

Assembling your phone

Insert the SIM card and attach the battery to use your phone.


SIM card

When you register as a subscriber with a network operator, you get a SIM (Subscriber Identity Module) card. The SIM card contains a computer chip that keeps track of your phone number, the services included in your subscription, and your phonebook information, among other things.

Ň

Save contacts to your SIM card before you remove it from another phone. Contacts may have been saved in the phone memory \Rightarrow 14 Contacts.

To insert the SIM card and charge the battery



- Slide the cover open and lift it off.
- 2 Insert the SIM card. Make sure the SIM card is placed under the silvery holders.
- Place the battery in the phone with the label side up and the connectors facing each other.
- 4 Place the cover on the phone and slide it into place.
- 5 Connect the charger to the phone. The symbol on the charger plug must face upwards.
- 6 It may take 30 minutes for the battery icon to appear.
- 7 Wait approximately 2.5 hours or until the battery icon indicates that the battery is fully charged. For an indication of charging, press to activate the screen.
- 8 Remove the charger by pulling it out.
- Some functions use more battery power than others and may cause a need for more frequent re-charging. However talk-time or standby time may become noticeably shorter due to wear and you may have to replace your battery. Only use approved batteries from Sony Ericsson ➡ 60 Battery.

PIN

You may need a PIN (Personal Identification Number) from your network operator to activate the services in your phone. Each PIN digit appears as *, unless it starts with emergency number digits, for example 112 or 911. This is so that you can see and call an emergency number without entering a PIN \Rightarrow 13 Emergency calls. Press \bigcirc to correct mistakes.

If you enter the wrong PIN three times in a row, the SIM card is blocked \Rightarrow 51 SIM card lock.

To turn the phone on and off



- 1 Press and hold (1) to turn on or off.
- 2 Enter your SIM card PIN, if you have one.
- 3 At first start-up, select the language for phone menus.
- 4 Select Yes if you want the setup wizard to help you with instructions and tips or No. The setup wizard is also available in the menu system,
 ▶ Settings ▶ General ▶ Setup wizard.
- If you press ⁽¹) shortly when the phone is on, the shut down menu will be displayed ➡ 9 Shut down menu.

To make and receive calls

Enter the area code and phone number \blacktriangleright Call to make the call. \blacktriangleright End call to end the call. When the phone rings \blacktriangleright Answer to answer the call.

Navigating the menus

The main menus are shown as icons on the desktop. Some submenus include tabs that appear on the screen.



• Press the navigation key in the centre or in a direction:

Press (a) to go to the desktop or to select items. Press (a), (b), (b) or (c) to move through menus and tabs.

- Press (1) to go back one level in the menus or to end a function or application.
 Press and hold (1) to return to standby.
- Press (=) to select the options shown immediately above these keys on the screen.
- Press 💿 to delete items.

Shortcuts

From standby, you can use (0), (0), (0), (0) to go directly to a function.

To create a standby shortcut

- 2 Scroll to a function to create a shortcut to▶ Shortcut.

To edit a standby shortcut

- I ► Settings ► General ► Shortcuts and select an existing shortcut you want to edit ► Edit.
- 2 Scroll to and select a function ► Shortcut.

Help texts

Help texts exist in your phone. To access help texts ▶ Info.

More options

Activity menu

Open the activity menu from almost anywhere in the phone to view and handle new events, and access bookmarks and shortcuts.

To open and close the activity menu

Press (P). Use () or () to scroll between the tabs.

Activity menu tabs

- New events such as missed calls and messages.
- My shortcuts applications that are running in the background and your shortcuts. You can add, delete and change the order of shortcuts.
- · Bookmarks your Internet bookmarks.
- If you want new events to appear as pop-up text instead of in the activity menu, ▶ Settings
 ▶ General ▶ New events ▶ Popup.

Shut down menu

Open the shut down menu from almost anywhere in the phone. You can use it to shut down the phone, turn on silent or activate a profile. For more information about profiles \Rightarrow 48 Profiles.

To open and close the shut down menu

Press (1) and select an option from the list.

