# safety and usage information

Comply with the following precautions to avoid dangerous or illegal situations and ensure peak performance of your mobile phone.



## Safety warnings

# Keep your phone away from small children and pets

Keep your phone and all accessories out of the reach of small children or animals. Small parts may cause choking or serious injury if swallowed.

#### Protect your hearing



Listening to a headset at high volumes can damage your hearing. Use only the minimum volume setting necessary to hear your conversation or music.

# Install mobile phones and equipment with caution

Ensure that any mobile phones or related equipment installed in your vehicle are securely mounted. Avoid placing your phone and accessories near or in an air bag deployment area. Improperly installed wireless equipment can cause serious injury when air bags inflate rapidly.

# Handle and dispose of batteries and chargers with care

- Use only Samsung-approved batteries and chargers specifically designed for your phone.
   Incompatible batteries and chargers can cause serious injuries or damage to your phone.
- Never dispose of batteries or phones in a fire.
   Follow all local regulations when disposing used batteries or phones.

- Never place batteries or phones on or in heating devices, such as microwave ovens, stoves, or radiators. Batteries may explode when overheated.

# Use only Samsung-approved accessories

## Use your phone in the normal position

Avoid contact with your phone's internal antenna.





You can lock the touch screen and keys to prevent any unwanted phone operations. To lock, press the Hold key.



# assembling and preparing your mobile phone

Get started by assembling and setting up your mobile phone for its first use.

# Install the SIM or USIM card and battery

When you subscribe to a cellular service, you will receive a Subscriber Identity Module, or SIM card, with subscription details, such as your personal identification number (PIN) and optional services.

To use UMTS or HSDPA services, you can purchase a Universal Subscriber Identity Module (USIM) card.

To install the SIM or USIM card and battery,

1. Remove the battery cover.





If the phone is on, press and hold [ • ] to turn it off.


2. Insert the SIM or USIM card.





- Place the SIM or USIM card in the phone with the gold-coloured contacts facing down.
  - Without inserting a SIM or USIM card, you can use your phone's non-network services and some menus.

#### 3. Insert the battery.



4. Replace the battery cover.



#### Charge the battery

Before using the phone for the first time, you must charge the battery.

- 1. Open the cover to the multifunction jack on the side of the phone.
- 2. Plug the small end of the travel adapter into the multifunction jack.



With the triangle facing up



Improperly connecting the travel adapter can cause serious damage to the phone. Any damages by misuse are not covered by the warranty.

- 3. Plug the large end of the travel adapter into a power outlet.
- When the battery is fully charged (the imiliation is no longer moving), unplug the travel adapter from the power outlet.
- 5. Unplug the travel adapter from the phone.
- 6. Close the cover to the multifunction jack.




#### About the low battery indicator

When your battery is low, the phone will emit a warning tone and a low battery message. The battery icon will also be empty and blinking. If the battery level becomes too low, the phone will automatically power off. Recharge your battery to continue using your phone.

### Insert a memory card (optional)

To store additional multimedia files, you must insert a memory card. Your phone accepts microSDTM or microSDHCTM memory cards up to 8 GB (depending on memory card manufacturer and type).

- Open the cover to the memory card slot on the side of the phone.
- 2. Insert a memory card with the label side facing up.



3. Push the memory card in the memory card slot until it locks in place.

To remove the memory card, push it gently until it disengages from the phone, and then pull the memory card out of the memory card slot.



# using basic functions

Learn how to perform basic operations and use the main features of your mobile phone.

## Turn your phone on and off

To turn your phone on,

- 1. Press and hold [ ].
- 2. Enter your PIN and select **Confirm** (if necessary). To turn your phone off, repeat step 1 above.

### Switch to the offline profile

By switching to the offline profile, you can use your phone's non-network services in areas where wireless devices are prohibited, such as aeroplanes and hospitals.

To switch to the offline profile, in Menu mode, select Settings → Phone profiles → Offline.



Follow all posted warnings and directions from official personnel when in areas where wireless devices are prohibited.

