


# NV15 User Manual

Thank you for buying a Samsung camera.

This manual will guide you through using the camera, including capturing images, downloading images and using the application software. Please read this manual carefully before using your new camera.

### Instructions

Use this camera in the following order.



### Getting to know your camera

Thank you for buying a Samsung Digital Camera.

- Prior to using this camera, please read the user manual thoroughly.
- When you require After Sales service, please bring the camera and the cause of the camera malfunction (such as battery, Memory card etc.) to the A/S centre.
- Please check that the camera is operating properly before you intend to use it (e.g. for a trip or an important event) to avoid disappointment. Samsung takes no responsibility for any loss or damages that may result from camera malfunction.
- Keep this manual in a safe place.
- If you use a card reader to copy the images on the memory card to your PC, the
  images could be damaged. When transferring the images taken with the camera
  to your PC, be sure to use the supplied USB cable to connect the camera to
  your PC. Please note that the manufacturer accepts no responsibility for loss or
  damage of images on the memory card due to the use of a card reader.
- The contents and illustrations of this manual are subject to change without prior notice for upgrading the camera functions.
- \* Microsoft, Windows and Windows logo are registered trademarks of Microsoft Corporation incorporated in the United States and/or other countries.
- \* All brand and product names appearing in this manual are registered trademarks of their respective companies.

### Danger

DANGER indicates an imminently hazardous situation which, if not avoided, will result in death or serious injury.

- Do not attempt to modify this camera in any way. To do so may result in fire, injury, electric shock or severe damage to you or your camera. Internal inspection, maintenance and repairs should only be carried out by your dealer or Samsung Carnera Service centre.
- Please do not use this product in close proximity to flammable or explosive gases, as this could increase the risk of explosion.
- Should any form of liquid or a foreign object enter the camera, do not use it.
   Switch off the camera, and then disconnect the power source. You must contact your dealer or Samsung Camera Service centre. Do not continue to use the camera as this may cause a fire or electric shock.
- Do not insert or drop metallic or inflammable foreign objects into the camera through access points e.g. the memory card slot and battery chamber. This may cause a fire or electric shock.
- Do not operate this camera with wet hands. This could pose a risk of electric shock.

### Warning

WARNING indicates a potentially hazardous situation which, if not avoided, could result in death or serious injury.

- Do not use the flash in close proximity to people or animals. Positioning the flash too close to your subject's eyes may cause eyesight damage.
- For safety reasons keep this product and accessories out of reach of children or animals to prevent accidents e.g..
  - Swallowing battery or small camera accessories. If an accident should occur, please consult a doctor immediately.
  - There is the possibility of injury from the camera's moving parts.
- Battery and camera may become hot during prolonged use and it may result in camera malfunction. Should this be the case, let the camera sit idle for a few minutes to allow it time to cool.
- Do not leave this camera in places subject to extremely high temperatures, such as a sealed vehicle, direct sunlight or other places of extreme variances in temperature. Exposure to extreme temperatures may adversely affect the camera's internal components and could cause a fire.
- When in use, do not cover the camera or Charger. This may cause heat to build
  up and distort the camera body or cause a fire. Always use the camera and its
  accessories in a well-ventilated area.

### Caution

CAUTION indicates a potentially hazardous situation which, if not avoided, may result in a minor or moderate injury.

- Leaking, overheating, or damaged battery could result in fire or injury.
  - Use battery with the correct specification for the camera.
  - Do not short circuit, heat or dispose of battery in fire.
  - Do not insert the battery with the polarities reversed.
- Remove the battery when not planning to use the camera for a long period of time. Otherwise the battery may leak corrosive electrolyte and permanently damage the camera's components.
- Do not fire the flash while it is in contact with hands or objects. Do not touch the flash after using it continuously. It may cause burns.
- Do not move the camera while it is switched on when you are using the AC
  Charger. After use, always switch off the camera before unplugging the cable
  from the wall socket. Then make sure that any connector cords or cables to other
  devices are disconnected before moving the camera. Failure to do so may
  damage the cords or cables and cause a fire or electric shock.
- Take care not to touch the lens or lens cover to avoid taking an unclear image and possibly causing camera malfunction.
- Avoid obstructing the lens or the flash when you capture an image.
- Before inserting any cables or AC adapter, check the directions and do not insert by force. It may cause breakage of cable or camera.
- Credit cards may be demagnetized if left near a camera case. Avoid leaving magnetic strip cards near the case.

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
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



#### Mode dial

You can select the desired working mode by using the mode dial located on the top of the camera.

AUTO mode



Selects this mode for quick and easy picture taking with minimal user interaction.

In this mode, you can select the basic menus. To select an advanced menu, select the other camera mode.

■ ASR mode



Advanced Shake Reduction (ASR) mode. This mode will reduce camera shake and help you get a clearer image.

■ PROGRAM mode



Selecting the program mode will configure the camera with optimal settings. You can still manually configure all functions except the aperture value and shutter speed.

■ EFFECT mode



It is possible to add special effects to your images by using this mode.