File manager

Items are saved in folders. Create subfolders to move items to. Access camera pictures by selecting the desktop icon Camera pictures. Unrecognized items are saved in the Other folder.

To manage items and folders

- 1 ► File manager and select a folder.
- 2 Scroll to an item ► More ► Manage files ► Move.
- 3 Select the folder you want to move the item to, or New folder and name the folder ► OK.

To select several items

- 1 ► File manager and select an item ► More ► Mark, select Mark several or Mark all.
- 2 Scroll and select more items by pressing Mark or Unmark.

To check memory status

► File manager ► More ► Memory status.

File information

View information for items. Copyright protected items cannot be copied or sent.

Languages

Select the language for phone menus and the languages that you may use when writing.

To change the phone language

- ▶ Settings ▶ General ▶ Language
 ▶ Phone language, select a language.
- From standby, press:

 0000 Image for English or

 8888 Image for Automatic language (SIM dependent).

To select writing languages

- 1 ► Settings ► General ► Language ► Writing language
- 2 Scroll and select languages by pressing Mark or Unmark. ► Save to exit the menu.

To switch between writing languages

Press and hold (#-) when writing.

Entering letters and characters

To enter letters using multitap text input

- Press <a>2 <a>9 until the desired character appears.
- To shift between capitals and lower case letters, press (****).
- To enter numbers, press and hold \bigcirc + \bigcirc .
- To add a space, press (#_).

- For the most common punctuation marks, press ①.
- To enter the + sign, press \bigcirc +).
- To change input method, press and hold (***/*).

T9™ Text Input

The T9™ Text Input method uses a built-in dictionary to recognize the most commonly used word for each sequence of key presses. This way, you press each key only once, even if the letter you want is not the first letter on the key.

To enter letters using T9™ Text Input

- **1** ► Messaging ► Write new ► Text message.
- 2 For example, if you want to write the word "Jane", press 5, 2, 6, 3.
- 3 If the word shown is the one you want, press (#-) to accept and add a space. To accept a word without adding a space, press (...). If the word shown is not the one you want, press (...) or (...) repeatedly to view alternative words. Accept a word and add a space by pressing (#-).
- 4 Continue writing your message. To enter a full stop or other punctuation marks, press ☐ and then (③) or (◎) repeatedly. Accept and add a space by pressing (#→).

To add words to the T9 Text Input dictionary

- 1 While entering letters ► More ► Spell word.
- 2 Edit the word by using multitap input. Navigate between the letters with (a) and (b). To delete a character, press (c). To delete the entire word, press and hold (c).
- 3 When you have edited the word ► Insert. The word is added to the T9 Text Input dictionary. Next time you enter this word using T9 Text Input, it will appear as one of the alternative words.

To select another writing method

Before, or while entering letters, press and hold (*a) to select another writing method.



Changing Style-up[™] covers

Some kits may include additional Style-upTM covers. Follow these instructions to change covers.


To change the front cover



- 1 Insert your thumbnail into the groove on the bottom of the phone.
- **2** Gently lift the front cover away from the phone.
- 3 Align the cover with the top of the phone as shown.
- 4 Snap the cover into place by gently pushing down until it is lying flat.

Calling

To change the battery cover



- 1 Apply pressure with the heel of one hand while pushing away with the thumb of your other hand. You may need to apply significant pressure the first time you remove the battery cover.
- 2 Locate the notches along each side of the phone. Using the notches as a guide, slide the battery cover upward applying pressure with the heel of your hand until it clicks in place.

Calling

Calls, contacts, voicemail, voice control. call options.

Making and receiving calls

Turn on the phone and make sure that you are within range of a network to make and receive calls ➡ 7 To turn the phone on and off. If your subscription includes the Calling Line Identification service and the caller's number is identified, the number is displayed. If the number is saved in Contacts, the name, number, and picture (if defined) are displayed. If the number is a restricted number. Withheld is displayed.

To make a call

Enter the phone number (with international country code and area code, if applicable) ► Call to make the call \triangleright End call to end the call

To redial a number

If the connection failed, Retry? is displayed ► Yes.