#### Use the touch screen

Your phone's touch screen lets you easily select items or perform functions.

Learn basic actions to use the touch screen.




For the optimal use of the touch screen, remove the screen protection film before using your phone.


• Select an icon to open a menu or launch an application.



 Drag your finger up or down to scroll through vertical lists.



 Drag your finger left or right to scroll through horizontal lists.



#### Access menus

To access your phone's menus,

- In Idle mode, select Menu to access Menu mode.
- 2. Select a menu or an option.

## Switch applications

Learn to switch to other applications from a menu, without closing the menu screen you are using.



You must change the camera key function to Switch (in Menu mode, select Settings → Phone settings → Camera key function).

To switch applications,

 While using a menu, press and hold the Camera key.

The following applications are available:

- Call: open the dialling screen
- Music player: launch the music player
- Messages: access the Messages menu
- · Browser: launch the web browser
- Main menu: access the main menu screen
- 2. Select an application.

## Use widgets

Learn to use widgets on the widget toolbar.



- Some of your widgets connect to web services. Selecting a web-based widget may incur additional charges.
- Available widgets may vary depending on your region or service provider.

#### Open the toolbar

In Idle mode, select the arrow at the bottom left of the screen to open the toolbar. You can rearrange widgets on the toolbar or move them to the idle screen

#### Add the widgets to the idle screen

- 1. Open the toolbar.
- Drag a widget from the toolbar to the idle screen. You can position the widget anywhere on the screen.

#### Move the widgets to the idle screen

- Open the toolbar.
- Drag a widget from the toolbar to the idle screen. You can position the widget anywhere on the screen.

#### Change the widgets

- In Menu mode, select Settings → Display and light → Widget.
- Select the widgets you want to include to the toolbar and select Save.

## Access help information

Learn to access helpful information about your phone.

- In Menu mode, select Settings → Display and light → Widget.
- Select Help → Save.
- 3. Press [ ] return to Idle mode.
- 4. Open the widget toolbar.
- 5. Select ? from the widget toolbar.

- 6. Rotate the phone anti-clockwise to landscape view.
- Select a help topic to learn about an application or feature.
- 8. Drag your finger to the right or left to get more information. To return to the previous level, select .

#### Customise your phone

Get more from your phone by customising it to match your preferences.

#### Adjust the volume of the key tones

In Idle mode, press the Volume key up or down and adjust the key tone volume.

## Adjust the vibration intensity on the touch screen

You can adjust the intensity of the vibration when you touch the phone screen.

- 1. In Idle mode, press the Volume key up or down.
- 2. Select **Vibration** and press the Volume key up or down to adjust the intensity of the vibration.

### Switch to or from the silent profile

In Idle mode, select **Keypad** and touch and hold **#** to switch to or from the silent profile.

#### Change your ringtone

- In Menu mode, select Settings → Phone profiles.
- Select >> next to the profile you are using.
- 3. Select Voice call ringtone or Video call ringtone.

- Select a ringtone from the list and select Save.
- Select Save.

To switch to another profile, select it from the list.

## Select a wallpaper (Idle mode)

- In Menu mode, select Settings → Display and light → Wallpaper.
- Scroll left or right to an image.
- 3. Select Set.

#### Lock your phone

- 1. In Menu mode, select **Settings** → **Security**.
- Select On under Phone lock.
- 3. Enter a new 4- to 8-digit password and select **Confirm**.

 Enter the new password again and select Confirm



The first time you access a menu that requires a password, you will be prompted to create and confirm a password.

#### Use basic call functions

Learn to make or answer calls and use basic call functions.



During a call, your phone automatically locks the touch screen to prevent accidental inputs. To unlock, press the Hold key.

#### Make a call

- 1. In Idle mode, select **Keypad** and enter an area code and a phone number.
- Select 
   → Voice call or press [→] to dial the number.

For a video call, select  $\equiv$   $\rightarrow$  Video call.

3. To end the call, press [ ].

#### Answer a call

- 1. When a call comes in, press [-].
- For a video call, press [ ] and select Show me
  to allow the caller to see you via the front camera
  lens.
- 3. To end the call, press [ ].