■ MANUAL mode



You can manually configure all functions including the aperture value and shutter speed.

■ SCENE mode



Use the menu to easily configure optimal settings for a variety of shooting situations.

#### ■ MOVIE mode



A movie clip can be recorded for as long as the available recording time of the memory capacity allows.

#### ■ PHOTO GALLERY mode



The saved images can be reviewed with music or various effects in this mode.

## **Connecting to a Power Source**

You should use the rechargeable battery (SLB-0837(B)) supplied with the camera. Be sure to charge the battery before using the camera.

Important information about battery usage.

- When the camera is not used, turn off the camera power.
- Please remove the battery if the camera will not be used for long periods. Batteries can lose power over time and are prone to leaking if kept inside the camera.
- Low temperatures (below 0°C) can affect the performance of the battery and you may experience reduced battery life.
- Battery will usually recover at normal temperatures.
- During extended use of the camera, the camera body may become warm. This is perfectly normal.

### Connecting to a Power Source

You can charge the rechargeable battery (SLB-0837(B)) by using an SAC-46 KIT. The SAC-46 KIT consists of the AC adapter (SAC-46) and the USB cable (SUC-C2). When the AC adapter and the USB cable are assembled, it can be used as an AC cable.

Using the SAC-46 as an AC charger
 Insert the AC adapter into the USB connector.
 When the AC adapter is inserted, it can be used as an AC charger.



Using the SAC-46 as an USB cable
 : Remove the AC adapter from the USB connector. You can transmit data with a PC (p.88) or charge the battery.






In the following cases, the battery may not be charged.

- When using the USB cable that was not supplied with this camera. Use the supplied USB cable.
- When using a USB hub. Connect the camera to the PC directly.
- When other USB devices are connected to the PC. Disconnect the other USB devices.
- When the USB is connected to the USB port located on the front of the computer. Use the USB located on the back of the computer.
- If the USB port of the PC doesn't meet the Power output standard (5V, 500mA), the camera may not be charged.

## **Connecting to a Power Source**

■ How to charge the rechargeable battery (SLB-0837(B))





- Before inserting any cables or AC adapter, check the directions and do not insert by force. It may cause damage to the cable or camera.
- If the charging LED of the AC Charger does not turn on or blink after inserting the rechargeable battery, please check whether the battery is inserted correctly.
- If you charge the battery with the camera power on, the battery can't charge fully. Turn the camera off while charging the battery.
- If you insert the fully discharged battery to charge it, do not turn on the camera at the same time. The camera may not be turned on because of the low battery capacity. Charge the battery for more than 10 minutes before using the camera.
- Do not use the flash frequently or take a movie clip with a fully discharged battery that has only been charged for a short time.

## **Inserting the Battery**

Insert the battery as shown

- If the camera does not turn on after you have inserted battery, please check whether the battery is inserted with the correct polarity (+/-).
- Do not use force to open the battery chamber. This may damage the battery chamber cover.



■ There are 4 indicators for battery condition that are displayed on the LCD monitor

### Inserting the memory card

Turn off the camera's power before inserting the memory card.

- Insert the memory card as shown.
- Have the front of the memory card facing toward the back of the camera (LCD monitor) and the card pins toward the front of the camera (Lens).
- Do not insert the memory card the wrong way round. Doing so may damage the memory card slot.



## Instructions on using the memory card

- Be sure to format the memory card (see p.75) if you are using a newly purchased memory card for the first time, if it contains data that the camera cannot recognise, or if it contains images captured with a different camera.
- Turn off the camera power whenever the memory card is being inserted or removed
- Repeated use of the memory card will eventually reduce its performance.
   Should this be the case, you will need to purchase a new memory card.
   Wear and tear on the memory card is not covered by the Samsung warranty.
- The memory card is an electronic precision device.
   Do not bend, drop or subject it to any heavy impact.
- Do not store the memory card in an environment with strong electronic or magnetic fields, e.g. near loudspeakers or TV receivers.
- Please do not use or store in an environment where there are extremes in temperature.
- Do not allow the memory card to become dirty or to come into contact with any liquid. Should this happen, clean the memory card with a soft cloth.
- Please keep the memory card in its case when not in use.
- During and after periods of extended use, you may notice that the memory card is warm. This is perfectly normal.
- Do not use a memory card that is used in another digital camera.
   To use the memory card in this camera, format the memory card using this camera.
- Do not use a memory card formatted by another digital camera or memory card reader.

- If the memory card is subjected to any of the following, the recorded data may become corrupted:
  - When the memory card is used incorrectly.
  - If the power is switched off or the memory card is removed while recording, deleting (formatting) or reading.
- Samsung cannot be held responsible for lost data.
- It is advisable to copy important data onto other media as back-up e.g. floppy disks, hard disks, CD etc.
- If there is insufficient memory available
  - : A [Memory Full!] message will appear and the camera will not operate.


    To optimise the amount of memory in the camera, replace the memory card or delete unnecessary images stored on the memory card.



