



### Installing Applications

itiver plus 3 and Windows Media Player 11 are integrated software applications that efficiently manage various multimeda files. itiver plus 3 and Windows Media Player 11 give you freedom to transfer music, video and picture files from PC to the product.

### Installing iriver plus 3

- Insert the installation CD into your PC to display the installation process screen.
- 2. Click iriver plus 3 and complete the installation process by following the on-screen instructions.

### Installing Windows Media Player 11

- Insert the installation CD into your PC to display the installation process screen.
- Click Windows Media Player 11 and complete the installation process by following the on-screen instructions.

  - Microsoft Internet Explorer version 6.0 or later SVGA or high resolution monitor (1024x768 resolution or greater)

### Turning the Product on/off & Mode Selection

### Turning the Product on/off

- Slide the POWER / HOLD key to the arrow direction to turn on the product.
- 2. While the product is tuned on, slide the POWER / HOLD key to the arrow direction to turn it off.



This product has an automatic power saving function to save battery power. Based on the settings in power save mode, the product will be automatically turned off after a pre-determined period without operation. For more information on setting this mode, refer to Settings > Timer > Auto Power off. (Refer to page 26.)

### Mode Selection

- Turn on the power to display the main mode screen.
   While operating any mode, press and hold the [ < ] button to display the main mode screen.</li>
- Press the [ ▲ / ▼ ] button to select the mode and press the [ ▶ ] button to enter the mode.

### Using HOLD and RESET

### Using HOLD

 Slide the POWER / HOLD switch to the direction of arrow to lock the product.



2. Slide the POWER / HOLD switch to the opposite direction of arrow to unlock the product.

### Using RESET

 If the product stops and does not respond to any operation, press the RESET pinhole at the bottom of the product.



If you enable the reset function, the Date & Time setting will be deleted.

### Connecting Earphones

1. Connect earphones to the Earphone jack.



### Charging the Product

- Turn on your PC and connect the T6 to it using the USB cable provided.
- 2. The integrated battery will charge automatically.



- Do not use any USB cable other than the one included with the product.
   This may cause a malfunction.
- Check if the product is connected to a high-power USB 2.0 port. Some low-power
  USB ports built into certain peripheral devices, such as some types of keyboards
  and USB hubs without integrated power may not provide enough power to charge.
- While the PC is switched to standby mode, the product may not be charged.
- Charge the product only at room temperature.
   The product may not be charged in extremely hot or cold place.
- The battery will be fully charged within about 3 hours.
   (When completely uncharged in Power only Mode)
- The available usage time of charged battery becomes short over time.
- The charging time might be extended if you use the product while charging.

### Connecting Products

### Connecting the Product to Your PC

- 1. Turn on your PC.
- 2. Connect the product to your PC using the USB cable.



3. If properly connected, the LCD will display as below.

Power & Data: The product is currently being charged and data is being transferred.

Power & Play: The product is currently being charged and a file is being played.

Power Only: The product is currently being charged.

- It is recommended to stop all operations before connect the product to your PC for optimum performance.
- Check if the product is connected to a high-power USB 2.0 port. Some low-power USB ports built into certain peripheral devices, such as some types of keyboards and USB hubs without integrated power may not provide enough power to charge.

### Disconnecting the Product from Your PC

 Click the icon on the taskbar to disconnect the product using the Safely Remove Hardware menu.



2. Click the Stop button to confirm disconnection.



- The icon on the taskbar may be hidden in some operating systems.
   Click Show hidden icons to display the hidden icon.
- The Safety Remove Hardware function may not be available while using some applications such as Windows Explorer or Windows Media Player. Close all applications first before performing the Safety Remove Hardware.
- If the Safely Remove Hardware is not performed properly, try again after a few minutes. If the product is removed without observing the above process, data in the product might be damaged.

### Connecting Products

### Copying files / folders to the product

 Select the desired files / folders in your PC and drag & drop to the drive which appears as the product.



### Deleting files / folders from the product

- 1. After selecting the desired file / folder, right-click with your mouse and select Delete.
- Click Yes in the Confirm File Delete / Confirm Folder Delete popup window to delete the file / folder.



- Always properly connect the product and PC.
- When you transfer data, never disconnect it or turn off the power to protect your data from damage.
- When you transier data, never disconnect it or turn on the power to protect your data from darnage.
   Transfer speed may vary depending on your computer and/or OS environments.
- It is important to keep the available memory space based on the number of files as shown below. If the remaining memory space is insufficient, the product cannot be turned on, 100:5 MB / 500:7 MB / 1000:9 MB / 2000:14 MB / 3000:25 MB
- If you store too many files to the product, the operation to enter the Music > All Music menu can be delayed.
- It is recommended to save media files using iriver plus 3 or Windows Media Player 11.