 $\dot{\Box}$ Do not hold the phone to your ear while waiting. When a call connects, the phone gives a loud signal.

To answer or reject a call

► Answer to answer a call. ► Busy to reject a call.

To change the ear speaker volume

During a call, press O or O to increase or decrease the volume.

To select more options during a call

Press () and select an option.

To turn off the microphone

Press and hold (C). To resume, press and hold (C) again.

To use the loudspeaker during a voice call

More ► Turn on speaker or ► Turn off speaker.

Missed calls

When you have missed a call, it appears in the Activity menu if New events is set to Activity menu.

► Call to call the missed number.

If New events is set to Popup, Missed calls: appears. ► Yes to view the missed calls in the call list now or ► No to do it later. To change the Activity menu settings ➡ 8 Activity menu.

Call list

Information about the last calls is saved in the call list.

To call a number from the call list

- 1 ► Calls from standby and select a tab.
- 2 Scroll to the name or number you want to call ▶ Call.

To add a call list number to contacts

- 1 ► Calls from standby and select a tab.
- 2 Scroll to the number you want to add ► More ► Save number.
- Select New contact to create a new contact, or an existing contact to add the number to.

Emergency calls

Your phone supports the international emergency numbers, for example 112 and 911. This means that these numbers can normally be used to make an emergency call in any country, with or without a SIM card inserted, if a GSM network is in range.

In some countries, other emergency numbers may also be promoted. Your network operator may have saved additional local emergency numbers on the SIM card.

Calling

To make an emergency call

Enter, for example, $112 \triangleright Call$.

To view your local emergency numbers

- ► Contacts ► Options ► Special numbers
- ► Emergency nos.

Contacts

Choose your default contacts from one of the following:

- Phone contacts detailed information saved in the phone memory.
- SIM contacts names and numbers only on the SIM card.

To select default contacts

- Contacts ► Options ► Advanced
 Default contacts.
- 2 Select Phone contacts or SIM contacts.

To check the memory status

- ► Contacts ► Options ► Advanced ► Memory status.
- The number of entries you can save depends on the amount of memory available in the phone or on the SIM card.

Managing contacts

Save numbers, add pictures, ringtones and personal information.

To add a contact

- 1 ► Contacts ► New contact ► Add.
- **2** Enter the name \triangleright OK.
- **3** Enter the number \triangleright OK.
- 4 For phone contacts only, select a number type. Scroll between the tabs and select fields to enter more information. Except in phone numbers, you can enter symbols such as @ ► More
 ► Add symbol and select the symbol ► Insert.
- 5 When you have entered all information \triangleright Save.

It is recommended to enter the + sign and country code with all numbers.

To add a picture or a ringtone to a contact

- Contacts and select the contact you want to add a picture or personal ringtone to ► More
 Edit contact.
- 2 Select the relevant tab and then select a Picture or Ringtone ► Add. Select a picture or sound and ► Save.

To add your own business card

▶ Contacts ▶ Options ▶ My business card and enter the information for your business card ▶ Save.

To send your business card

- ► Contacts ► Options ► My business card
- Send my card and select transfer method.

To call a phone contact

- Select Contacts and scroll to the contact you want to call, or enter the first letters of the contact.
- 2 Use O or O to select a number \blacktriangleright Call.

To call a SIM contact

- If SIM contacts is default ► Contacts and select the name and number from the list ► Call.
- If Phone contacts is default ► Contacts ► Options
 ► SIM contacts and select the name and number
 - ► Call.

To copy names and numbers to the SIM card

- 1 ► Contacts ► Options ► Advanced ► Copy to SIM.
- 2 Select Copy all or Copy a number.
- When copying all contacts from the phone to the SIM card, all existing SIM card information is replaced.

To copy SIM contacts to phone contacts

- 1 ► Contacts ► Options ► Advanced ► Copy from SIM.
- 2 Select Copy all or Copy a number.

To always save to the SIM card

- 1 ► Contacts ► Options ► Advanced ► Auto save on SIM.
- 2 Select On.

To send contacts

- To send a selected contact, ► More ► Send contact and select a transfer method.
- To send all contacts, ► Contacts ► Options
 ► Advanced ► Send all contacts.

