safety and usage information

Comply with the following precautions to avoid dangerous or illegal situations and ensure peak performance of your mobile phone.



Safety warnings

Keep your phone away from small children and pets

Keep your phone and all accessories out of the reach of small children or animals. Small parts may cause choking or serious injury if swallowed.

Protect your hearing



Listening to a headset at high volumes can damage your hearing. Use only the minimum volume setting necessary to hear your conversation or music.

Install mobile phones and equipment with caution

Ensure that any mobile phones or related equipment installed in your vehicle are securely mounted. Avoid placing your phone and accessories near or in an air bag deployment area. Improperly installed wireless equipment can cause serious injury when air bags inflate rapidly.

Handle and dispose of batteries and chargers with care

- Use only Samsung-approved batteries and chargers specifically designed for your phone.
 Incompatible batteries and chargers can cause serious injuries or damage to your phone.
- Never dispose of batteries in a fire. Follow all local regulations when disposing used batteries.

- Never place batteries or phones on or in heating devices, such as microwave ovens, stoves, or radiators. Batteries may explode when overheated.
- Never crush or puncture the battery. Avoid exposing the battery to high external pressure, which can lead to an internal short circuit and overheating.

Avoid interference with pacemakers

Maintain a minimum of 15 cm (6 inches) between mobile phones and pacemakers to avoid potential interference, as recommended by manufacturers and the independent research group, Wireless Technology Research. If you have any reason to suspect that your phone is interfering with a pacemaker or other medical device, turn off the phone immediately and contact the manufacturer of the pacemaker or medical device for quidance.

Turn off the phone in potentially explosive environments

Do not use your phone at refuelling points (service stations) or near fuels or chemicals. Turn off your phone whenever directed by warning signs or instructions. Your phone could cause explosions or fire in and around fuel or chemical storage and transfer areas or blasting areas. Do not store or carry flammable liquids, gases, or explosive materials in the same compartment as the phone, its parts, or accessories.

Reduce the risk of repetitive motion injuries

When sending text messages or playing games on your phone, hold the phone with a relaxed grip, press the buttons lightly, use special features that reduce the number of buttons you have to press (such as templates and predictive text), and take frequent breaks.



Safety precautions

Drive safely at all times

Avoid using your phone while driving and obey all regulations that restrict the use of mobile phones while driving. Use hands-free accessories to increase your safety when possible.

Follow all safety warnings and regulations

Comply with any regulations that restrict the use of a mobile phone in a certain area.

Use only Samsung-approved accessories

Using incompatible accessories may damage your phone or cause injury.

Turn off the phone near medical equipment

Your phone can interfere with medical equipment in hospitals or health care facilities. Follow all regulations, posted warnings, and directions from medical personnel.

Turn off the phone or disable the wireless functions when in an aircraft

Your phone can cause interference with aircraft equipment. Follow all airline regulations and turn off your phone or switch to a mode that disables the wireless functions when directed by airline personnel.



Protect batteries and chargers from damage

- Avoid exposing batteries to very cold or very hot temperatures (below 0° C/32° F or above 40° C/ 104° F). Extreme temperatures can reduce the charging capacity and life of your batteries.
- Prevent batteries from contacting metal objects, as this can create a connection between the + and - terminals of your batteries and lead to temporary or permanent battery damage.
- Never use a damaged charger or battery.

Handle your phone carefully and sensibly

 Do not allow your phone to get wet—liquids can cause serious damage. Do not handle your phone with wet hands. Water damage to your phone can void your manufacturer's warranty.

- Avoid using or storing your phone in dusty, dirty areas to prevent damage to moving parts.
- Your phone is a complex electronic device protect it from impacts and rough handling to avoid serious damage.
- Do not paint your phone, as paint can clog moving parts and prevent proper operation.
- Avoid using the phone's camera flash or light close to the eyes of children or animals.
- Your phone and memory cards may be damaged by exposure to magnetic fields. Do not use carrying cases or accessories with magnetic closures or allow your phone to come in contact with magnetic fields for extended periods of time.

Avoid interference with other electronic devices

Your phone emits radio frequency (RF) signals that may interfere with unshielded or improperly shielded electronic equipment, such as pacemakers, hearing aids, medical devices, and other electronic devices in homes or vehicles. Consult the manufacturers of your electronic devices to solve any interference problems you experience.