 Don't remove the memory card when the camera status lamp is blinking as this may cause damage to data in the memory card.

## Instructions on using the memory card

The camera can use SD/SDHC Memory Cards and MMC (Multi Media Cards).



[SD (Secure Digital) memory card]

The SD/SDHC memory card has a write protect switch that prevents image files from being deleted or formatted. By sliding the switch towards the bottom of the SD/SDHC memory card, the data will be protected. By sliding the switch towards the top of the SD/SDHC memory card, the data protection will be cancelled. Slide the switch to the top of the SD/SDHC memory card before taking a picture.





## When Using the Camera for the First Time: Smart button

This button is used for shifting the menu cursor to select or for confirming the selected menu.




To select a sub menu, in some menus, touch the button and slide your finger to the left / right.



[e.g. : Selecting the shutter speed]

Extending the menus: Press the extension menu button and more available menus will be displayed.



\*\* The LCD monitor will be dark when some menus are selected. After selecting the menu, the LCD monitor returns to the brightness set as before.

## When Using the Camera for the First Time: Setting up the Date / Time and Language

When the camera is turned on for the first time, a menu will be displayed in the LCD monitor to set date, time and language. This menu will not be displayed again after setting up the date, time and language. Set up the date, time and language before using this camera.

- Setting up the language
  - 1. Press the [Language] menu button.
  - Select a desired language by pressing the vertical smart button.



- Setting up the date, time and date type
  - 1. Press the [Date & Time] menu button.
  - 2. Select a desired date type by pressing the vertical smart button.



- 3. To change the date, select the [2007/07/01] menu and press the vertical smart button.
- To select Year / Month / Day and Hour: Minute, press the horizontal smart button. To change the numbers, press the vertical smart button.






- You can select any one of 22 languages. These are listed below:
  - English, Korean, French, German, Spanish, Italian, S.Chinese,
     T.Chinese, Japanese, Russian, Portuguese, Dutch, Danish, Swedish,
     Finnish, Thai, Bahasa (Malay / Indonesian), Arabic, Polish, Hungarian,
     Czech and Turkish.
- Even if the camera is restarted, the language setting will be maintained.

#### How to use the AUTO mode

Please select this mode for quick and easy picture taking with minimal user interaction

- 1. Insert the battery (p.16) taking note of the correct polarity (+ / -).
- Insert the memory card (p.16). As this camera has a 20MB internal memory, it is not essential to insert the memory card. If the memory card is not inserted, an image will be stored in the internal memory. If the memory card is inserted, an image will be stored on the memory card.
- 3. Close the battery chamber cover.
- 4. Press the power button to turn on the camera. (If the date / time that is displayed on the LCD monitor is incorrect, reset the date / time before taking a picture.)
- 5. Select the AUTO mode by rotating the mode dial.
- Point the camera towards the subject and compose the image by using the LCD monitor.
- 7. Press the shutter button to capture an image.



- If the Auto focus area turns to red when you press the shutter button down half way, it means that the camera cannot focus on the subject. Should this be the case, the camera is unable to capture an image clearly.
- Avoid obstructing the lens or the flash when you capture an image.

#### How to use the PROGRAM mode

Selecting the program mode will configure the camera with optimal settings. You can still manually configure all functions except the aperture value and shutter speed.

- 1. Select the PROGRAM mode by rotating the mode dial.
- Press the horizontal smart button to configure advanced functions such as image size (p.36), quality (p.39), metering (p.37) and continuous shooting (p.36).
- \* Refer to page 32-48 for more information about the menus.





#### How to use the MANUAL mode

The user can manually set both the aperture value and the shutter speed.

- 1. Select the MANUAL mode by rotating the mode dial.
- 2. Select the desired shutter speed and aperture value by using the smart button.
- \* Refer to page 47-48 for more information about the menus.





#### How to use the ASR (Advanced Shake Reduction) mode

This mode will reduce the effect of camera shake and help you get a wellexposed image in dim conditions.

- 1. Select the ASR mode by rotating the mode dial.
- Point the camera towards the subject and compose the image by using the LCD monitor.
- 3. Press the shutter button to capture an image.





- Things to watch out for using the ASR mode
  - The digital zoom will not operate in the ASR mode.
  - If the lighting conditions are brighter than fluorescent lighting condition, the ASR doesn't activate.
  - If the subject is moving the final image captured may be blurred.
  - Avoid moving the camera while the [Capturing!] message is displayed to achieve a better result.
  - As the ASR uses the camera's digital processor, images taken using the ASR may take a little longer for the camera to process.

#### How to use the EFFECT mode

It is possible to add special effects to your images by using this mode. Select the EFFECT mode by rotating the mode dial.

\* Refer to page 44-47 for more information about the effect menus.





#### How to use the SCENE mode

Use the menu to easily configure optimal settings for a variety of shooting situations. Select the SCENE mode by rotating the mode dial.

\* Refer to page 44 for more information about the menus.





#### How to use the MOVIE mode

A movie clip can be recorded for as long as the available recording time of the memory capacity allows.

