

safety and usage information

Comply with the following precautions to avoid dangerous or illegal situations and ensure peak performance of your mobile phone.



Keep your phone away from small children and pets

Keep your phone and all accessories out of the reach of small children or animals. Small parts may cause choking or serious injury if swallowed.

Protect your hearing



Listening to a headset at high volumes can damage your hearing. Use only the minimum volume setting necessary to hear your conversation or music.

Install mobile phones and equipment with caution

Ensure that any mobile phones or related equipment installed in your vehicle are securely mounted. Avoid placing your phone and accessories near or in an air bag deployment area. Improperly installed wireless equipment can cause serious injury when air bags inflate rapidly.

Handle and dispose of batteries and chargers with care

- Use only Samsung-approved batteries and chargers specifically designed for your phone. Incompatible batteries and chargers can cause serious injuries or damage to your phone.
- Never dispose of batteries in a fire. Follow all local regulations when disposing used batteries.

- Never place batteries or phones on or in heating devices, such as microwave ovens, stoves, or radiators. Batteries may explode when overheated.
- Never crush or puncture the battery. Avoid exposing the battery to high external pressure, which can lead to an internal short circuit and overheating.

Avoid interference with pacemakers


Maintain a minimum of 15 cm (6 inches) between mobile phones and pacemakers to avoid potential interference, as recommended by manufacturers and the independent research group, Wireless Technology Research. If you have any reason to suspect that your phone is interfering with a pacemaker or other medical device, turn off the phone immediately and contact the manufacturer of the pacemaker or medical device for guidance.

Turn off the phone in potentially explosive environments

Do not use your phone at refuelling points (service stations) or near fuels or chemicals. Turn off your phone whenever directed by warning signs or instructions. Your phone could cause explosions or fire in and around fuel or chemical storage and transfer areas or blasting areas. Do not store or carry flammable liquids, gases, or explosive materials in the same compartment as the phone, its parts, or accessories.

Reduce the risk of repetitive motion injuries

When sending text messages or playing games on your phone, hold the phone with a relaxed grip, press the keys lightly, use special features that reduce the number of keys you have to press (such as templates and predictive text), and take frequent breaks.



Drive safely at all times

Avoid using your phone while driving and obey all regulations that restrict the use of mobile phones while driving. Use hands-free accessories to increase your safety when possible.

Follow all safety warnings and regulations

Comply with any regulations that restrict the use of a mobile phone in a certain area.

Use only Samsung-approved accessories

Using incompatible accessories may damage your phone or cause injury.

Turn off the phone near medical equipment

Your phone can interfere with medical equipment in hospitals or health care facilities. Follow all regulations, posted warnings, and directions from medical personnel.

Turn off the phone or disable the wireless functions when in an aircraft

Your phone can cause interference with aircraft equipment. Follow all airline regulations and turn off your phone or switch to a mode that disables the wireless functions when directed by airline personnel.

Protect batteries and chargers from damage

- Avoid exposing batteries to very cold or very hot temperatures (below 0° C/32° F or above 45° C/ 113° F). Extreme temperatures can reduce the charging capacity and life of your batteries.
- Prevent batteries from contacting metal objects, as this can create a connection between the + and - terminals of your batteries and lead to temporary or permanent battery damage.
- Never use a damaged charger or battery.

Handle your phone carefully and sensibly


 Do not allow your phone to get wet—liquids can cause serious damage. Do not handle your phone with wet hands. Water damage to your phone can void your manufacturer's warranty.

- Avoid using or storing your phone in dusty, dirty areas to prevent damage to moving parts.
- Your phone is a complex electronic device protect it from impacts and rough handling to avoid serious damage.
- Do not paint your phone, as paint can clog moving parts and prevent proper operation.
- Avoid using the phone's camera flash or light close to the eyes of children or animals.
- Your phone and memory cards may be damaged by exposure to magnetic fields. Do not use carrying cases or accessories with magnetic closures or allow your phone to come in contact with magnetic fields for extended periods of time.

Avoid interference with other electronic devices

Your phone emits radio frequency (RF) signals that may interfere with unshielded or improperly shielded electronic equipment, such as pacemakers, hearing aids, medical devices, and other electronic devices in homes or vehicles. Consult the manufacturers of your electronic devices to solve any interference problems you experience.

Use your phone in the normal position

Avoid contact with your phone's internal antenna.

Allow only qualified personnel to service your phone

Allowing unqualified personnel to service your phone may result in damage to your phone and will void your warranty.

Ensure maximum battery and charger life

- Avoid charging batteries for more than a week, as overcharging may shorten battery life.
- Over time, unused batteries will discharge and must be recharged before use.