To edit a phone contact

- Contacts and select a contact ► More
 Edit contact.
- 2 Scroll to the relevant tab and edit the information ► Save.

Calling

To edit a SIM contact

- If SIM contacts is default ► Contacts. If Phone contacts is default ► Contacts ► Options ► SIM contacts.
- 2 Select the name and number you want to edit.
- 3 ► More ► Edit contact and edit the name and number.

To delete a contact

► Contacts select a contact, press .

To delete all contacts

► Contacts ► Options ► Advanced ► Delete all contacts ► Yes and ► Yes. Names and numbers on the SIM card are not deleted.

To set the default item for a contact

- Contacts and scroll to a contact ► More
 Default number.
- 2 Select the phone number, email address or Web address that you want to be displayed first for the contact.

For more information, ➡ 42 Synchronizing.

Speed dialling

Save phone numbers that you want to reach easily in positions 1-9 in your phone.

To set or replace speed dialling numbers

- 1 ► Contacts ► Options ► Speed dial.
- 2 Scroll to the position ► Add or ► Replace and select a phone number.

To speed dial

From standby, enter a speed dial number $1-9 \triangleright Call$.

Voicemail

If your subscription includes an answering service, callers can leave a voice message when you cannot answer a call.

To save your voicemail number

Press and hold \bigcirc \triangleright Yes enter the number \triangleright OK. You can get the number from your service provider.

To call your voicemail service

If you have saved your voice mail number, press and hold \bigcirc .

To check your voicemail number

▶ Messaging ▶ Settings ▶ Voicemail number.

Voice control

Manage calls with your voice and a handsfree. Create voice commands to voice dial, answer or reject calls. Voice commands cannot be saved on the SIM card.

To activate voice dialling and record names

- Settings ► General ► Voice control
 Voice dialling ► Activate ► Yes ► New voice. Select a contact.
- 2 Select the phone number to add the voice command to. Record a voice command such as "John mobile".
- 3 Instructions appear. Lift the phone to your ear, wait for the tone and say the command that you want to record. The voice command is played back to you.
- 4 If the recording is ok select Yes, if not No and record again. You can change the recording later by selecting Edit names or New voice ► Add.

Turn the Media player off before using voice dialling. Scroll to the Media player and press (5) to turn off.

To activate voice answering and record voice answer commands

- Settings ► General ► Voice control
 Voice answer ► Activate.
- 2 Instructions appear. ► Continue and lift the phone to your ear. Wait for the tone and say "Answer", or another word. If the recording is ok ► Yes. If not ► No and record again.
- **3** Say "Busy", or another word \triangleright Yes.

Follow the instructions that appear, save when finished.

You cannot use voice answering if you have selected an MP3 file as ringtone.

The magic word

Record and use a voice command as a magic word to activate voice control without pressing any keys. The magic word can only be used with a handsfree or a BluetoothTM headset.

To activate and record the magic word

- Settings ► General ► Voice control
 Magic word ► Activate.
- **2** Follow the instructions that appear, save when finished.

Calling

To use voice dialling

- Without a handsfree: from standby, press and hold Calls and say the name.
- With a handsfree: say your magic word or press the call handling button. Wait for the tone and say the name you recorded earlier, for example "John mobile", the call connects.

To answer or reject a call

When the phone rings, say "Answer" or say "Busy".

Play caller name

Hear your recorded voice commands for contacts names when receiving a call.

To turn the caller name on or off

- ► Settings ► General ► Voice control
- ▶ Play caller name.

To edit your voice commands

► Contacts select the contact ► More ► Edit contact. Scroll to the relevant tab and edit your voice command.

Diverting calls

Divert calls, for example, to an answering service.

When the Restrict calls function is activated, some Divert calls options are not available.

To activate a call divert

- **1** ► Settings ► Calls ► Divert calls.
- 2 Select a call type and divert option ► Activate.
- Enter a phone number to divert your calls to, or
 ▶ Look up to find a contact ▶ OK.

To deactivate a call divert

Scroll to the divert option ► Deactivate.