- Select the MOVIE mode by rotating the mode dial. (Available recording time will display on the LCD monitor)
- Point the camera towards the subject and compose the image by using the LCD monitor. Press the shutter button and movie clips are recorded for as long as the available recording time allows. Movie clips will still be recorded if the shutter button is released

If you wish to stop recording, press the shutter button again.

- \* Image size and type are listed below.
- Image size: 640X480, 320X240 (Selectable)
- File type : \*.avi (MPEG-4)
- \* The maximum file size of continuous movie clip is 4GB.
- \*\* If the recording time is over 6 hours, though the file size is not 4GB, the movie is stopped and saved automatically.
- \*\* Before the file size is 4GB or the recording time is 6 hours, the movie can be stopped and saved depending on the movie quality.





#### Recording the movie clip without sound

You can record the movie clip without sound.

- 1. Press the extension menu button.
- 2. Select the [VOICE] → [OFF] menu.
- Press the shutter button and movie clip is recorded for as long as the available recording time without sound.



#### Pausing while recording a movie clip (Successive Recording)

This camera allows you to temporarily stop during unwanted scenes, while recording a movie clip. Using this function, you can record your favourite scenes into a movie clip without having to create multiple movie clips.

- Using Successive Recording
  - Press the shutter button and movie clips are recorded for as long as the available recording time allows. Movie clips will still be recorded if the shutter button is released.
  - Press the II button to pause recording.
     Press the button again to resume the recording.
  - If you wish to stop recording, press the shutter button again.



### Things to Watch Out for When Taking Pictures

Pressing the shutter button down half way.
 Lightly press the shutter button to confirm focus and flash battery charge.
 Press the shutter button all the way down to take the picture.

- The available recording time may vary depending on shooting conditions and camera settings.
- When either the Flash Off or Slow synchro mode is selected in a low lighting condition, the camera shake warning indicator ( "\(\frac{\pi\_0}{n}\)) may appear on the LCD monitor. In this case, use a tripod, support the camera on a solid surface or change to flash shot mode.
- Shooting against the light: Please do not take pictures into the sun. Taking a
  picture against the sun may make the picture dark.
  To take a picture against the light, please use the
  [Backlight] in the scene shooting mode (see page 44),
  fill-in flash (see page 35), spot metering (see page
  37), or exposure compensation (see page 42).

- Avoid obstructing the lens or the flash when you capture an image.
- Compose the image by using the LCD monitor.
- In some of the following conditions the Auto focus area system may not perform as expected.
  - When photographing a subject that has little contrast.
  - If the subject is highly reflective or shiny.
  - If the subject is moving at high speed.
  - When there is strong reflected light, or when the background is very bright.
  - When the subject matter has only horizontal lines or the subject is very narrow (such as a stick or flagpole).
  - When the surroundings are dark.

## Using the camera buttons to set the camera

The recording mode function can be set up by using the camera buttons.

#### POWER button

Used for turning the camera's power on / off.

If there is no operation during the specified time, the camera's power will be turned off automatically to save battery life.

Refer to page 72 for more information about the auto power off function.



#### SHUTTER button

Used for taking an image or recording voice in the RECORDING mode.

#### • In MOVIE CLIP mode :

Pressing the shutter button down fully starts the process for recording a movie clip. Press the shutter button once and the movie clip is recorded for as long as the available recording time in the memory allows. If you wish to stop recording, press the shutter button again.



#### In STILL IMAGE mode:

Pressing the shutter button down halfway activates the autofocus and checks the condition of the flash. Pressing the shutter button down fully takes and stores the image. If you select voice memo recording, the recording will start after the camera has finished storing the image data.

#### **ZOOM W/T button**

If the menu is not displayed, this button works as the OPTICAL ZOOM or DIGITAL ZOOM button. This camera has a 3X optical zoom and a 5X digital zoom function.



Using both will offer a total zoom ratio of 15X.

#### ■ TELE Zoom

Optical zoom TELE

: Pressing the ZOOM T button will zoom into the subject i.e. the subject will appear nearer.

Digital zoom TELE



: When the maximum (3X) optical zoom is selected, pressing the ZOOM T button activates the digital zoom software. Releasing ZOOM T button stops the digital zooming at the required setting. Once the maximum digital zoom (5X) is achieved, pressing the ZOOM T button will have no effect.



#### ■ WIDE Zoom

Optical zoom WIDE



: Pressing the ZOOM W button. This will zoom out from the subject i.e. the subject will appear farther away. Pressing the ZOOM W button continuously will set the camera to its minimum zoom setting i.e. the subject appears at its farthest from the camera.



Digital zoom WIDE



: When the digital zoom is in operation, pressing the ZOOM W button will reduce the digital zooming in steps. Releasing ZOOM W button stops digital zooming. Pressing the ZOOM W button will reduce the digital zoom and then it will continue to reduce the optical zoom until the minimum setting is reached.