Do not use the phone if the screen is cracked or broken

Broken glass could cause injury to your hand and face. Bring the phone to Samsung service centre to replace the glass.

Use your phone in the normal position

Avoid contact with your phone's internal antenna.

Allow only qualified personnel to service your phone

Allowing unqualified personnel to service your phone may result in damage to your phone and will void your warranty.

Ensure maximum battery and charger life

- Avoid charging batteries for more than a week, as overcharging may shorten battery life.
- Over time, unused batteries will discharge and must be recharged before use.

- Disconnect chargers from power sources when not in use.
- · Use batteries only for their intended purpose.

Handle SIM cards and memory cards with care

- Do not remove a card while the phone is transferring or accessing information, as this could result in loss of data and/or damage to the card or phone.
- Protect cards from strong shocks, static electricity, and electrical noise from other devices.
- Frequent writing and erasing will shorten the life span of memory cards.
- Do not touch gold-coloured contacts or terminals with your fingers or metal objects. If dirty, wipe the card with a soft cloth.

Ensure access to emergency services

Emergency calls from your phone may not be possible in some areas or circumstances. Before travelling in remote or undeveloped areas, plan an alternate method of contacting emergency services personnel.

Specific Absorption Rate (SAR) certification information

Your phone conforms to European Union (EU) standards that limit human exposure to radio frequency (RF) energy emitted by radio and telecommunications equipment. These standards prevent the sale of mobile phones that exceed a maximum exposure level (known as the Specific Absorption Rate, or SAR) of 2.0 watts per kilogram of body tissue.

During testing, the maximum SAR recorded for this model was 0.079 watts per kilogram. In normal use, the actual SAR is likely to be much lower, as the phone has been designed to emit only the RF energy necessary to transmit a signal to the nearest base station. By automatically emitting lower levels when possible, your phone reduces your overall exposure to RF energy.



assembling and preparing your mobile phone

Get started by assembling and setting up your mobile phone for its first use.

Install the SIM card and battery

When you subscribe to a cellular service, you will receive a Subscriber Identity Module, or SIM card, with subscription details, such as your personal identification number (PIN) and optional services.

To install the SIM card and battery,

1. Remove the battery cover.






If the phone is on, press and hold $[\Phi]$ to turn it off.

2. Insert the SIM card.



Place the card in the phone with the gold-coloured contacts facing down.

3. Insert the battery.



4. Replace the battery cover.



Charge the battery

Before using the phone for the first time, you must charge the battery.

 Open the cover to the multifunction jack on the top of the phone.



Plug the small end of the travel adapter into the jack.



With the triangle facing the front of your phone



Improperly connecting the adapter can cause serious damage to the phone. Any damages by misuse are not covered by the warranty.





- Plug the large end of the travel adapter into a power outlet.
- When the battery is fully charged (the icon is no longer moving), unplug the travel adapter from the power outlet.
- 5. Unplug the adapter from the phone.
- 6. Close the cover to the multifunction jack.



About the low battery indicator


When your battery is low, the phone will emit a warning tone and a low battery message. The battery icon will also be empty and blinking. If the battery level becomes too low, the phone will automatically power off. Recharge your battery to continue using your phone.

Insert a memory card (optional)

To store additional multimedia files, you must insert a memory card. Your phone accepts microSD™ memory cards up to 4 GB (depending on memory card manufacturer and type).

1. Remove the battery cover.

Insert a memory card with the label side facing down.



- 3. Push the card in the slot until it locks in place.
- 4. Replace the battery cover.

To remove the memory card, push it gently until it disengages from the phone, and then pull the card out of the slot.

Leam how to perform basic operations and use the main features of your mobile phone.

Turn your phone on and off

To turn your phone on,

- 1. Press and hold [O].
- 2. Enter your PIN and touch \checkmark (if necessary).
- 3. Align your screen by following the onscreen instructions.

To turn your phone off, repeat step 1 above.

Switch to Offline profile

By switching to Offline profile, you can use your phone's non-network services in areas where wireless devices are prohibited, such as aeroplanes and hospitals.

To switch to Offline profile, touch \Longrightarrow \rightarrow Phone profiles \rightarrow Offline (twice).



Follow all posted warnings and directions from official personnel when in areas where wireless devices are prohibited.

Use the touch screen

Learn basic actions to use the touch screen.

Your phone's touch screen lets you easily select items or perform functions.

Touch an icon to open a menu or launch an application.



 Drag your finger left or right to scroll through horizontal lists.