### Music

1. In the main mode, select MUSIC to display the music list.

The list is displayed by Now Playing, All Music, Albums, Artists, Genres, My Playlists, Bookmark List or My Rating.

- 2. Press the [∧/∨/ < / > ] button to select the music and press the [ > ] button to play it.
  - : Moves to the upper list / folder
  - > : Moves to the sub list / Plays selected file.
  - ∧ /▼: Moves within the list.

- While playing, press the [+/-] button to control the volume.
- While playing, press the [ > ] button to pause / resume.
- While playing, press and hold the [∧/∨] button to fast reverse or fast forward.
- While playing, press the [∧/∨] button to play the previous / next music.

- In the Music mode, files only in the Music folder are displayed. To browse and play music files in other folders, use the File Browser mode. ■ Supported file formats: MP3 (8~320 Kbps), WMA (over 32 Kbps)
- You can manage your playlist using iriver plus 3 or Windows Media Player 11.

### Music

### Additional Features

- While playing file or in standby screen, press and hold the [ > ] button to display the additional features.
- Press the [ ▲/ ▼ ] button to select the additional feature and press the [ ▶ ] button to display the window for setting it up.
  - < : Moves to the upper list
- Press the [ ▲/▼] button to set the feature up and press the [ ➤ ] button to save / operate it.
- AB Repeat: Plays between point A and B repeatedly.
  - Select AB Repeat and press the [ > ] button to select the point A and display the playing screen. Press the [ > ] button again to select the point B. Now the player plays between point A and B repeatedly. Press the [ > ] button again to deactivate the repeat playback.
  - Select Repeat Times in additional features to set times to repeat A-B.

- Play Mode: Sets the play mode.
- Add Bookmark: Bookmarks a specific point of time.
- Select EQ: Sets the EQ.
- Setup Sound: Determines the sound setting.
  - Custom EQ: Changes levels of each frequency range to create your own equalization.
  - Fade-In: Volume increases gradually when playback starts.
- Rate: Classifies your favorite music by star ratings.
- · Scan Speed: Sets the speed of music scanning.
- Repeat Times: Set times to repeat A-B.
- Delete File: Deletes the selected file.
- Information: Displays information for the selected file.

### **Pictures**

### Selecting Picture

- In the main mode, select PICTURE to display the picture list.
- In the list, press the [ ^ / √ / ⟨ / ▶ ] button to select the picture and press the [ ▶ ] button to play it with full screen.
  - : Moves to upper folder.
  - > : Moves to the sub folder, Displays the picture in full screen.
  - ∧ / ∨ : Moves within the list.

- In the Pictures mode, only pictures in the pictures folder are displayed.
  To browse and play picture files in other folders, use the File Browser mode.
- Supported file formats:
  - JPG, BMP (Some file types may not be fully compatible.)
- While playing music, select the Pictures mode to stop music playback and display the picture list.

### Viewing Picture

- While viewing pictures, press the [>] button to start / stop slide show.
- While viewing pictures, press the [  $\land / \checkmark$  ] button to play the previous / next picture.

#### Additional Features

- While viewing pictures, press and hold the [>] button to display additional features.
- Press the [ ▲/ ▼ ] button to select the additional feature and press the [ ▶ ] button to display the window for setting it up.
  - < : Moves to the upper list
- Press the [ ▲/▼] button to set the feature up and press the [ ➤ ] button to save / operate it.

- Image Delay: Selects the amount of time each picture is displayed on the screen during a slide show.
- Zoom: Sets the ratio to enlarge picture.
- Delete File : Deletes the selected file.
- Information: Displays information for the selected file.

- Some picture files with low resolution might not support the Zoom function.
- The Additional Features screen is deactivated during a slide show.

### **FM** Radio

### Listening to FM RADIO

- 1. In the main mode, select FM Radio to display recently used Preset channels.
- 2. Press the [ $\wedge/\vee$ ] button to select the FM radio station.

### Listening to Recorded FM Radio

- While listening to FM radio, press the [+/-] button to control the volume.
- Press the [ > ] button to activate / deactivate Preset.
- After deactivating Preset, press the [ ^/ ▼] button to move to the previous / next frequency.
- While deactivating Preset, press and hold the [ ^ / ]
   button to move to the available previous / next frequency.
- After activating preset, press and hold the [ ▲ / ▼ ] to move to the saved previous / next preset.