#### **ZOOM W/T button**



- Images taken using the digital zoom may take a little longer for the camera to process. Allow time for this to take place.
- If the Zoom buttons are being pressed during the Movie clip shots, the voice will not recorded.
- You may notice a decrease in image quality when using the digital zoom.
- To view a clearer digital zoom image, press the shutter button halfway at the maximum optical zoom position and press the zoom T button again.
- The digital zoom can't be activated in the [ASR], [MOVIE], [HIGH SPEED], [M.CAPTURE], [NIGHT], [CHILDREN], [CLOSE UP], [TEXT], [FIREWORKS], [SELF SHOT], [FOOD], [CAFÉ] modes.
- Take care not to touch the lens to avoid taking an unclear image and possibly causing camera malfunction. If the image is dim, turn the camera power off and on again to modify the lens position.
- Take care not to press the lens as this may cause a camera malfunction.
- When the camera is turned on, take care not to touch the camera's moving lens parts as this may cause the resulting image to be dim and unclear.
- You can operate the Wide and Tele zoom by using the remote control.

## Face recognition(FR) button

This mode detects the face position of the subject automatically and then sets the focus and exposure. Select this mode for quick and easy portraits.

- \*\* Selectable modes : AUTO, PROGRAM, MANUAL, ASR, EFFECT(M.GIF), SCENE(PORTRAIT, CHILDREN, BEACH & SNOW, SELF SHOT. CAFÉ)
  - 1. Press the FR (Face Recognition) button ( 🎉 ) in the selectable modes.
  - The FR icon will be displayed on the screen left side.



The size and position of the Auto focus area is set at the face of the subject automatically.



- Press the shutter button halfway. The focus frame turns to green when the focus is activated.
- 4. Press the shutter button fully to take a picture.

### Face recognition(FR) button



- This function can detect up to 9 persons.
- When the camera recognises many people at the same time, it will focus on the nearest person.
- When the camera detects a target face, the white colour focus frame
  will be displayed over the target face and the gray colour focus frame
  will be displayed over the remaining faces(up to 8). Press the shutter
  button halfway down to focus the face and the white focus frame turns
  green.(Total 9)
- Return to previous AF mode if face detection was failure.
- In some conditions this function cannot work properly.
  - When a person wears dark glasses or some part of the face is hidden.
  - When the person being taken does not look at the camera.
  - When the camera doesn't detect a face because of too much or too little light.
  - There is too great a distance between the camera and the subject.
- The maximum available Face Recognition range is 2.5m (Wide).
- The nearer the subject, the faster the camera can recognize the subject.
- The digital zoom cannot be used in the Face Recognition mode.

#### Flash



- If you press the shutter button after selecting the Auto, Fill-in, Slow sychro flash, the first flash fires to check the shooting condition (Flash range and Power ratio of flash).
  - Do not move the camera until the second flash fires.
- Using the flash frequently will reduce the life of the battery.
- Under normal operating conditions the charging time for the flash is usually less than 4 seconds. If the battery is weak, the charging time will be longer.
- Take photographs with in the flash range.
- The image quality is not guaranteed if the subject is too close or highly reflective
- When taking an image in poorly lit conditions with the flash, there may be a white speck in the captured image. The speck is caused by the reflection of the flash light from the atmospheric dust. It is not camera malfurdion
- Do not open the Built-in flash by force. It may cause damage to the flash.



# Metering

If you cannot obtain suitable exposure conditions, you can change the metering method to take brighter pictures.

[MULTI] Exposure will be calculated based on

an average of the available light in the image area. However, the calculation will be biased towards the centre of the image area. This is suitable for general use



[PROGRAM mode]

[SPOT] : Only the rectangular area in the centre

of the LCD monitor will be metered for light. This is suitable when you want the

subject in the centre correctly exposed, regardless of the back liahtina.

[CENTER]: Exposure will be calculated based on an average of the available light in the image area. However, the calculation will be biased towards the centre of the image area. This is suitable for taking a picture of small object like a flower or insects.

\* If the subject is not the centre of the focus area, do not use the spot metering as this may result in an exposure error. In this circumstance, it is better to use exposure compensation.

#### ACB(Auto Contrast Balance) function

This function is to adjust the contrast automatically, when taking photos in an environment with big exposure difference i.e. backlight or contrast. This function adjusts the brightness automatically and allows the subject to be photographed clearly.





- \* When using the AUTO. PROGRAM mode, the ACB function will operate.
- \* When using the [HIGH SPEED], [M.CAPTURE], [AEB] menu, the ACB function will not operate.
- \* When the ACB function is selected, you only can select ISO AUTO, 100.

# Sharpness

You can adjust the sharpness of the picture you want to take. You cannot check the sharpness effect on the LCD monitor before you take a picture. because this function is applied only when the captured image is stored on the memory.

: The edges of the image are softened. This effect is suitable for editing

images on your PC.

[NORMAL]: The edges of the image are sharp.

This is suitable for printing.

## **Effect**

- JPEG (Joint Photographic Experts Group): JPEG is the image compression standard developed by the Joint Photographic Experts Group. This type of compression is most commonly used for compressing photos and graphics because it can compress the files efficiently.