- Disconnect chargers from power sources when not in use.
- Use batteries only for their intended purpose.

Handle SIM cards and memory cards with care

- Do not remove a card while the phone is transferring or accessing information, as this could result in loss of data and/or damage to the card or phone.
- Protect cards from strong shocks, static electricity, and electrical noise from other devices.
- Frequent writing and erasing will shorten the life span of memory cards.
- Do not touch gold-coloured contacts or terminals with your fingers or metal objects. If dirty, wipe the card with a soft cloth.

Ensure access to emergency services

Emergency calls from your phone may not be possible in some areas or circumstances. Before travelling in remote or undeveloped areas, plan an alternate method of contacting emergency services personnel.

Specific Absorption Rate (SAR) certification information

Your phone conforms to European Union (EU) standards that limit human exposure to radio frequency (RF) energy emitted by radio and telecommunications equipment. These standards prevent the sale of mobile phones that exceed a maximum exposure level (known as the Specific Absorption Rate, or SAR) of 2.0 watts per kilogram of body tissue.

During testing, the maximum SAR recorded for this model was 0.298 watts per kilogram. In normal use, the actual SAR is likely to be much lower, as the phone has been designed to emit only the RF energy necessary to transmit a signal to the nearest base station. By automatically emitting lower levels when possible, your phone reduces your overall exposure to RF energy.



assembling and preparing your mobile phone

Get started by assembling and setting up your mobile phone for its first use.

Install the SIM or USIM card and battery

When you subscribe to a cellular service, you will receive a Subscriber Identity Module, or SIM card, with subscription details, such as your personal identification number (PIN) and optional services. To use UMTS or HSDPA services, you can purchase a Universal Subscriber Identity Module (USIM) card.

To install the SIM or USIM card and battery,

1. Remove the battery cover.





If the phone is on, press and hold [] to turn it off.

2. Insert the SIM or USIM card.



Place the SIM or USIM card in the phone with the gold-coloured contacts facing down.

3. Insert the battery.




4. Replace the battery cover.



Charge the battery

Before using the phone for the first time, you must charge the battery.

 Open the cover to the multifunction lack and plug. the small end of the travel adapter.





Improperly connecting the travel adapter can cause serious damage to the phone. Any damages by misuse are not covered by the warranty.

- Plug the large end of the travel adapter into a power outlet.
- 3. When the battery is fully charged (the IIII icon is no longer moving), unplug the travel adapter from the power outlet.
- 4. Unplug the travel adapter from the phone.
- 5. Close the cover to the multifunction jack.



About the low battery indicator

When your battery is low, the phone will emit a warning tone and a low battery message. The battery icon will also be empty and blinking. If the battery level becomes too low, the phone will automatically power off. Recharge your battery to continue using your phone.

Insert a memory card (optional)

To store additional multimedia files, you must insert a memory card. Your phone accepts microSD[™] memory cards up to 8 GB (depending on memory card manufacturer and type).

- 1. Open the cover to the memory card slot on the side of the phone.
- 2. Insert a memory card with the label side facing up.

3. Push the memory card in the memory card slot until it locks in place.

To remove the memory card, push it gently until it disengages from the phone, and then pull the memory card out of the memory card slot.

Learn how to perform basic operations and use the main features of your mobile phone.

Turn your phone on and off

To turn your phone on,

- 1. Open the phone.
- 2. Press and hold [.
- 3. Enter your PIN and press <**Confirm**> (if necessary).

To turn your phone off, repeat steps 1 and 2 above.

Switch to the Offline profile

By switching to the Offline profile, you can use your phone's non-network services in areas where wireless devices are prohibited, such as aeroplane and hospitals.

To switch to the Offline profile, press <Menu> \rightarrow Settings \rightarrow Phone profiles \rightarrow Offline.



Follow all posted warnings and directions from official personnel when in areas where wireless devices are prohibited.

Access menus

To access your phone's menus,

- 1. Press a softkey for the menu you want.
- 2. Use the navigation key to scroll to a menu or option.
- 3. Press <**Select**>, <**Confirm**>, or [**OK**] to confirm the highlighted option.
- 4. Press <**Back**> to move up one level; Press [**] to return to Idle mode.

Switch applications

Learn to switch to other applications from a menu, without closing the menu screen you are using.

- 1. While using a menu, press []. The following applications are available:
 - Call: open the dialling screen
 - Messages: access the Messages menu

- · Internet: launch the web browser
- Music player: launch the music player
- 2. Scroll to the application and press <Select>.
- 3. When you are finished, scroll to End all? and press <Yes>.