To check all divert options

▶ Settings ▶ Calls ▶ Divert calls ▶ Check all.

More than one call

Handle more than one call simultaneously.

Call waiting service

When activated, you hear a beep if you receive a second call.

To activate the call waiting service

Settings ► Calls ► Manage calls ► Call waiting
 Activate ► Select.

To make a second call

- 1 ► More ► Hold to hold the ongoing call.
- **2** Enter the number to call \triangleright Call.

Receiving a second call

When you receive a second call, select one of the following options:

- To answer and put the ongoing call on hold, ► Answer.
- To reject and continue the ongoing call, ► Busy.
- To answer and end the ongoing call, ▶ Replace active call.

Handling two calls

If you have calls ongoing and on hold, select one of the following options:

- To switch between the two calls, ► More ► Switch.
- To join the two calls, ► More ► Join calls.
- To connect the two calls, ► More ► Transfer call. You are disconnected from both calls.
- To retrieve the held call, ► End call ► Yes.
- To end both calls, \blacktriangleright End call \blacktriangleright No.

You cannot answer a third call without ending one of the first two calls or joining them into a conference call.

Conference calls

Start a conference call by joining an ongoing call and a call on hold. You then put the conference on hold to call and add up to five participants or just to make another call.

To join the two calls into a conference call

► More ► Join calls.

To add a new participant

- **1** \blacktriangleright More \blacktriangleright Hold to put the joined calls on hold.
- **2** \blacktriangleright More \blacktriangleright Add call and call the next person.
- 3 ► More ► Join calls.
- 4 Repeat the procedure to include more participants.

To release a participant

▶ More ▶ Release part. and select the participant.

To have a private conversation

- 1 ► More ► Talk to and select the participant.
- 2 ► More ► Join calls to resume the conference call.

Two voice lines

Make separate calls with different phone numbers if your subscription supports alternate line service.

To select a line for outgoing calls

▶ Settings ▶ Calls and select line 1 or 2.

Calling

To change the name of a line

► Settings ► Display ► Edit line names and select the line to edit.

My numbers

View, add and edit your own phone numbers.

To check your phone numbers

- ► Contacts ► Options ► Special numbers
- ▶ My numbers and select one of the options.

Accept calls

Receive calls only from certain phone numbers.

To add numbers to the accepted callers list

- 1 ► Settings ► Calls ► Manage calls ► Accept calls ► Only from list.
- **2** \blacktriangleright Edit \blacktriangleright New \blacktriangleright Add. Select a contact.

To accept all calls

▶ Settings ▶ Calls ▶ Manage calls ▶ Accept calls
 ▶ All callers.

Restricted dialling

Restrict outgoing and incoming calls when at home or abroad. You need a password from your service provider.

If you divert incoming calls, you cannot activate some Restrict calls options.

The following calls can be restricted:

- All outgoing all outgoing calls.
- Outgoing intl all outgoing international calls.
- Outgoing intl roam. all outgoing international calls except to your home country.
- All incoming all incoming calls.
- Inc. when roaming all incoming calls when you are abroad (when roaming).

To activate or deactivate a call restriction

- 1 ► Settings ► Calls ► Manage calls ► Restrict calls and select an option.
- 2 Select Activate or Deactivate and enter your password ► OK.

Fixed dialling

The fixed dialling function allows calls to be made only to certain numbers saved on the SIM card. The fixed numbers are protected by your PIN2.

You can still call the international emergency numbers even when the fixed dialling function is activated.

Partial numbers can be saved. For example, saving 0123456 allows calls to be made to all numbers starting with 0123456.

When fixed dialling is activated, you cannot view or manage any phone numbers saved on the SIM card.

To activate or deactivate fixed dialling

- 1 ► Contacts ► Options ► Special numbers ► Fixed dialling.
- 2 Select Activate or Deactivate.
- 3 Enter your PIN2 ► OK and then ► OK again to confirm.

To save a fixed number

- ► Contacts ► Options ► Special numbers
- ► Fixed dialling ► Fixed numbers ► New number and enter the information.