## Self-timer / Remote control

This function is used when the photographer would also like to be in the picture.

- Selecting a self-timer :

When you press the Shutter button, the picture will be taken after the specified time has elapsed and the self-timer function will be cancelled.



Pressing the shutter button of a separate remote control will allow an interval of 2 seconds before



the image is taken. After taking a picture, the remote mode will be maintained. But, pressing the Power button will cancel the remote mode.

2 second self-timer setting : The self-timer lamp blinks at 0.25 second interval for 2 seconds

- If you operate the Back button during the self-timer operation, the selftimer function is canceled
- Use a tripod to prevent camera shake.

## Voice recording / Voice memo

A voice can be recorded for as long as the available recording time(Max 10 hours) of the memory capacity allows. And you can add your voice-over to a stored still image.

- Voice recording
  - Select a recording mode with the exception of the Movie clip mode by rotating the mode dial.
  - 2. Select the Voice recording menu by using the smart button.
  - 3. Press the shutter button to record a voice.
    - Press the shutter button once and voice is recorded for as long as the available recording time allows(Max 10 hours). The recording time will be displayed on the LCD monitor. Voice will still be recorded if the shutter button is released.
  - If you wish to stop recording, press the shutter button again.

# Voice recording / Voice memo

- Voice memo
  - 1. Select a recording mode with the exception of the Movie clip mode by rotating the mode dial.

## Movie Clip frame stabiliser

- 2. The recording frame range become narrow when vou select this menu.

# **Exposure compensation**

This camera automatically adjusts the exposure according to the ambient lighting conditions. You can also select the exposure value in the compensating exposure menu. Exposure compensation menu is available in the Program and ASR, Movie mode.

#### ■ Compensating Exposure

- Press the exposure compensation menu button and the exposure compensation menu bar will appear as shown.
- 2. Touch the button and slide your finger to select the exposure value.
- Press the exposure compensation menu button again. The value you set will be saved and the Exposure Compensation setup mode will close.



\*\* A negative exposure compensation value reduces the exposure. Note that a positive exposure compensation value increases the exposure and the LCD monitor will appear white or you may not get good pictures.

## ISO

You can select the ISO sensitivity when taking pictures. The speed or specific light-sensitivity of a camera is rated in ISO numbers. ISO menu is available in the Program and Manual mode.

#### - AUTO:

The camera's sensitivity is automatically changed by variables such as lighting value or subject brightness.

 - 80, 100, 200, 400, 800, 1600, 3200:
 You can increase the shutter speed while the same amount of light is present, by increasing the



ISO sensitivity. However, the image may be saturated in high luminance. The higher the ISO value, the greater is the camera's sensitivity to light; therefore it has a greater capacity for taking pictures in darker conditions. However, the noise level in the image will increase as the ISO value increases, making the image appear coarse.

\*\* When the [M.CAPTURE] menu is selected, you only can select ISO AUTO, 800, 1600, 3200.

## White balance

The white balance control allows you to adjust the colours to appear more natural. When a menu except the AWB (Auto White Balance) is selected, you can only select the negative color effect.

White Balance menu is available in the Program, Manual and ASR. Movie clip mode.





- How to make the Motion GIF
  - 1. Select the Effect mode by rotating the mode dial.
  - 2. Press the Motion GIF menu button.
  - Select the image size and FPS (Frame Per Second).
  - 4. Press the Shutter button to take pictures. (Max. 50 images)
  - 5. Press the OK menu button to save the image. The images will be saved as a motion GIF file.

# **Effect: Composite shooting**

You can combine 2, 3, or 4 different shots in a still image

- If you press the Play mode button or rotate the mode dial during the composite shots, each camera working mode is executed. The images captured before will be deleted.
- After taking the last composite shooting, press the OK button. And then the voice memo will start.

# **Effect: Composite shooting**

## **Shutter Speed**

This mode will set the shutter speed for automatic exposure. High Shutter speeds can capture a moving object in a still image as if the object is not moving. Low Shutter speeds can capture a moving object with an active effect.



■ Setting up the shutter speed

To select the shutter speed, touch the button and slide your finger to the left or right.





## **Aperture Value**

This mode will set the aperture value for automatic exposure. Smaller Aperture values make the object sharp but blur the background. Larger Aperture values make both the object and background sharp.



## **Photo Gallery mode**

When the images play back, you can add play back effect and listen to a B.G.M. Only still images can be played back. Movie and Voice files are not played back.

## Using the camera buttons to adjust the camera

In Play mode, you can use the buttons on the camera to conveniently set up the Play mode functions.

#### Play mode button

- If you have turned on the camera by pressing the POWER button, you can press the PLAY MODE button once to switch to Play mode and press it again to switch to Recording mode.
- You can turn the power on with the play mode button. The camera is turned on in play mode. Press the play mode button again to turn off the camera.



# Thumbnail ( ■ ) / Enlargement ( Q ) button

# Starting the slide show

Images can be displayed continuously at pre-set intervals.