You can reject incoming calls by using the auto rejecting; in Menu mode, select Settings → Application settings → Call → All calls → Auto reject → On. Then, set up the reject list and select numbers to reject.

#### Adjust the volume

To adjust the volume during a call, press the Volume key up or down.

#### Use the speakerphone feature

- During a call, select Speaker → Yes to activate the speaker.
- 2. To switch back to the earpiece, select Speaker.



In noisy environment, you may have difficulty hearing the calls while using the speakerphone feature. For better audio performance, use the normal phone mode.

#### Use the headset

By plugging the supplied headset into the multifunction jack, you can make and answer calls:

- To redial the last call, press the headset button, and then press again and hold.
- To answer a call, press the headset button.
- To end a call, press the headset button.

## Send and view messages

Learn to send and view text (SMS), multimedia (MMS), and email messages.

## Send a text or multimedia message

- In Menu mode, select Messages → Create message → Message.
- Select Tap to add recipient → Enter manually.
- 3. Enter a destination number and select Done.
- 4. Select Tap to add text.
- Enter your message text and select **Done**.
   ▶ p. 29
   For sending as a text message, skip to step 7.
   For attaching multimedia, continue with step 6.
- 6. Select Add media and add an item.
- 7. Select **Send** to send the message.

#### Send an email

- In Menu mode, select Messages → Create message → Email.
- 2. Select Tap to add recipient → Enter manually.
- 3. Fnter an email address and select Done.
- 4. Select Tap to add subject.
- 5. Enter a subject and select Done.
- Select Tap to add text.
- 7. Enter your email text and select **Done**.
- Select Add files and attach a file (if necessary).
- Select Send to send the message.

#### **Enter text**

Enter text and create messages or notes using the virtual keypad.

- Select the text input field.
- 2. Select the appropriate virtual keys to enter text.
  - To switch between T9 and ABC modes. select T9
  - To change case or switch to Number or Symbol mode, select Abc.
  - To switch to Symbol mode, select <a>a</a>.



You can use the following text input modes:

Mode	Function
ABC	Select the appropriate virtual key until the character you want appears on the display.
Т9	<ol> <li>Select the appropriate virtual keys to enter an entire word.</li> <li>When the word displays correctly, select in to insert a space. If the correct word does not display, select to select an alternate word.</li> </ol>
Number	Select the appropriate virtual key to enter a number.
Symbol	Select the appropriate virtual key to enter a symbol.

#### View text or multimedia messages

- In Menu mode, select Messages → Inbox.
- 2. Select a text or multimedia message.

#### View an email

- In Menu mode, select Messages → Email inbox.
- 2. Select an account.
- 3. Select Download.
- 4. Select an email or a header.
- If you selected a header, select Retrieve to view the body of the email.

#### Add and find contacts

Learn the basics of using the phonebook feature.

#### Add a new contact

- In Idle mode, select Keypad and enter a phone number.
- 2. Select  $\equiv$   $\rightarrow$  Add to Phonebook  $\rightarrow$  New.

- Select Phone or SIM.
- Enter contact information.
- 5. Select Save to add the contact to memory.

#### Find a contact

- 1. In Menu mode, select Phonebook.
- 2. Select the text input field (if necessary).
- 3. Enter the letter of the name you want to find. You can also drag To select the first letter of the name
- 4. Select the contact's name from the search list.



Once you have found a contact, you can:

- call the contact by selecting
- edit the contact information by selecting Edit

#### Use basic camera functions

Learn the basics to capture and view photos and videos



When you turn on the camera, the display may appear blank due to temporary electrostatic discharge. Try restarting the phone to solve the problem.

# Capture photos

- In Idle mode, press and hold the Camera key to turn on the camera.
- Rotate the phone anti-clockwise to landscape view
- 3. Aim the lens at the subject and make any adjustments.
  - To turn the flash on or off, select



To set the exposure value, select [2].

4. Press the Camera key to take a photo. The photo is saved automatically.

After capturing photos, select to view photos.

