Installing Application

iriver plus 3 and Windows Media Player 11 are integrated software applications that efficiently manage various multimedia files. iriver plus 3 and Windows Media Player 11 give you freedom to transfer music, video and picture files from PC to the product.



Installing iriver plus 3

1. Insert the provided installation CD into your PC to display the application installation screen.
2. Click iriver plus 3 and complete the installation process by following the on-screen instructions

Installing Windows Media Player 11

1. Insert the installation CD into your PC to display the installation process screen.
2. Click Windows Media Player 11 and complete the installation process by following the on-screen instructions.

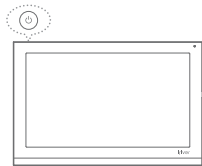

Turning the Product ON/OFF

Turning on the Product

1. Press the [⏻] button on the product to turn it on.



Turning off the Product

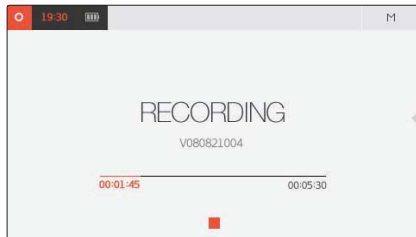
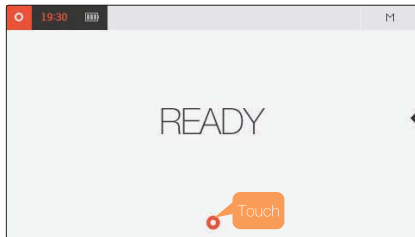
1. Press and hold the [⏻] button on the product again to turn it off.

- This product has an automatic power saving function to save battery power. Based on the settings in the Power Save mode, the product will automatically turn off after a pre-determined period without operation. For more information on setting this mode, please refer to [⚙️ > Timer > Auto Power OFF] (Refer to page 40.)

Touch Screen

Using the Touch Screen

1. The P7 has a touch screen system which operates according to the user's direct touch.
Touch one of the icons displayed on the screen to operate.

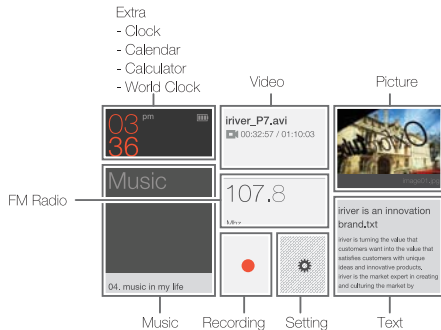


- Do not press the touch screen with a sharp object or with excessive pressure because it may cause permanent damage on the screen.

Selecting Modes

Selection Mode

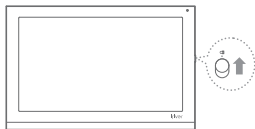
1. Turn on the power to display the main menu screen.
Touch the [M] icon during any mode to return to the main menu screen.
2. Touch a mode (Extra, Music, Video, Radio, Recording, Setting, Picture or Text) you want to operate.



Using HOLD and RESET

Using HOLD

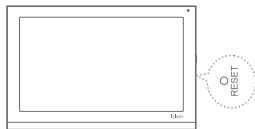
1. Slide the HOLD switch in the direction of the arrow to lock the product.



2. Slide the HOLD switch in the opposite direction of the arrow to unlock the product.

Using RESET

1. If your product does not respond, remove the Micro SD card cover and press and release the RESET pinhole.

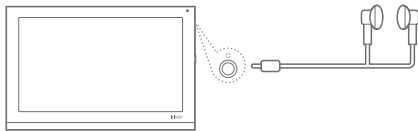


- The RESET function does not remove the date/time setting and data from your product.
- P7 will automatically turn off when you reset. Press the [⏻] button to turn P7 back on.

Connecting Your Device

Connecting Earphones

1. Connect your earphones to the Headphone port.



Charging the Product

1. Push and open the USB data port on P7 in the direction of the arrow.
2. Turn on your PC and connect P7 to it using the provided USB cable.
3. The internal battery automatically starts to charge.