You can view the slide show by connecting the camera to an external monitor. To start the slide show, press the Start menu button.

While the slide show is playing, only the first frame of a MOVIE file and GIF file is displayed.

While the slide show is playing, the voice recording file will not display.





#### ■ Configure slide show effects

Unique screen effects can be used for the slide show.

[Off] : No effect is added.

[Basic] : Fade In/Out effect is added and the

images are displayed as set interval.

[Classic] : You can add noise to an image to add

a more classic feel to your photo.

[Memories]: The film is aged to make it seem like an old movie.

[Rhythmic]: Images are displayed with various effects.

[Delight]: Images are displayed with various effects.

#### ■ Setting play interval

Set the slide show play interval to the number of seconds preferred.

[1 sec] : Playback interval is 1 sec. [3 sec] : Playback interval is 3 sec. [5 sec] : Playback interval is 5 sec. [10 sec] : Playback interval is 10 sec.



\* The interval menu functions in the [Off]. [Basic] menu only.

## ■ Repeat Option

Selecting the repeat option for the slide show.

# **Protecting images**

This is used to protect (Lock) specific shots from being accidentally erased. It also unprotects (Unlocks) images that have been previously protected.

[ONE] : Protect / release displayed image. [ALL] : Protect / release all saved images



- If you protect an image, the protect icon will be displayed on the LCD monitor. (An unprotected image has no indicator)
- An image in LOCK mode will be protected from the delete function, but will NOT be protected from the format function.





# **Deleting images**

This is used to delete the displayed image.

[YES] : deletes displayed or checked ( ✓) image.
 [NO] : cancels deleting displayed image or checked
 ( ✓) image.



- The protected images can't be deleted.
- The number of images will be displayed at the bottom right of the LCD monitor.



## **DPOF**

- DPOF (Digital Print Order Format) allows you to embed printing information on your memory card's MISC folder. Select the pictures to be printed and how many prints to make.
- The DPOF indicator will appear on the LCD monitor when an image that has DPOF information plays back. Images can then be printed on DPOF printers, or at an increasing number of photo labs.
- This function is not available for Movie clips and Voice recording files and M.GIF files
- If a memory card is not inserted, the menus are still displayed in the LCD, but are not selectable
- When the wide angle image is printed as a wide angle print, 8% of the left and right side of the image may not be printed. Check that your printer can support the wide angle image when you print the image. When you print the image at a photo lab, request that the image is printed as a wide angle image. (Some photo labs may not support the wide angle size print.)

## **DPOF: STANDARD**

This function allows you to embed print quantity information on a stored image.

- Select the DPOF menu by pressing the smart button.
- Select a desired sub menu by pressing the smart button.

[ONE PIC] : Select a number of prints of displayed image.

[ALL PICS] : Configure number of prints for all

pictures except movie and voice

files.

[CANCEL] : Cancel the print setup.

 Press the OK button to confirm the setting. If an image carries DPOF instructions, the DPOF indicator ( ) will show.







## **DPOF: Print size**

You can specify the print size when printing images stored on the memory card. The [SIZE] menu is available only for DPOF 1.1 compatible printers.

## Resize



- You can change the resolution of only those files compressed in the JPEG 4:2:2 format.
- The resized image will have a new file name. The [START IMAGE] image is stored not on the memory card but on the internal memory.
- Only one [START IMAGE] image can be saved. If you save a new ISTART IMAGEI, the existing startup image will be deleted.
- If the memory capacity is insufficient to store the resized image, a [Memory Full!] message will appear on the LCD monitor and the resized image will not be stored.

# **Trimming**

### Auto power off

This function switches the camera off after a set amount of time in order to prevent unnecessary battery drainage.

- Sub menus
  - [1, 3, 5, 10 min]: The power will turn off automatically if not used for the period of time specified.
- After replacing the battery, the power off setting will be preserved.
- Note that the automatic power off function will not operate if the camera is in PC / Printer mode, slide show, playing back a voice recording, playing back a movie file, playing back a GIF file, recording a movie clip or taking a composite shot.



# Setup menu 2( 🎤 )

### Quick view

If you enable Quick View before capturing an image, you can view the image you just captured on the LCD monitor for the duration set in the [Quick View] setup. Quick view is possible only with still images.

- Sub menus

[Off]

: The quick view function can't be activated

[0.5, 1, 3 sec]: The captured image is briefly displayed during the selected time.

- If the shutter button is pressed during the quick view, it is cancelled



# Setup menu 3( ✓₃ )

### Start up image

You can select the image that is first displayed on the LCD monitor whenever the camera is turned on.

  - A memory card that has a file this camera can't recognise or one that has been taken from another camera.



Always format the memory card using this camera. If you insert a
memory card that has been formatted using other cameras, memory
card readers, or PCs, you will get a [Card Errorl] message.

#### Delete All

Of all the files stored in the memory card, the unprotected files in the DCIM subfolder will be deleted.

[No]: Cancel the "Delete All".