 Drag your finger up or down to scroll through vertical lists.





Dragging on the left side of the screen scrolls through lists quickly and dragging on the right side scrolls slowly.

Access menus

To access your phone's menus,

- 1. Touch
- 2. Touch a menu icon.
- 3. Drag your finger to scroll to a menu or option.
- 4. Touch v to confirm the highlighted option.
- 5. Touch to move up one level; Touch to return to Idle mode.

Customise your phone

Get more from your phone by customising it to match your preferences.

Adjust the volume of the key tones

In Idle mode, press the Volume key up or down to adjust the key tone volume.

Switch to or from Silent profile

In Idle mode, touch and hold $\[\]$ to silence or $\[\]$ to unsilence your phone.

Change your ringtone

- 3. Select a ringtone category → a ringtone.
- 4. Touch \checkmark \rightarrow \blacksquare \rightarrow Save \rightarrow \blacksquare \rightarrow Save.

Select a wallpaper (Idle mode)

- 1. In Idle mode, touch ::: → □ → Display & light settings → Display settings → Wallpaper.
- 2. Select **Pictures** → an image category → an image.
- 3. Touch → Set.

Lock your phone

- 2. Select On.
- 3. Touch the password input field.
- 4. Enter a new 4- to 8-digit password and touch
- 5. Touch the password input field.
- 6. Enter the new password again and touch

Use basic call functions

Learn to make or answer calls and use basic call functions.



During a call, your phone automatically locks most keys to prevent accidental inputs. To unlock the keys, press [Shortcuts].

Make a call

- In Idle mode, touch 12 and enter an area code and a phone number.
- 2. Touch of to dial the number.

 For a video call, touch or press or press or press.
- 3. To end the call, touch \mathcal{L} or \times .

Answer a call

- When a call comes in, press [Shortcuts] to unlock and touch Accept.
 For a video call, touch III.
- 2. To end the call, touch & or X.

Adjust the volume

To adjust the volume during a call, press the Volume key up or down.

Use the speakerphone feature

- 2. To switch back to the earpiece, touch ...

Use the headset

By connecting the supplied headset to the phone, you can make and answer calls:

- To redial the last call, press the headset button, and then press again and hold.
- To answer a call, press the headset button.
- To end a call, press and hold the headset button.

Send and view messages

Learn to send and view text (SMS), multimedia (MMS), and email messages.

Send a text or multimedia message

- In Idle mode, touch → → Create message → Message.
- 2. Touch 📟

- 3. Enter a destination number and touch V.
- 4. Touch the text field → **=**
- Enter your message text and touch .
 For sending as a text message, skip to step 8.
 For attaching multimedia, continue with step 6.
- 6. Touch

 → an item type (twice).
- Touch the item you want to add and touch Select.
- 8. Touch 🖪 to send the message.

Send an email

- 2. Touch **=**
- 3. Enter an email address and touch V.

- Enter a subject and touch .
- 6. Touch the text field →
- 7. Enter your email text and touch V.
- 8. Touch send the message.

Enter text

Open the phone and enter text as you would using a computer's keyboard. If the phone is closed, use the onscreen keyboard.

When entering text using the onscreen keyboard, you can change the text input mode:

- Touch Abc to switch between T9, ABC, and Number modes
- Touch sym to switch to Symbol mode.

Enter text in one of the following modes:

View an email

- Touch **■** → **Download**.
- Select an email or a header.
- 4. If you selected a header, touch to view the body of the email.


Add a new contact

- 1. In Idle mode, touch !! and enter a phone number.
- 2. Touch → Add to Phonebook → a memory location (phone or SIM) → New.

- 3. Touch twice a number type, if necessary.
- Enter contact information.
- 5. Touch → Save to add the contact to memory.

Find a contact

- 1. In Idle mode, touch \longrightarrow \rightarrow \bigcirc .
- 2. Enter the first few letters of the name you want to find
- Select the contact's name from the search list.



- call the contact by touching
- edit the contact's information by touching

Use basic camera functions

Learn the basics to capture and view photos and videos.

Capture photos

- In Idle mode, press and hold [to turn on the camera.
- Rotate the phone counter-clockwise to landscape view.
- Aim the lens at the subject and make any adjustments.
- 4. Press [10] [11] to take a photo. The photo is saved automatically.
- 5. Touch the screen or [10], or press [10] to take another photo (step 3).