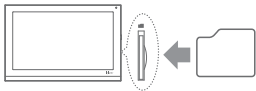


- Do not use any USB cable other than the one included with the product. This may cause malfunction.
- Check if the product is connected to a high-power USB 2.0 port. Some low-power USB ports built into certain peripheral devices, such as keyboards and USB hubs without integrated power, may not provide enough power to charge your product.
- The product may not be charged while your PC is in standby mode.
- Charge the product **only** at room temperature. The product may not be charged in extremely hot or cold temperatures.
- The battery takes about 7 hours to be **fully** charged by a USB cable. (Based on when product is **fully** discharged and the power is off.)
- And about 5 hours by a TTA-certified 24-pin mobile charger. (Based on when product is **fully** discharged, power is off, and TTA charger is 750 mA.)
- The available usage time of a charged battery becomes shorter over time.
- It may take longer to **fully** charge your device or may not be **fully** charged if you use it while charging.

Connecting Your Device

Inserting/Removing the Micro SD Card

1. Open the cover of the RESET/Micro SD Card slot while the power of the product is off.
2. Place the Micro SD Card in the direction as shown in the image and slightly press and push the card into the slot.
3. Press again to remove the card.



- Insert/remove the Micro SD Card while the power of the product is off.
- Do not insert the Micro SD Card with force. This may cause the product to malfunction or damage to the Micro SD Card.
- Do not remove the Micro SD Card while in use. This may cause data loss, product malfunction or damage to the Micro SD Card.
- Try not to insert and remove the Micro SD card frequently.
- Inserting the Micro SD card in the wrong way may cause product malfunction and the card may be difficult to remove.

Recommended Micro SD Card

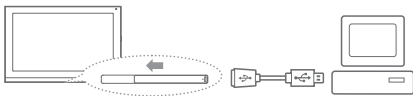

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- Using a Micro SD Card other than the recommended card may cause malfunction.
- The transfer speed of the Micro SD Card may vary depending on your PC specifications.
- The Micro SD Card cannot be formatted through the product. The card can only be formatted with iriver plus 3 or a card reader.
- Formatting the Micro SD Card will delete all data within the card; therefore, it is important to backup data before formatting.
- FAT system is recommended when formatting the Micro SD Card.
- Please try to format the card if the Micro SD Card cannot be recognized or causes malfunction.
- The Micro SD Card is not included with the product. Please purchase one separately.
- A Micro SD Card of 8 GB is recommended for this product.

Connecting Your Device

Connecting P7 to Your PC

1. Push and open the USB data port on P7 in the direction of the arrow
2. Turn on your PC and P7, and then connect P7 to your PC using the provided USB cable.

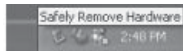


3. The USB Connection message will appear on the screen.
 - Power & Data Transfer: The product starts to charge and data can be transferred.
 - Power & Play: The product starts to charge and you can use the product.
 - Power Only: Charges the battery only.

- It is recommended to stop all operations before connecting the product to your PC for optimum performance.
- Check if the product is connected to a high-power USB 2.0 port. Some low-power USB ports built into certain peripheral devices, such as keyboards and USB hubs without integrated power, may cause the connection with your PC to be unstable.

Disconnecting P7 from Your PC

1. Click the Safely Remove Hardware icon on the taskbar to disconnect the product using the Safely Remove Hardware menu.



2. Click the OK button to confirm the device to remove.



- The icon on the taskbar may be hidden in some operating systems such as Windows XP. Click the Show Hidden Icons to display the hidden icons.
- The Safely Remove Hardware function may not be available while using some applications such as Windows Explorer or Windows Media Player. Close all applications before performing the Safely Remove Hardware function.
- If the Safely Remove Hardware does not perform properly, try again after a few minutes. Removing the product without the process above, may cause data in the product memory to be damaged.

Connecting Your Device

Copying files/folders to P7

1. Select the files/folders to transfer in your PC and drag and drop to the drive that appears for the P7.



Deleting files/folders from P7

1. Select the files/folders to delete, and then, right-click your mouse and select Delete.
2. Click Yes in the Confirm File Delete/Confirm Folder Delete popup window to delete the files/folders.



- Always properly connect the product to the PC.
- While you transfer data, never disconnect it or turn off the power because it may cause serious damage to the internal memory of the product.
- Transfer speed may vary depending on your computer and/or OS environment.
- It is recommended to save media files using Iriver plus 3 or Windows Media Player 11.

MUSIC

Selecting Music

1. In the main menu, touch [Music] to display the music playlist.
2. Scroll through the music list and touch a music file to play.