Additional calling functions

Tone signals

Use telephone banking services or control an answering machine by sending tone signals during a call.

- To send the tones, press $(\Box +) (\Box)$, $(\underline{*}_{a/b})$ or $(\underline{#}_{-})$.
- To clear the screen after the call is finished, press C.
- To turn the tones on or off during a call, press () in standby and select Disable tones or Enable tones.

Notepad

Note down a phone number during a call. When you end the call, the number remains on the screen to call or save in the phonebook.

Showing or hiding your phone number

If your subscription supports the Calling Line Identification Restriction, you can hide your number when making a call.

To always show or hide your phone number

- 1 ► Settings ► Calls ► Show/hide my no.
- 2 Select Show number, Hide number or Network default.

Calling

Transferring sound when using a Bluetooth™ handsfree

Transfer the sound for calls when using a Bluetooth handsfree. You can also transfer the sound for calls using the keypad.

To transfer sound when using a handsfree

During a call, \blacktriangleright More \blacktriangleright Transfer sound and select a device.

Directing sound

Direct sound when answering a call with the phone keypad or the handsfree button.

To direct sound when answering a call with a handsfree

- 1 ► Settings ► Connectivity ► Bluetooth ► Handsfree ► Incoming call.
- 2 Select In phone to direct to the phone or In handsfree to direct to the handsfree.

Call time

During a call, the duration of the call is shown. You can check the duration of your last call, outgoing calls and the total time.

To check the call time

▶ Settings ▶ Calls ▶ Time & cost ▶ Call timers. If you want to reset ▶ More and select Reset total or Reset outgoing.

Messaging

Text messaging, picture messaging, voice messaging, email.

Your phone supports various messaging services. Contact your service provider about the services you can use or visit www.SonyEricsson.com/support.

Text messaging (SMS)

Text messages can contain pictures, animations, melodies and sound effects. You can create and use templates for your messages.

Before you start

A service centre number is provided by your network operator to send and receive text messages. It may already be set on the SIM card or you can add the number yourself.

To set a service centre number

- Messaging > Settings > Text message
 Service centre. The number is shown if it is saved on the SIM card
- 2 If there is no number ► New ServiceCentre and enter the number, including the international "+" sign and country code ► Save.

To write and send a text message or save a draft

- 1 ► Messaging ► Write new ► Text message.
- 2 Write your message. To insert an item in your message, ► More ► Add item.
- 3 ► Continue. (To save the message for later, press () and ► Yes to save in Drafts.)
- 4 Select Enter phone no. and enter the recipient's number, or Contacts look-up to find a number or a group, or select from the last used recipients list.
- 5 To change the default options for your message, for example request a read report, ► More





SIM card lock

The SIM card lock protects your subscription, but not your phone itself, from unauthorized use. If you change SIM cards, the phone still works with the new SIM card.

Most SIM cards are locked at the time of purchase. If the SIM card lock is on, you have to enter a PIN (Personal Identity Number) every time you turn on your phone.

If you enter your PIN incorrectly three times in a row, the SIM card is blocked. This is indicated by the message **PIN blocked**. To unblock it, you need to enter your PUK (Personal Unblocking Key). Your PIN and PUK are supplied by your network operator. You can edit your PIN and select a new four- to eight-digit PIN.

If the message Codes do not match appears when you edit your PIN, you entered the new PIN incorrectly. If the message Wrong PIN appears, followed by Old PIN:, you entered your old PIN incorrectly.

To unblock your SIM card

- 2 Enter a new four- to eight-digit PIN ► OK.

Recharge the battery $\Rightarrow 6$ To insert the SIM card and charge the battery or $\Rightarrow 60$ Battery.

Charging a non Sony Ericsson battery

If the battery you are using is not a Sony Ericsson approved battery $\Rightarrow 60$ Battery.

The wrong menu language is shown

If the wrong language is shown, you can select from standby:

- Press 1000 (1) for English

Master reset

Reset the phone by deleting the changes that you have made to settings, and the content that you have added or edited.

- If you select **Reset settings**, changed settings are deleted.

No network

There is no network within range or the received signal is too weak. You have to move to get a signal that is strong enough.