Use the external display

Learn to use the touch screen on the external display with the phone closed.

Adjust the volume of the key tones

In Idle mode, press $[\blacktriangle/ {\bf \nabla}]$ to adjust the key tone volume.

Switch to or from the Silent profile

In Idle mode, press and hold [#] to silence or unsilence your phone.

Change your ringtone

- 1. In Idle mode, press <Menu $> \rightarrow$ Settings \rightarrow Phone profiles.
- 2. Scroll to the profile you are using.
- 3. Press <Options> → Edit → Voice call ringtone or Video call ringtone.
- 4. Scroll left or right to a memory location (if necessary).
- 5. Select a ringtone category \rightarrow a ringtone.
- 6. Press <Options $> \rightarrow$ Save.

To switch to another profile, select it from the list.

Select a wallpaper (Idle mode)

- In Idle mode, press <Menu> → Settings → Display and light settings → Homescreen → Main display.
- 2. Scroll left or right to Image and press [OK].
- 3. Scroll left or right to a memory location (if necessary).
- 4. Select an image category \rightarrow an image.
- 5. Press <Options $> \rightarrow$ Save.

Select a theme for the display (Idle mode)

To create a theme,

 In Idle mode, press <Menu> → Settings → Display and light settings → My theme → Main display → Create theme (Easy) or Create theme (Expert).

- 2. Customise the theme as desired by following the screen.
- 3. When you are finished, enter a name for the theme and press <**Save**>.
- 4. Press < Yes> to apply the theme.
 - If you select the same colour for the entire theme, you may not be able to recognise the display.

After you have created a theme,

- In Idle mode, press <Menu> → Settings → Display and light settings → My theme → Main display → Select theme.
- 2. Select a theme and press <Save>.
- 3. Press <**Yes**> to apply the theme.

Customise the external display

To set a wallpaper,

- In Idle mode, press <Menu> → Settings → Display and light settings → Homescreen → Cover display.
- 2. Scroll left or right to On.
- 3. Scroll down and press [OK].
- 4. Scroll left or right to a memory location (if necessary).
- 5. Select an image category \rightarrow an image.
- 6. Press <Set>.

To change a theme colour,

- In Idle mode, press <Menu> → Settings → Display and light settings → My theme → Cover display.
- 2. Scroll left or right to a colour.
- 3. Press <Save>.

Set menu shortcuts

- In Idle mode, press <Menu> → Settings → Phone settings → Shortcuts.
- 2. Select a key to use as a shortcut.
- 3. Select a menu to assign to the shortcut key.

Lock your phone

- In Idle mode, press <Menu> → Settings → Security → Phone lock.
- 2. Select On.
- 3. Enter a new 4- to 8-digit password and press <Confirm>.
- 4. Enter the new password again and press <Confirm>.

Use basic call functions

Learn to make or answer calls and use basic call functions.

Make a call

- 1. In Idle mode, enter an area code and a phone number.
- Press [-] to dial the number.
 For a video call, press [].
- 3. To end the call, press [.

Answer a call

- When a call comes in, press [-].
 For a video call, press [-] → <Show me>.
- 2. To end the call, press [----].

Adjust the volume

To adjust the volume during a call, press $[\blacktriangle/\nabla]$.

Use the speakerphone feature

- 1. During a call, press [OK] to activate the speaker.
- 2. To switch back to the earpiece, press [OK] again.

Use the headset

By plugging the supplied headset into the multifunction jack, you can make and answer calls:

- To redial the last call, press the headset button, and then press again and hold.
- To answer a call, press the headset button.
- To end a call, press the headset button.

Send and view messages

Learn to send or view text (SMS), multimedia (MMS), or email messages.

Send a text or multimedia message

- In Idle mode, press <Menu> → Messages → Create message → Message.
- 2. Enter a destination number and scroll down.
- Enter your message text. ► p. 27
 For sending as a text message, skip to step 7.
 For attaching multimedia, continue with step 4.
- Press <Options> → Add multimedia and add an item.
- 5. Press <Options $> \rightarrow$ Advanced \rightarrow Add subject.
- 6. Enter a subject.
- 7. Press $\langle \text{Options} \rangle \rightarrow \text{Send}$ to send the message.

Send an email

- In Idle mode, press <Menu> → Messages → Create message → Email.
- 2. Enter an email address and scroll down.
- 3. Enter a subject and scroll down.
- 4. Enter your email text.
- Press <Options> → Attach multimedia or Attach organiser and attach a file (if necessary).
- 6. Press ${<}\textsc{Options}{>} \rightarrow \textsc{Send}$ to send the email.

