press.

2. Enter the whole word before editing or deleting characters.

3. When the word displays correctly, go to step 4. Otherwise, press **0** to display alternative word choices for the keys that you have pressed.

For example, *Of* and *Me* use **6** and **3**.

4. Press **#** to insert a space and enter the next word.

ABC mode

Press the keys labelled with the character you want:

- once for the first character
- twice for the second character
- and so on.

For example, press **2** three times to enter "C" and **5** two times to enter "K."

Number mode

Press the keys corresponding to the digits you want.

Symbol mode

Press the number keys corresponding to the symbol you want and press the **OK** soft key. You can press **Up** or **Down** to display more symbols.

Tips for entering text

- To move the cursor, press the Navigation keys.
- To delete letters one by one, press **C**. To delete all of the letters, press and hold **C**.
- To insert a space between letters, press **#**.
- To change case in T9 or ABC mode, press *****.
- To enter punctuation marks in T9 or ABC mode, press **1**.

Sending an SMS message

1. In Idle mode, press the **Menu** soft key.
2. Select **Messages** → **Text messages** → **Write new**.
3. Enter the message text.
To change case, press *****.
4. Press the **Options** soft key and add items using the following options:
 - **Add objects**: add sounds, images, or animated images.
 - **Add templates**: add text templates.
 - **Add emoticon**: add emoticons.
 - **Add phonebook**: add Phonebook entries.
 - **Add bookmark**: add bookmark items.
5. Press the **Options** soft key and select **Send only**, **Save and send**, or **Save only**.
6. If you select **Save and send** or **Save only**, select a memory location.
7. Enter a destination number and press the **OK** soft key.

Access media files	Access games, sound files, images in your phone's memory.	Menu > Funbox > Games, Sounds, or Images
Delete all media files	Delete games, sound files, images in each media box, or all media files at once.	Menu > Funbox > Delete all
Funbox memory status	Check the amount of memory in use for game, sound, and image.	Menu > Funbox > Memory status
Alarm	Set an alarm to sound at a specific time.	Menu > Organiser > Alarm
Calendar	Keep track of daily or monthly schedule.	Menu > Organiser > Calendar
Time and date	Set the current time and date manually.	Menu > Organiser > Time & Date

Important safety precautions

Read these guidelines before using your wireless phone. Failure to comply with them may be dangerous or illegal.

Drive safely at all times

Do not use a hand-held phone while driving; park the vehicle first.

Switching off when refueling

Do not use the phone at a refueling point (service station) or near fuels or chemicals.

Switching off in an aircraft

Wireless phones can cause interference. Using them in an aircraft is both illegal and dangerous.

Switching off near all medical equipment

Hospitals and health care facilities may be using equipment that could be sensitive to external RF energy. Follow any regulations or rules in force.

Interference

All wireless phones may be subject to interference, which could affect their performance.

Special regulations

Follow any special regulations in force in any area and always switch off your phone whenever it is forbidden to use it.

Water resistance

Your phone is not water-resistant. Keep it dry.

Sensible use

Use only in the normal position (held to the ear). Avoid unnecessary contact with the antenna when the phone is switched on.

Emergency calls

Key in the emergency number for your present location, then press **[■]**. Do not end the call until given permission to do so.

Small children and your phone

Keep the phone and all its parts including accessories out of reach of small children.

Accessories and batteries

Use only Samsung-approved batteries and accessories, such as headsets and PC data cables. Use of any unauthorised accessories could damage you or your phone and may be dangerous.

CAUTION

Risk of explosion if a battery is replaced by an incorrect type. Dispose of used batteries according to the manufacturer's instructions.



At very high volumes, prolonged listening to a headset can damage your hearing.

Qualified service

Only qualified service personnel may repair your phone.

SAR information

Your wireless phone is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed and manufactured not to exceed the emission limits for exposure to radio frequency (RF) energy set by the European Union (EU) Council. These limits are part of comprehensive guidelines and establish permitted levels of RF energy for the general population. The guidelines are based on the safety standards that were developed by independent scientific organizations through periodic and thorough evaluation of scientific studies.

The standards include a substantial safety margin designed to assure the safety of all persons, regardless of age and health.

The exposure standard for wireless phones employs a unit of measurement known as Specific Absorption Rate (SAR). The SAR limit set by the EU Council is 2.0 W/kg. The highest SAR value for this model phone was 0.419 W/kg.