#### Hold a call or retrieve a held call

Select **Hold** to place a call on hold or select **Retrieve** to retrieve a held call.

#### Dial a second call

If your network supports this function, you can dial another number during a call:

- 2. Enter the second number to dial and select **New** call or press [-].

- To allow other devices to locate your phone, select Settings → On under My phone's visibility → Save.
  - If you selected **Custom**, set duration that your phone is visible.
- 4. Select Save.

## Find and pair with other Bluetoothenabled devices

- In Menu mode, select Applications → Bluetooth → Search.
- 2. Select and drag a device icon into the centre.
- Enter a PIN for the Bluetooth wireless feature or the other device's Bluetooth PIN, if it has one, and select OK

When the owner of the other device enters the same PIN or accepts the connection, pairing is complete.



You may not need to enter a PIN depending on the device.

# Send data using the Bluetooth wireless feature

This feature may not be available depending on your region or service provider.

- In Menu mode, select Messages → SOS messages → Sending options.
- 2. Select **On** to turn on the SOS messaging feature.
- 3. Select the recipient field to open the recipient list.
- 4. Select 🚺 to open your contact list.
- 5. Select the contacts you want and select Add.

- 6. Select a phone number (if necessary).
- 7. Select **OK** to save the recipients.
- Select the Repeat drop-down menu and select the number of times to repeat the SOS message.
- 9. Select Save → Yes.

To send an SOS message, the touch screen and the keys must be locked. Press the Volume key four times.



Once you send an SOS message, all phone functions will be suspended until you press the Hold key. If you press [ ], phone functions will be available, but the keys will remain locked.

## Activate the mobile tracker

# troubleshooting

# While using your phone, the following messages may appear:

Message	Try this to solve the problem:
No sim mode	Ensure that the SIM or USIM card is installed correctly.
Phone lock	When the phone lock feature is enabled, you must enter the password you set for the phone.

Message	Try this to solve the problem:
PIN code	When using the phone for the first time or when the PIN requirement is enabled, you must enter the PIN supplied with the SIM or USIM card. You can disable this feature by using the PIN lock menu.
PIN2 code	When you access a menu requiring PIN2, you must enter the PIN2 supplied by the SIM or USIM card. For details, contact your service provider

Message	Try this to solve the problem:
PUK code	Your SIM or USIM card is blocked, usually as a result of entering your PIN incorrectly several times. You must enter the PUK supplied by your service provider.

# Your phone displays "Service unavailable" or "Network error."

- When you are in areas with weak signals or poor reception, you may lose reception. Move to another area and try again.
- You cannot access some options without a subscription. Contact your service provider for more details.

## You enter a number, but the call is not dialled.

- Ensure that you have pressed the Dial key: [-].
- Ensure that you have accessed the right cellular network.
- Ensure that you have not set call barring for the phone number.

#### Another caller cannot reach you.

- Ensure that your phone is turned on.
- Ensure that you have accessed the right cellular network.
- Ensure that you have not set call barring for the phone number.

#### Another caller cannot hear you speaking.

- Ensure that you are not covering the built-in microphone.
- Ensure that the microphone is close to your mouth.
- If using a headset, ensure that it is properly connected.

## The phone beeps and the battery icon flashes.

Your battery is low. Recharge or replace the battery to continue using the phone.

#### The audio quality of the call is poor.

- Ensure that you are not blocking the phone's internal antenna
- When you are in areas with weak signals or poor reception, you may lose reception. Move to another area and try again.

# You select a contact to call, but the call is not dialled.

- Ensure that the correct number is stored in the contact list.
- Re-enter and save the number, if necessary.

# The battery does not charge properly or sometimes the phone turns itself off.

- The battery terminals may be dirty. Wipe both gold-coloured contacts with a clean, soft cloth and try charging the battery again.
- If the battery will no longer charge completely, dispose of the old battery properly and replace it with a new battery.

#### Your phone is hot to the touch.

When you use several applications at once, your phone requires more power and may heat up.

This is normal and should not affect your phone's lifespan or performance.