Enter text

When entering text, you can change the text input mode:

- Press and hold [*] to switch between T9 and ABC modes.
- Press [*] to change case or switch to Number mode.

• Press and hold [#] to switch to Symbol mode. Enter text in one of the following modes:

Mode	Function
ABC	Press the appropriate alphanumeric key until the character you want appears on the display.
Т9	 Press the appropriate alphanumeric keys to enter an entire word. When the word displays correctly, press [#] to insert a space. If the correct word does not display, press [0] to select an alternate word.
Number	Press the appropriate alphanumeric key to enter a number.
Symbol	Press the appropriate alphanumeric key to select a symbol.

View text or multimedia messages

- 1. In Idle mode, press <Menu $> \rightarrow$ Messages \rightarrow Inbox.
- 2. Select a text or multimedia message.

View an email

- 1. In Idle mode, press <Menu $> \rightarrow$ Messages \rightarrow Email inbox.
- 2. Press <Options $> \rightarrow$ Download.
- 3. Select an email or a header.
- 4. If you selected a header, press <**Options** $> \rightarrow$ **Retrieve** to view the body of the email.

Add and find contacts

Learn the basics of using the Phonebook feature.

Add a new contact

- 1. In Idle mode, enter a phone number and press <**Options**>.
- 2. Select Add to Phonebook \rightarrow a memory location (phone or SIM) \rightarrow New.
- 3. Select a number type (if necessary).
- 4. Enter contact information.
- Press [OK], or press <Options> → Save to add the contact to memory.

Find a contact

- In Idle mode, press < Menu> → Phonebook.
 You can also press < Phonebook> in Idle mode.
- 2. Enter the first few letters of the name you want to find.
- 3. Select the contact's name from the search list.
- Once you have found a contact, you can:
 - call the contact by pressing [----]
 - edit the contact information by pressing $<\!Options\!> \rightarrow Edit$

Use basic camera functions

Learn the basics to capture and view photos and videos.

Capture photos

- From the external display, touch ↓ → ⑦ to turn on the camera. You can also press and hold [16].
- 2. Rotate the phone anti-clockwise to landscape view.
- 3. Aim the lens at the subject and make any adjustments:
 - Touch 🔀 to adjust the exposure
 - Touch 🔍 to zoom
- Press [1] to take a photo. The photo is saved automatically.
- 5. Touch ᅿ to take another photo (step 3).

Capture self portrait

- 1. In Idle mode, press and hold [1] to turn on the camera.
- 2. Aim the lens at yourself and make any adjustments.
- 3. Press [OK] or [1] to take a photo. The photo is saved automatically.
- 4. Press <>> or [1] to take another photo (step 2).

View photos

From the external display, touch $1 \rightarrow \bigotimes_{a} \rightarrow a$ photo file.

In Idle mode, press <Menu> \rightarrow My files \rightarrow Images \rightarrow a photo file.

Capture videos

- 1. From the external display, touch $\rightarrow \textcircled{red}$ to turn on the camera.
- 2. Rotate the phone anti-clockwise to landscape view.
- 3. Touch $\mathbb{M} \to \mathbb{P}$ to switch to Recording mode.
- 4. Aim the lens at the subject and make any adjustments:
 - Touch 🔀 to adjust the exposure
 - Touch Q to zoom
- 5. Press [1] to start recording.
- Touch
 or press [
 io] to stop recording.
 The video is saved automatically.
- 7. Touch 👈 to record another video (step 4).

View videos

From the external display, touch $i \to \bigotimes_{\mathbb{D}} \to \bigotimes_{\mathbb{D}} \to a$ video file.

In Idle mode, press <Menu> \rightarrow My files \rightarrow Videos \rightarrow a video file.

Listen to music

Learn how to listen to music via the music player or $\ensuremath{\mathsf{FM}}$ radio.

Listen to the FM radio

Start the FM radio on the main display

- 1. Plug the supplied headset into the phone's multifunction jack.
- 2. In Idle mode, press $\langle Menu \rangle \rightarrow Multimedia \rightarrow FM radio.$

 Press < Yes> to start automatic tuning. The radio scans and saves available stations automatically.



- The first time you access the FM radio, you will be prompted to start automatic tuning.
- 4. Scroll left or right to a radio station.
- 5. To turn off the FM radio, press [OK].

Start the FM radio on the external display

- 1. Plug the supplied headset into the phone's multifunction jack.
- 2. From the external display, touch $\bullet \rightarrow \bigcirc$.


