Installing Programs

iriver plus 4 is an integrated software designed for managing diverse multimedia files. Using iriver plus 4, you can copy files stored in a PC to the device.

Installing iriver plus 4

 If you download iplus4_installer.exe file from the player's [iriver plus 4] folder and execute it, the software installation guide screen appears. Click [iriver plus 4] and follow the instructions given by the installation program to complete the installation process.

Turning on/off the Product and Selecting Modes

Power on/off

- 2. When the product is on, press and hold the [and the power goes off.




This model supports an automatic power-saving feature to minimize battery consumption. Depending on the power-saving mode settings, the product will be automatically turned off if keys are not operated for a given time. For more information on the settings, refer to [SETTING-Timer Settings-Auto Power off] (Refer to page 24).

Selecting Modes

- Turn on the power to display the previously executed screen. Press and hold the [Left] to display the main mode screen.
- Press the [Up/Down] to select the mode you want and press [Right] to play the mode.





Charging the Battery

- 1. Turn on your PC.
- After removing the USB port cover, connect the device with the computer.
- 3. The internal battery will charge automatically.



- Check if the product is connected to a high-power USB 2.0 port. Some low-power USB ports bulk into certain peripheral devices, such as some types of Keyboards and USB hubs without internal power may not provide enough power to charge.
- While the PC is switched to standby mode, the product may not be charged.
- Charge the product only at room temperature.
- The product may not be charged in extremely hot or cold place.
- The battery will be fully charged within about 2.5 hours. (Based on fully discharged, power OFF)
- The available usage time of charged battery becomes short over time.
- The charging time might be extended if you use the product while charging.

Connecting the Product

Connecting with the Computer

- 1. Please turn on the power of the device and computer.
- 2. After removing the USB port cover, please connect the device with the computer.



- For troublefree connection with the computer, connect when all the functions are stopped.
- Connect to a high-power USB 2.0 port. If connected to a keyboard or a USB hub without a power supply of its own, connection with the computer may not be troublefree.

Disconnecting from the Computer

 Safely disconnect the device from the computer by clicking the icon on the taskbar of the computer screen.



2. Confirm the device disconnection by clicking [Confirm].



- Depending on the operating system for example Windows XP, the icon may be hidden from the taskbar. Hidden icons can be displayed by clicking indicator.
- Safe disconnection may not be performed if application programs such as Windows Explorer or Windows Media Player Windows are being used. Make sure that the device is safely disconnected after all the active application programs are closed.
- If safe disconnection fails, try again later. Failure to safely disconnect may cause data loss.

Connecting the Product

Copying Files (Folders) to the Product

 After selecting the file/folder to copy from the computer, the selected file/folder will be copied if you drag and drop it to the added drive.



Deleting Files (Folders)

- Select the files/folders to be deleted, right-click on them and select [Delete].
- Click [Yes] if the [Confirm File/Folder Deletion] window pops up, and the selected files/folders will be deleted.

Selecting Music

- If you select [MUSIC] in the main mode, the list about how to search will be displayed.
- Press the [Up/Down/Left/Right] button, select the music you want to listen to, press the [Right] button to play the selected music.

Left: Move to the upper menu/folder Right: Move to the sub menu/folder. Up/Down: Move within the list

- In [Directory List], music can be searched by folder.
- In the [MUSIC] mode, only music files located in the Music Folder will be displayed.
 To search and play music files in any other folders, use the [BROWSER] mode.
 File Format Supported:
- MP3(8~320Kbps), WMA(8~320Kbps or above), APE, FLAC, ASF, OGC
- EQ will not change when replaying APE and FLAC formats.
- Scan speed and Study mode will not work when replaying OGG and FLAC formats.
- Playlists can be managed using iriver plus 4.

Playing Music

- Volume Control: Control the volume by pressing
 [+/-] while music is being played.
- Pause/Restart: If you press [Right] while music is being played, the music will be paused/ restarted.
- Rewinding/ Fast Forwarding: If you press and hold [Up/Down] while music is being played, the file will start rewinding/ fast forwarding.

RECORDING

Recording Voice

- Select [RECORDING] from the menu and the recording standby window will appear.
- 2. You can start recording by pressing [Right] and end it by pressing again.
- If you press the [Left] button, the recording will be terminated and a window will pop up asking you whether you want to save the recorded file.

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Using iriver plus 4

- 1. When iriver plus 4 is first run, the Add Media Wizard will be executed.
- 2. According to the screen instructions, you can add to the library media files such as music, photos and video stored in the computer.

- 1. Insert a music CD into the CD drive and execute iriver plus 4.
- 2. Select the music checkboxes you want to extract from [CD] tab in iriver plus 4 and click [CD Ripping] at the bottom left.
- 3. When the music extraction is complete and [All Music] is selected, you will see the extracted music files added to the library.

Transferring Media to the Device

- Using iriver plus 4
 - 1. Connect the device to the computer's USB port and then execute iriver plus 4.