- The protected images can't be deleted.


- When this menu is selected without inserting a memory card, you can select the [Copy To Card] menu but the menu can't be run.
- If there is not enough space available in the memory card to copy saved images in the internal memory (20MB), the [Copy To Card] command will copy only some of the images and display [Memory Full!] message. Then the system will return to the playback mode. Please be sure to delete any unnecessary files in the internal memory to free up space before inserting the memory card into the camera.
- When you move the images that are stored in the internal memory to the memory card, the next number of file names will be created in the card to avoid duplication of the file name.
  - When the [Reset] of the [File] setup menu is set: The copied file names start from after the last stored file name.
  - When the [Series] of the [File] setup menu is set: The copied file names start from after the last captured file name. After completing [Copy To Card], the last stored image of the last copied folder is displayed on the LCD monitor.

The Movie output signal from the camera can be NTSC or PAL. Your choice of output will be governed by the type of device (monitor or TV, etc.) to which the camera is connected. PAL mode can support only BDGHI.

Connecting to an external monitor In RECORDING/ PLAY mode, you can view the stored still images or movie clips by connecting the camera to an external monitor via the AV cable. When the camera is connected to an external monitor, the LCD monitor will be turned off automatically.

   Keep this camera with silica gel in a hermetically sealed box when not planning to use the camera for a long period of time.
- Sand can be particularly troublesome to cameras.
  - Do not let sand get inside the camera when using it on beaches, coastal dunes, or other areas where there is lots of sand.
  - Doing so may result in failure or may render the camera permanently unusable.
- Handling the camera.
  - Never drop the camera or subject it to severe shocks or vibrations.
  - Protect the large size LCD monitor from an impact. When this camera is not used, keep it in the camera case.

Moisture built up can also occur on the memory card. If this happens, turn off the camera and remove the memory card. Wait until the moisture has dispersed.

- Caution on Using the Lens.
  - If the lens is subjected to direct sunlight, it could result in the discoloration and deterioration of the image sensor.
  - Avoid getting fingerprints or foreign substances on the surface of the lens.
- If the digital camera is not used for a long period, an electric discharge can occur.

It is a good idea to remove the battery and the memory card if you do not intend using the camera for an extended period of time.

 If the camera is exposed to an electronic interference, it will turn itself off to protect the memory card.

### Important notes

- Camera Maintenance.
  - Use a soft brush (available from photo stores) to gently clean the lens and LCD assemblies. If this does not work, lens-cleaning paper with lens cleaning fluid can be used.

Clean the camera body with a soft cloth. Do not allow this camera to come into contact with solvent materials such as benzol, insecticide, thinners etc. This may damage the body shell of the camera and also affect its performance. Rough handling can damage the LCD monitor. Take care to avoid damage and keep the camera in a protective carrying case when not in use.

- Do not attempt to disassemble or modify the camera.
- Under certain conditions, static electricity can cause the flash unit to fire.
   This is not harmful to the camera and is not a malfunction.
- When images are uploaded or downloaded, the data transfer may be affected by static electricity.
   In this case, disconnect and re-connect the USB cable before trying the transfer again.
- Always check the condition of the camera before an important event or going on a trip.
  - Take a picture to check that the camera is working correctly and ensure you have a fully charged spare battery.
  - Samsung cannot be held responsible for camera malfunctions.

- · Taking a picture beyond the flash range

- The lens is smudged or dirty
  - → Clean the lens.

#### The flash does not fire

- · Flash off mode has been selected
  - → Dis-engage flash off mode.

  - → Refer to the FLASH instruction. (p.34~35)

#### Incorrect date and time is displayed

- The date and time have been set incorrectly or the camera has adopted the default settings







- When you upload a file that is not taken by this camera to the Removable Disk, the [File Error!] message will be displayed on the LCD monitor in the PLAY mode, and nothing is displayed in Thumbnail mode.

- A new icon will be displayed on the desktop after connecting the camera to the MAC.

## **Using the USB Driver for MAC**

There is an unexpected error during file transfer.

ightarrow Turn the camera power off and on again. Transfer the file again.

Case 4

When using a USB hub.

→ There may be a problem in connecting the camera to the PC through a USB hub if the PC and the hub are not compatible. Wherever possible, connect the camera directly to the PC.



Are other USB cables connected to the PC?

→ The camera may malfunction when it is connected to the PC at the same time as another USB cable. In this case, disconnect the other USB cable, and only connect the camera USB cable to the PC.

### Case 6

When I open the Device Manager (by clicking  $Start \rightarrow (Settings) \rightarrow Control Panel \rightarrow (Performance and Maintenance) \rightarrow System \rightarrow (Hardware) \rightarrow Device Manager), there are Unknown Devices or Other Devices entries with a yellow question mark (?) beside them or devices with an exclamation mark (!) beside them.$

The camera is connected to the USB port located on the front of the computer.

- \*\* When the movie clip recorded by the camera doesn't play back on the PC, the causes are most likely due to the codec installed on the PC.