- Touch the [←] icon to move to the upper folder in the playlist.
- The browsed result will change based on the setting in [⚙️ > Advanced > Music] Browse Type. (Refer to page 40.)
 - Database: Browse files by My Playlists, All Music, Albums, Artists, Genres and My Rating.
 - Folder: Browse music files by folder.
- If the [Music Browse Type] is set to [Database], touching [+] from the screen will add the music to your playlist and touching [-] will delete the selected music from your playlist.
- You can manage your playlist using Iriver Plus 3 or Windows Media Player 11.
- Supported file formats :
MP3 (8~320 Kbps), WMA (8~320 Kbps), OGG (Q1~Q10), FLAC, WAV

Playing Music

- While playing, touch the [+/−] icon to control the volume.
- While playing, touch the [|| / ▶] icon to pause or resume playback.
- While playing, touch the [◀ / ▶] icon to rewind or fast forward.
- While playing, touch the [◀ / ▶] icon to play the previous or next file.
- While playing, touch a specific position on the progress bar to play the music from that position.
- While playing, set the repeat loop by touching the [AB] icon to set point A and touch again to set Point B.
- The product will play the loop repeatedly. Touch the [AB] icon once again to deactivate the loop.
- While playing, touch the [▼] icon to save a bookmark.
Press [▼] to display the bookmark list.
 - Touch [◀ / ▶] in the bookmark list screen to play the previous or next bookmark.
 - Touch the [🗑️] icon in the bookmark list screen to delete the selected bookmark.
 - Touch the [🗑️] icon in the bookmark list screen to delete all bookmarks.

Music Play Screen



- 1 Additional Features: Displays additional features.
- 2 Title (filename): Displays the title (filename) of the music.
- 3 Album name: Displays the name of the album.

- 6 Equalizer Settings: Displays/sets EQ.
- 7 Elapsed Time: Displays the elapsed play time of the music.

- 8 Back to previous screen: Moves to the previous screen or upper folder.

- 10 Play previous track (brief press): Plays the previous track. Rewind (long press): Rewinds the track.

- 19 Rating: Display/set the rating of music.
- 20 Total length of the track: Displays total playback time of the music.

- SRS WOW HD: Adjusts the sound enhancement settings.
 - SRS (Sound Retrieval System): Adjusts virtual 3D audio effects.
 - TruBass: Adjusts deep bass enrichment effects.
 - FOCUS: Adjusts sound sharpness.
 - WOW: Adjusts the boost value according to the earphones you are using.
 - Definition: Restores sounds to its original state.
 - Custom EQ: Customizes the equalizer settings.
 - Fade-in: Activates and deactivates the audio fade-in features.

Selecting Video

1. In the main menu, touch Video to display the list of video files.
2. Scroll through the video list and touch a video file to play.

- Touch the [←] icon to move to the upper folder in the list.

Rewind (long press): Rewinds the video.

- Video Ratio: Selects the display aspect ratio of the video image.
 - Video Option: Sets the video option.
 - Navigation Speed: Sets the speed of fast forward and rewind.
 - Playback Mode: Sets the playback repeat mode.
 - Subtitle: Turns subtitle on and off, selects font color, font size, position and display language.

PICTURE

Selecting Pictures

1. In the main menu, touch Picture to display the list of picture files.
2. Scroll through the picture list and touch the picture to display and it will display in full screen.

- Touch the [↑] icon to move to the upper folder in the list.
- Supported file formats :
JPG, BMP, and GIF (some file formats might have compatibility problems)
- Always use Iriver plus 3 to transfer picture files to your product. Using other programs may cause unexpected errors during picture slideshow.

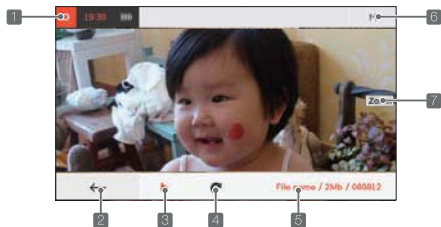
Viewing Pictures

- While playing, touch the [▶/||] icon to start or stop the slideshow.
- Touch and push a picture left or right while in picture view to display the next or previous picture.
- While viewing a picture, touch the [↻] icon to rotate the picture.
- While viewing a picture, touch the Zoom icon to start the zoom function. Select a zoom factor to zoom in or out.

- The Zoom function may not be supported with low resolution images.

RADIO

Using Radio

1. Touch the radio frequency from the main menu screen, then the previous broadcast will appear.
2. Touch the [</>] icon to select preset channels.