Wrong PIN/Wrong PIN2

You have entered your PIN or PIN2 incorrectly. Enter the correct PIN or PIN2 \triangleright Yes \Rightarrow 51 SIM card lock.

Codes do not match

The two codes that you have entered do not match. When you want to change a security code (for example your PIN) you have to confirm the new code by entering exactly the same code again. \Rightarrow 51 SIM card lock.

PIN blocked/PIN2 blocked

You have entered your PIN or PIN2 incorrectly three times in a row. To unblock **➡** 51 SIM card lock.

PUK blocked

You entered your personal unblocking key code (PUK) incorrectly 10 times in a row. Contact your operator.

Phone locked

The phone is locked. To unlock the phone 52 Phone lock.

Phone lock code

The phone lock code is required. Your phone comes with the phone lock code, 0000. You can change it to any four- to eight-digit code \Rightarrow 52 Phone lock.

To reduce risk of electric shock, unplug the unit from any power source before attempting to clean it. The AC power adapter must not be used outdoors or in damp areas. Never alter the cord or plug. If the plug will not fit into the outlet, have a proper outlet installed by a qualified electrician.

Use only Sony Ericsson branded original chargers intended for use with your mobile phone. Other chargers may not be designed to the same safety and performance standards.

Battery

We recommend that you fully charge the battery before you use your mobile phone for the first time. A new battery or one that has not been used for a long time could have reduced capacity the first few times it is used. The battery can only be charged in temperatures between $+5^{\circ}C$ ($+41^{\circ}F$) and $+45^{\circ}C$ ($+113^{\circ}F$).

Use only Sony Ericsson branded original batteries intended for use with your mobile phone. Using other batteries and chargers could be dangerous.

The talk and standby times depend on several different conditions such as signal strength, operating temperature, application usage patterns, features selected and voice or data transmissions when using the mobile phone.

Turn off your mobile phone before removing the battery. Do not allow the battery to be put into the mouth. Battery electrolytes may be toxic if swallowed. Do not let the metal contacts on the battery touch another metal object. This could short-circuit and damage the battery. Use the battery for the intended purpose only.

Personal medical devices

Mobile phones may affect the operation of cardiac pacemakers and other implanted equipment. Please avoid placing the mobile phone over the pacemaker, e.g. in your breast pocket. When using the mobile phone, place it at the ear opposite the pacemaker. If a minimum distance of 15 cm (6 inches) is kept between the mobile phone and the pacemaker, the risk of interference is limited. If you have any reason to suspect that interference is taking place, immediately turn off your mobile phone. Contact your cardiologist for more information. Driving

Please note that because of possible interference to electronic equipment, some vehicle manufacturers forbid the use of mobile phones in their vehicles unless a handsfree kit with an external antenna supports the installation.

Always give full attention to driving and pull off the road and park before making or answering a call if driving conditions so require.

Emergency calls

Mobile phones operate using radio signals, which cannot guarantee connection under all conditions. Therefore you should never rely solely upon any mobile phone for essential communications (e.g. medical emergencies).

Emergency calls may not be possible in all areas, on all cellular networks, or when certain network services and/or mobile phone features are in use. Check with your local service provider.

Antenna

This phone contains a built in antenna. Use of antenna devices not marketed by Sony Ericsson specifically for this model could damage your mobile phone, reduce performance, and produce SAR levels above the established limits (see below).

Efficient use

Hold your mobile phone as you would any other phone. Do not cover the top of the phone when in use, as this affects call quality and may cause the phone to operate at a higher power level than needed, thus shortening talk and standby times.

Radio frequency (RF) exposure and SAR

Your mobile phone is a low-power radio transmitter and receiver. When it is turned on, it emits low levels of radio frequency energy (also known as radio waves or radio frequency fields).

Governments around the world have adopted comprehensive international safety guidelines, developed by scientific organizations, e.g. ICNIRP (International Commission on Non-Ionizing Radiation Protection) and IEEE (The institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers Inc.) through periodic and thorough evaluation of scientific studies. These guidelines establish permitted levels of radio wave exposure for the general population.