View photos

In Idle mode, touch \longrightarrow \longrightarrow Images \longrightarrow My photos \longrightarrow a photo file (twice).

Capture videos

- In Idle mode, press and hold [6] [] to turn on the camera.
- 3. Rotate the phone counter-clockwise to landscape view.
- 4. Aim the lens at the subject and make any adjustments.
- 5. Press [] I to start recording.
- 6. Touch or press [la] to stop recording. The video is saved automatically.
- 7. Touch or press or press or record another video (step 4).

View videos

In Idle mode, touch \longrightarrow \longrightarrow \longrightarrow Videos (twice) \longrightarrow My video clips \longrightarrow a video file (twice).


Listen to music



After transferring music files to your phone or memory card,

- 1. In Idle mode, touch \longrightarrow \rightarrow \bigcirc .
- 2. Select a music category → a music file.
- 3. Control playback using the following actions:
 - Touch the blue square on the screen to pause or resume playback.
 - Drag the blue square up or down to adjust volume.



 Drag the blue square left or right to scan backward or forward in a file.



- Touch the arrow on the left side of the screen to open a playlist. Drag a music file into the music player window to play it.
- Touch the arrow on the right side of the screen to open the music player options.

Browse the web

Learn to access and bookmark your favourite web pages.

- 2. Navigate web pages using the following keys:

Use advanced call functions

Learn about your phone's additional calling capabilities.

View and dial missed calls

Your phone will display calls you have missed on the display. To dial the number of a missed call,

- 1. Touch a number or name.
- 2. Scroll to the missed call you want to dial.
- 3. Touch 1 to dial.

Call a recently dialled number

- In Idle mode, touch to display a list of recent numbers
- 2. Scroll to the number you want and touch
 dial.

Hold a call or retrieve a held call

Touch 6 to place a call on hold or touch 6 to retrieve a held call.

Dial a second call

If your network supports this function, you can dial another number during a call:

- 1. Touch 6 to put the first call on hold.
- 2. Touch \$12, enter the second number to dial, and touch .
- 3. Touch 6 to switch between the two calls.
- To end the call on hold, touch ☐ → End → Held call.
- 5. To end the current call, touch $\boldsymbol{\zeta}$ or \boldsymbol{x} .

Answer a second call

If your network supports this function, you can answer a second incoming call:

- Touch Accept to answer the second call.
 The first call is automatically placed on hold.
- 2. Touch 6 to switch between the calls.

Make a multiparty call (conference call)

- Call the first party you want to add to the multiparty call.
- While connected to the first party, call the second party.
 The first party is automatically placed on hold.
- 3. When connected to the second party, touch

 → Join

- Repeat steps 1 and 2 to add more parties (if necessary).
- 5. To end the multiparty call, touch 💪 or 🗙.

Call an international number

- 1. In Idle mode, touch \$24 and touch and hold 0 to insert the + character
- 2. Enter the complete number you want to dial (country code, area code, and phone number), and then touch 7 to dial.

Call a contact from the Phonebook

You can call numbers directly from the Phonebook using stored contacts. ▶ p. 28

- 1. In Idle mode, touch \longrightarrow \rightarrow \bigcirc .
- 2. Scroll to the number you want to dial and touch to dial.

Use advanced Phonebook functions

Learn to create namecards, set speed dial numbers and create groups of contacts.

Create a namecard



You can send your namecard by attaching it to a message or email or transferring it via the Bluetooth wireless feature

Set speed dial numbers

- 1. In Idle mode, touch \longrightarrow \longrightarrow \longrightarrow ...
- 2. Touch twice a number you want to set (2-9).

 Touch twice a contact to assign to the number and a number (if necessary).
 The contact is saved to the speed dial number.



You can now call this contact from the dialling screen by touching and holding the assigned speed dial number.

Create a group of contacts

By creating groups of contacts, you can assign ringtones and caller ID photos to each group or send messages and emails to an entire group. Start by creating a group:

- 2. Touch the text input field.
- 3. Enter a group name and touch V
- 4. Touch Save.

- Touch Ringtone (twice) → a ringtone category → a ringtone → → Select.

- · Re-enter and save the number, if necessary.

The battery does not charge properly or sometimes the phone turns itself off.

- The battery terminals may be dirty. Wipe both gold-coloured contacts with a clean, soft cloth and try charging the battery again.
- If the battery will no longer charge completely, dispose of the old battery properly and replace it with a new battery.