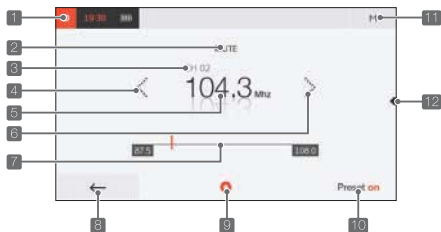
Listening to Radio

- While listening, touch the [+ / -] icon to control the volume.
- While listening, touch the Preset on/off icon to activate/deactivate the preset list.
- After deactivating the preset list, touch the [</>] icon to manually select the previous or next frequency.
- After deactivating the preset list, touch and hold the [</>] icon to select the previous frequency quickly.
- After setting Preset, touch the [</>] icon to move through stored channels.
- While listening, touch and push [◀] towards the left to display the CH List/REC List items.
- Touch the CH List to display the channel list.
 - Touch a channel to listen to.
 - Select a frequency to store and press the [+] icon on an empty channel to store the frequency to selected channel.
 - Touch [-] in the channel list to delete the selected channel.
- Touch the REC List to display the recorded list.
 - Touch a file to play.
 - Touch [-] in the file list to delete the selected file.
- While listening, touch the [●] icon to start recording. Touch [■] to stop recording.

- Do not remove the earphones while listening to the radio because the earphones function as an antenna during radio reception. (Use the earphones provided with your product. Using other earphones may cause bad reception.)
- If the remaining memory space or power is insufficient, recording will automatically stop.

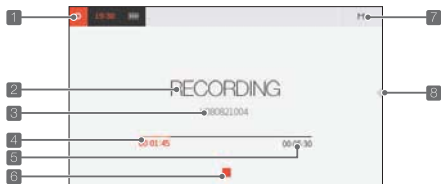

TEXT

Selecting Text

1. In the main menu, touch Text to display the text file list.
2. Scroll through the text list and touch the position to display.

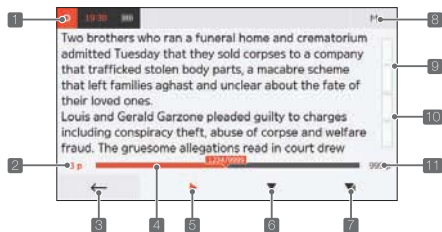
- Touch the [←] icon to move to the upper folder in the list.
- If texts are not displayed properly, check the language setting in additional features.

Viewing Text

- Touch [▶ /||] while viewing the text to start or stop auto scroll.
- Touch the screen while viewing the text and push up or down to display the next or previous pages.
- While viewing the text, touch the progress bar to view a desired page.
- While viewing the text, touch the [▼] icon to save a bookmark.
- Press [▼] on screen to display the bookmark list.
 - Touch a bookmark from the bookmark list to move to the selected bookmark.
 - Touch [–] in the bookmark list to delete the selected bookmark.
- If you are interrupted or choose to stop viewing the text, the latest displayed page will be saved.
 - * You can store the last positions from up to 10 text files.

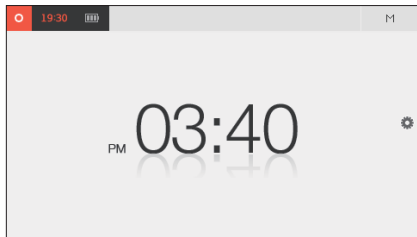

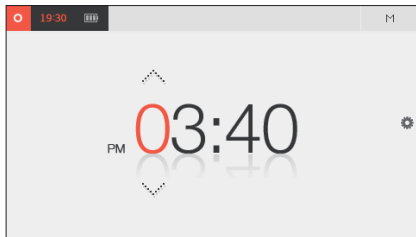

Setup

You can configure your own settings in P7. The menu configurations are subject to change depending on different firmware versions.

Setup

1. In the main menu, touch [⚙️] to display the setting list.
2. Touch the desired setup item from the setting list to display sub items.
3. Touch the sub item to run and make adjustments. Adjustments will automatically be saved and will apply to the next operation.

Date & Time

- Sets the current date and time.

Display

- Brightness
Adjusts the brightness of the screen.
- Touch Sound
Turns the touch sound on and off.
- Touch Calibration
Aligns the touch screen's coordinates for better display.

Setup

Timer

- **Auto Power Off**
Automatically turns off the power after the specified time without operation.
- **Backlight**
Sets a specified time for the backlight to turn off.

Advanced

- **Music Browser**
Select how to browse through music files.
 - Database: Browses through music files transferred by iriver plus 3 or databases created by Rebuild Library using ID3 TAG or Playlist.
 - Folder: Browses through music files transferred by Windows Explorer.

* Music Browser is set to Database by default.

Updates the data library of all files.