### FM Radio

#### Additional Features

- While listening, press and hold the [ > ] button to display the additional features.
- Press the [ ∧ / ∨ ] button to select the additional feature and press the [ ⟩ ] button to display the window for setting it up.
  - : Moves to the upper list
- Press the [ ▲/▼] button to set the feature up and press the [ ▶] button to save / operate it.
- Record : Records the FM radio which you are listening to.
   Select Record to move to the recording standby screen. Press the [>] button to start recording. Press it again to stop recording and return to the recording standby mode. Press the [<] button to return to the radio reception mode.</li>
- Saved Recordings: Displays the list of recorded files.
  - Press the [ ∧ / ∨ ] button to select the file and press the [ > ] button to play it.
  - Press the [^/v] button to select the file and press and hold the
     button to display the confirmation message. Press the [^/v]
     to select Yes and press the [ > ] button to delete the selected file.

- Save Preset / Delete Preset: Stores the current frequency to the channel. If the frequency is already stored, the existing channel will be deleted.
- Auto Preset: Automatically scans and stores channel frequencies.
  - \* Up to 20 channels can be stored.
- Preset List: Displays saved channel list.
- Tuner Region: Sets the frequency range based on local standard.
  - Korea / US / Europe: 87.5 108.0 MHz
  - Japan: 76.0 108.0 MHz
  - The cord of earphones functions as an antenna during radio reception.
     (Use the supplied earphones. If you use other earphones, the reception rate might be deteriorated.)
  - If the remaining memory space or power is insufficient, recording will be automatically stopped.
  - The recorded file will be saved in the FM Recordings in the following format. TUNERXXX.WAV (XXXX: Sequential number)

### Recordings

### Recording Voice

- 1. In the main mode, select Recordings to display the recording standby screen.
- Press the [ > ] button to start recording. Press the [ > ] button again to complete recording and save the recorded file.

- In the main mode, press and hold the [ < ] button to start recording.
- If the remaining memory space or power is insufficient, recording will be automatically stopped.
- The recorded file will be saved in the Recordings in the following format. : VOICEXX.WAV (XXX: Sequential number)

- In the recording standby screen, press and hold the
   ) button to display additional features.
- Press the [ ▲/ ▼ ] button to select the additional feature and press the [ ▶ ] button to display the window for setting it up.
  - < : Moves to the upper list

- Recorded File List: Displays the Recorded File List.
  - Press the [∧/∨] button to select the file and press the

- Voice Recording Quality: Sets the quality of recorded voice.

File Browser You can manually check and play various file saved in the product.

### **Browsing Device**

- 1. In the main mode, select File Browser to display the file list.
- 2. In the list, press the [ \( \lambda / \lambda / \lambda \) button to select the file and press the [ > ] button to play it.
  - : Moves to upper folder.
  - > : Moves to the sub folder / Plays selected file.
  - ∧ / ∨ : Moves within the list.

### Deletina File

- 1. In the file list screen, select the file and press and hold the [ > ] button to display the confirmation message.
- 2. Press the [∧/∨] to select Yes and press the [ > ] button to delete the selected file.

- To browse and play music files in folders other than Music folder, use the File

You cannot delete the file which is currently being played.

   ∴ Moves to the upper list
- Press the [ ▲/▼] button to select the setting and press the [ ➤ ] button to display the window for setting it up.

#### Date & Time

- Sets the current time and date.

### Display

- Backlight
   Sets the amount of time to keep the backlight ON.
- Brightness
   Changes LCD display brightness.

#### Timer

#### Auto Power off

Automatically turns the power off after a predetermined period without operation.

#### Sleep

Automatically turns the power off after apredetermined time.

#### Connection Type

Selects the type for transferring file from / to PC.

- MSC (UMS): Using iriver plus 3, transfers file using the MSC connection type.
- MTP: Using Windows Media Player 11, transfers file with the MTP connection type.

### Reset All Settings

Resets the product to the factory setting.

- Be careful not to delete valuable data because changing Connection Type will delete all data in the product.
- Mass Storage Class (MSC) is a traditional UMS type.

#### Advanced

- Format Device
   Deletes all data saved in the product.
- System Information
   Displays system information of the product.

### Language

- Menu Language
   Selects language for menu.
- Countries
   elects language for tag and text.

### Adding Media to Library

- When you run iriver plus 3 for the first time, the Add Media Wizard will start.
- Follow the on-screen instructions on the PC to add media files such as music, picture, and video to the library.

### Ripping Songs from a CD

- Insert an audio CD into the CD drive and run iriver plus 3.
- In iriver plus 3, select the checkbox from Music > CD Drive and click CD Ripping in bottom left.
- 3. After ripping song, select the All Music to check whether the ripped song is added to the library.
